## **FOREWORD**

This volume contains the Special Acts of the West Virginia Legislature for the years 1863-1998, inclusive. The Index is alphabetically arranged by topic, the year of enactment, the chapter number from the year of enactment, the code sections affected, and the page number of the volume of the Acts of the year of enactment. Special Acts are those which do not relate to general law and, therefore, are not included in the West Virginia Code.

The index was first published in 1949 and was updated by supplement, covering the years 1951 through 1971. This volume represents a complete revision, recodification and editorial enhancement of the first edition. In compiling this edition, considerable time and effort was expended by the editorial staff of the Office of the Clerk of the House, particularly in reading the proofs of the first manuscript and verification of the original. Special appreciation is extended to Bo Hoover, Andrew Priest and Ed Hambrick for their invaluable assistance in this work.

As this edition goes to press, work on the next will soon be underway. The objective is to produce a volume which will be yearly updated by supplement, until such time as the entire work merits reprinting to incorporate the supplement text with the volume text. Therefore, beginning in 1999, the supplement pocket should also be consulted when using this Index.
