West Virginia Board of Funeral Service Examiners
February 10, 2015

The meeting was called to order at 1:15 p.m. by Chad Hutson, as the President was unable to attend. Members present: Chad Hutson, Keith Kimble, and Ira Handley. John Fahey and Sarah Lobban attended via telephone conference call. John Stump and Chad Harding were absent due to injury and illness. Non members present, Mark Weiler, Assistant Attorney General, Regina Foster, Executive Director, Amanda Legg, Administrative Assistant and Constance Sloan, Office Manager.

The Board then took up the matter of a letter from StoneMor, addressed to Chad Harding, relating to emails between them concerning a lease for property. In one of the emails Mr. Harding referenced having the Board find out why the property could not be leased by him. Mr. Harding advised the Board office that he made the remark out of frustration as he had been negotiating with the company for several months and was angry when, without explanation, he was told they would not lease to him and that he sincerely regrets his remark and will give StoneMor a written apology.

Board staff stated they had researched their files and have no licensees which are owned by StoneMor and that as long as the property in question meets the requirements of the City and has the necessary licenses and permits, there is no reason to believe that whoever leases the building would not be able to be licensed by the Board. A further review of the Secretary of State's web site does not reveal any StoneMor facilities licensed in West Virginia.

Mr. Weiler noted that in a communication from StoneMor, the lease was a private business matter and as such is not regulated by the Board and that his review of the applicable laws, rules and regulations does not indicate a violation of the Board's laws and regulations and therefore is not an appropriate matter for a complaint process.

Mr. Weiler then left the meeting.

On motion of Keith Kimble to go into Executive Session, pursuant to WV Code §6-9A-4(b)(A), seconded by Ira Handley, by unanimous vote the Board went into Executive Session. The Board then returned to Public Session and took up the following matters:

COMPLAINT 2014-03

James E. Patton, the respondent, was charged and indicted by the Raleigh County Grand Jury in July, 2014, on 45 separate counts of sexual assault, use of minors in the filming of sexually explicit conduct, sexual abuse by a person in a position of trust and other related charges. The Board notify Mr. Patton that it would commence proceedings to revoke his license but offered him the option of voluntarily surrendering permanent his license by means of a

Consent Decree and Order. Mr. Patton agreed and on February 2, 2015 submitted to the Board his signed Consent Decree and Order in which he agrees to the permanent revocation of his license. The Complaint Committee recommended that the Board accept the same.

COMPLAINT NO. 2014-04

The complainant, Kathy Jean Achtziger, and her family were estranged. The deceased (her mother), had prearranged her funeral with Waybright Funeral Home. At the time of her mother's death, the other sister and brother went to the funeral home to finalize the funeral arrangements and told the funeral director that they had no problem with the complainant attending visitation or the funeral but they did not want her companion to attend. The funeral director told them he could not tell the man he could not attend, if they did not want him in the funeral home it would be up to them to tell him. The funeral home was willing to give Kathy a private viewing but she did not attend the private viewing.

At the visitation the complainant, who had already been told by her family not to bring her companion, showed up with him and was told by members of the family that they were not welcome.

The Committee recommend the complaint be dismissed as there is no violation of the Funeral Service Examiners Act.

COMPLAINT 2014-05

The complaint in this complaint is also Kathy Jean Achtziger who complains that Waybright Funeral Home failed to obtain a Veteran's marker for her husband. Waybright Funeral Home did attempt to get the marker, and filed the necessary papers, however Mr. Achtziger did not serve enough time to qualify for the marker according to the records from the Army. There is nothing that the Funeral Home can do in this matter.

The Committee recommended the complaint be dismissed as there is no violation of the Funeral Service Examiners Act.

COMPLAINT 2014-06

This complaint is by the Board Office against a funeral director who has been accused by the Attorney General's Office of embezzlement of preneed funeral funds. The funeral director has left the state and at this time we have no address for him although it is alleged he is in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina.

The funeral home has been sold and the Attorney General has filed suit against the funeral director. According to the AG's office, the persons whose funds were embezzled have not been paid out of the guarantee fund but if there is a death the fund will then pay.

Recommend that we hold this until we find some address for the funeral director and attempt to get a voluntary consent to surrender his license or, in the alternative, hold a hearing

for revocation of his license.

COMPLAINT 2014-07

The complainant, Sharon Darby, alleges George Lewis, a funeral director who is not affiliated with any funeral home but who operates a transport service, picked up a body from a nursing home and transported it to a funeral home with her two small children in the back of the van with the body. The children were unable to say which funeral home they went to and the Board staff contacted every funeral home in the northern panhandle and no one has any knowledge of him doing a removal for them at that time.

Mr. Lewis states that at the time of the alleged incident he was incapacitated with a broken right leg and unable to drive. Ms. Darby is Mr. Lewis's wife's sister and there is evidently some problems between the two. There is nothing to corroborate the complaint and the Committee recommends the complaint be dismissed as there is no violation of the Funeral Service Examiners Act.

COMPLAINT 2014-08

The complainant, John C. Brown, II, alleges violations of the preneed act and the Funeral Service Examiners Act by Anthony Paletti of Stockert-Paletti Funeral Home. The complaint was forwarded to the Attorney General's Office for resolution of the pertinent parts of the complaint relating to preneed.

Mr. Paletti was asked to respond to the Board regarding his failure to provide a GPL, Casket or Vault price list or to give to Mr. Brown a Statement of Goods and Services at the time the arrangements were made or by the date of the funeral.

Mr. Paletti was notified of the Complaint on September 8, 2014 and shortly thereafter called the Board and stated that the complaint was going to be withdrawn. He called a couple more times asking if the complaint was withdrawn and was told no and that he needed to file a response. On October 27, 2014 we received a letter from his attorney stating that it was his client's understanding that all matters had been resolved and that the complaint was to be withdrawn. A copy of that letter was sent to the complainant who responded that he had no intention of dropping the complaint and stated that Mr. Paletti had called him 5 times requesting the complaint be dropped and that he still had not received an itemized statement for the funeral charges.

Mr. Paletti and his attorney appeared before the Committee and Mr. Paletti states that he did give Mr. Brown a GPL and a Statement of Goods and Services on the very first time he met with him. However, when asked by Mr. Kimble as to whether he had a signed copy of the Statement, Mr. Paletti admitted that he did not. There is also an email from Mr. Brown dated August 20, 2014 in which he states that he made a verbal request on August 15, 2014 (the date the arrangements were made) for an itemized statement; made a second request for the statement on August 17, 2014, and was at that time making the third request for an itemized statement.

On the matter of the GPL, there is no evidence that Mr. Paletti did or did not give the GPL to Mr. Brown. On the matter of the Statement of Goods and Services, Mr. Paletti does not have a signed copy and the August 17, 2014 email from Mr. Brown does indicate that he has not received an itemized statement.

The Committee recommends that the complaint be dismissed but that Mr. Paletti be sent a letter from the Executive Director which instructs him that every person must receive a General Price List at the time they inquire about funeral services and a Statement of Goods and Services at the time of the arrangements conference, pursuant to the Federal Trade Commission Funeral Rule and that if cash advance items are not known at that time, to enter a good faith estimate. A copy of the pertinent portions of the FTC Rule should also be sent to him.

COMPLAINT 2014-09

The complainant, Shirley Phares, is the mother of the daughter of the deceased as well as the ex-wife of the deceased. She basically complains that the cremation cost charged by Eackles-Spencer & Norton Funeral Home is twice that charged by other funeral homes.

At the time of the death of Mr. Phares there were no funds available from the Indigent Burial Fund and the funeral director advised the daughter, Lori Pauley, who was making the arrangements, that the cremation costs had to be paid in advance. Mrs. Phares paid the charges using her credit card. When they returned home, Mrs. Phares found out that another family member had used a different funeral home and that the cost was purportedly half that charged by ES&N. The price list submitted with the response from the funeral home indicates that the charges are in line with the prices on their GPL.

The Board has no authority to set prices or control prices charged by funeral homes. The Committee therefore recommends that the complaint be dismissed as there is no violation of the Funeral Service Act and that the complainant be advised that we do not regulate what funeral homes may charge.

COMPLAINT 2014-11

The complainant, Elizabeth James, alleges, that she should have received the excess funds from a preneed funeral account and that there are discrepancies in the signatures of the Will and a Power of Attorney made by her grandmother, now deceased, appointing her mother with certain rights under those documents. She feels that she, being the eldest of the surviving grandchildren should have had the right of final disposition.

First, the proceeds of the preneed funds are not within the jurisdiction of this office. The amount in dispute is \$315.72. The person designated to receive those funds was the son of Ms. James and he was deceased at the time the preneed became at-need. Normally, the funds would have been paid to his estate ,however, the funds were given to the person who handled the funeral arrangements to offset other expenses. This was approved by the Attorney General's office and, therefore, not within our jurisdiction to act on.

The questions relating to the signature on a Power of Attorney are also not within our jurisdiction to decide and should be directed to the County Commission or taken to Circuit Court.

There are no matters which this Board can address and the Committee recommends that the complaint be dismissed as there are no violations of the Funeral Service Examiners Act.

COMPLAINT 2014-12A

This complaint is made by Terry Warne, the husband of a deceased and alleges that shortly after his wife's demise Jason Cook, an employee of Davis Funeral Home, began corresponding with his daughter on FaceBook and in the process of numerous communications told her that a family had offered to pay for the funeral (if it was held at his funeral home) and then touts the fact that he has the largest building in the area and can offer personalization to caskets, etc., which is one of the main reasons the family wanted to donate the service. The family decided to use a competitor funeral home. Although he does not know this girl, he states that he will be at the viewing and is having a blanket made in memory of her mom. The responses from the girl are short and respectful.

The blanket was delivered to the funeral home and upset the family members who asked that it be removed. In a post on FaceBook, Jason Cook actually states that he hates it that the other funeral director, Randy Amos, dislikes him so bad personally that he makes a scene out of a nice gesture. Mr. Warne's daughter replied "it wasn't Randy or Paul...we appreciate the thought and gesture."

When the letter and complaint were forwarded to the funeral home's LIC for response, he did not respond, rather the response came from Jason Cook, Operations Manager, the person who made the FB posts. We contacted the LIC and asked him to respond and received an irate phone call from Jason Cook who stated that he was an owner of the funeral home and the boss of the LIC and that the LIC had no knowledge of the facts. We advised him that the LIC was, by statute, the person in charge of the day to day operations of the funeral home and that he was the only person who could respond. We did receive a response from the LIC which is basically the same as filed by Mr. Cook.

Between that time and now (February 10, 2015), the Board office received copies of an incident wherein Jason Cook was arrested on assault charges and copies of internet criminal background checks of Jason Cook which revealed he has a history of criminal activity in Georgia

consisting of embezzlement charges for which he had served time as well as other charges. Ms. Sloan then talked with David Bolyard who advised her that Jason Cook had been fired, which precipitated the melee at the funeral home.

Mr. Bolyard also advised that he knew nothing of Jason Cook's criminal past and that when he made him Operations Manager that title was supposed to mean that he would coordinate funerals between the funeral homes but that Jason took it to a whole new level. He states he was unaware that Jason had attempted to answer the complaint with the Board rather than giving it to the LIC to whom it was addressed. Mr. Bolyard was told that the LIC, according to statute, is the person in charge of the day to day operations of the funeral home and that they should be instructed that their duties cannot be relegated and absolve them of responsibility.

The Complaint Committee recommend that the Funeral Home and Mr. Bolyard be offered a consent agreement with reprimand and that the LIC be advised that he is in charge of the day to day operations of the funeral home and that it is his license which is in jeopardy.

COMPLAINT 2014-12B

Donetta Clutter is complaint against the same funeral home as in 2014-12A (Davis Funeral Home) where Jason Cook, Operations Manager, advised the wife of the deceased that he and his partner (David Bolyard) would like to offer her a funeral at no charge. The complainant further states that while her husband was in the hospital in Pittsburgh that she started getting messages from Jason and that neither she nor her husband knew him personally and finally asked a friend to contact him and ask him to stop sending messages. The messages regarding the free funeral were posted to Facebook. Jason Cook also sent flowers to the funeral home which were removed at the request of Mrs. Clutter.

Again, Jason Cook responded to the complaint rather than the LIC. He stated that they offer free funerals to In-Line of Duty deaths and children under the age of 12. He also attached a letter from the mother of the deceased who is the Administratrix of the deceased's estate and is an employee of his funeral home who states that her family did not learn until after the death and burial of any offer to pay for his funeral and that the only reason this complaint was filed was because of a disagreement over the disbursement of insurance and other moneys and that she was only married to the deceased for 9 months before his death. The Administratrix of the Estate has no standing as the wife was the legally authorized representative to make final disposition and if she didn't want flowers from Jason Cook or Davis Funeral Home that was her decision to make.

Recommend that this complaint be consolidated for disposition as set out in 2014-12A.

Chad Hutson stepped down as the Chairperson and Keith Kimble assumed that position.

Ira Handley moved, seconded by Chad Hutson, that the Board accept the recommendation of the Complaint Committee to accept the Consent Decree and Order in Complaint 2014-03, signed by James E. Patton, wherein his license is permanently revoked. The

motion carried unanimously.

Ira Handley then moved that the Board accept the remainder of the recommendations of the Complaint Committee and that the Committee be authorized to enter into a Consent Agreement on Complaints 2014-12A and 12B. The motion was seconded by Chad Hutson and carried unanimously.

Chad Hutson then resumed the position of Chairperson and asked if the Minutes of the Meeting of October 7, 2014 had been read and if there were any amendments. There being no amendments to be made, Keith Kimble moved that the Minutes be accepted. The motion was seconded by Sarah Lobban and carried unanimously.

Ira Handley moved that the P-Card invoices be approved, seconded by Keith Kimble. The motion carried unanimously.

Keith Kimble moved that the Financial Report be approved, seconded by Sarah Lobban. The motion carried unanimously. Ms. Sloan advised the Board that they were slowly getting reports from the OASIS system but that it is still not to the point where she can get reports that indicate to her the actual amount budgeted and what is spend from each category. She stated that she had received an email that there was a new report which may give that information. She also advised the Board that it now takes twice as long to pay bills under the OASIS system.

The Board then took up the matter of reimbursement of meal and other expenses of the inspectors. Ira Handley recused himself from the discussion and vote. On motion of Keith Kimble, seconded by Sarah Lobban, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the meal and mileage allowances for state employees and to retain the \$15 meal allowance for Kanawha County as the inspector does not get a mileage allowance for Kanawha County and that \$15 is a reasonable amount to reimburse the inspector for meals while making those inspections. Meal allowances will be paid for one-day trips when the inspectors are using rental cars as they will receive no mileage allowance.

The Board reviewed and approved the expenditure for membership dues in the West Virginia Association of Licensing Boards in the amount of \$245.

The Board then discussed the location of the June meeting and it was decided to meet in Charleston on June 8, 2015 at 1:00 pm. The Complaint Committee will meet the same day at 10:00 am.

West Virginia Board of Funeral Service Examiners
June 8, 2015
AMENDED February 9, 2016

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m. by Chad Harding, President. Members present: Chad Harding, Keith Kimble, Chad Hutson and Sarah Lobban. (Chad Hutson and Sarah Lobban were present by conference call.) John Fahey had to leave because of a family emergency; Ira Handley was absent due to an excessive number of funerals and John Stump was absent due to his injury; however, he asked that the Board be advised that he believes this is his last doctor's appointment and hopes to be here for the next meeting. Non members present, Regina Foster, Executive Director, Amanda Legg, Administrative Assistant and Constance Sloan, Office Manager.

On motion of Keith Kimble to go into Executive Session, pursuant to WV Code §6-9A-4(b)(A), seconded by Sarah Lobban, by unanimous vote the Board went into Executive Session. The Board then returned to Public Session and took up the following matters:

COMPLAINTS 2012-12A and 2014 12-B

The Respondents, David Bolyard, owner of Davis Funeral Home, and Jeffrey W. Heitger, Jr., Licensee in Charge, have agreed to enter into a Consent Decree and Order in order to resolve the issues in these two complaints.

The Respondents agree to be Reprimanded for their actions in these two complaints and Respondent, David Bolyard, shall instruct the employees of Davis Funeral Home that the Licensee in Charge is the person designated by statute to be in charge of the day to day operations of the funeral home. Further, Respondent, Jeffrey W. Heitger, Jr., is reminded that as Licensee in Charge, any violations of the Funeral Service Examiners Act by any of his employees under his supervision will result in disciplinary action against his license.

Should the Respondents fail to comply with the Consent Decree and Order the Board may take other disciplinary action as deemed necessary.

The effective date of the Consent Decree and Order shall be June 8, 2015.

COMPLAINT 2015-01

This complaint deals mainly with the grave marker purchased from Preston Funeral Enterprises. The funeral home provided a time line of the events relating to this complaint.

The complainant's husband died in January 2014. Complainant ordered a VA marker in August 2014. Complainant states she should have been allowed to order the marker from another company, however, this is a VA marker and those are provided by the VA.

The marker was received in October 2014. The marker was to be set in November, however, the vase assembly kit was not included and the cemetery had none on hand. Those kits had to be special ordered before the marker could be assembled and set.

On December 4, 2014, complainant went to the funeral home to inquire about the marker but the funeral director she spoke to was unaware that the marker had been received and that they were waiting on the vase assembly kit. On December 10, the complainant went to the funeral home and this time spoke to the funeral director who knew about the situation and offered take her to the cemetery to show her that the marker was partially assembled and could not be set without the assembly kit.

The assembly kit arrived December 16, 2014 but the setting ring was not included. The vase ring arrived December 19, 2014 and the marker was set that date.

On December 15, 2014 a refund check was issued to the complainant in the amount of \$501.58. The check was cashed and cleared the bank of December 29, 2014.

The Complaint Committee recommend that the complaint be dismissed as there is no violation of the Funeral Service Examiners Act.

COMPLAINT 2015-02

The complaint alleges that they purchased a cremation for their son from Lohr Barb Funeral Home and were charged for an 18 gauge casket and that they did not pick out the casket, the funeral home did. According to complainant, he contacted Pat Boyle at the crematory where the cremation was performed to see if he had been cremated in the metal casket and was advised that his son was not cremated in the casket. Complainant believes that the casket was then reused by others. Complainant also contacted other funeral homes in the area comparing prices and getting advice on what should have occurred with his son's funeral. This complaint is another example of what happens when competitor funeral homes give advice when they have no idea of the actual situation.

The complainant did purchase a cremation, but with viewing. However, because of their son's size an oversized casket was required. The funeral director states that he explained this to the family and showed them a picture of a casket which could be used and that they agreed to use that casket.

The situation is further complicated by the fact that the mausoleum where the deceased was to be buried could not accommodate the oversized casket and the family decided to have him cremated and hold a memorial service at a later date at another cemetery.

The funeral director states that the deceased, with the knowledge of the crematory, was placed in an airline tray and that the pillow, blanket, etc. from the casket were also placed in the shipping tray.

The Complaint Committee recommend that the complaint be dismissed as there is no violation of the Funeral Service Act.

COMPLAINT 2014-14

The complainants are filing this complaint over 5 years after the date of service. They have several complaints, i.e., that embalming was not authorized; that the funeral director didn't contact the medical examiner and report a death involving fractures; that the funeral director destroyed evidence for an autopsy; that the funeral director buried the deceased when the death certificate was incorrect, and possibly other such acts.

The funeral director states that embalming was done because of the condition of the body when it was received. Further, a viewing was planned and would have required embalming. The wife of the deceased signed the Statement of Goods and Services acknowledging that embalming had been authorized.

As to the death certificate, it is not the funeral director's responsibility to question the cause of death on the death certificate unless the same is incomplete. The complainants contacted the doctor, the police department, and the medical examiners office and an amended death certificate was filed in July, three months after the original death certificate, indicating that a fall at the hospital had occurred. The medical examiner found no reason to proceed past the amended death certificate.

It is not the funeral director's responsibility to ask for an autopsy. That should have been done by the family prior to the body being removed from the hospital and, in fact, the complainant refused an autopsy at the hospital.

By virtue of WV Code 61-12-8, the medical examiner is to be notified when any person dies from violence, or by apparent suicide, or suddenly when in apparent good health, or when unattended by a physician, or when an inmate of a public institution, or from some disease which might constitute a threat to public health, or ion any suspicious, unusual or unnatural manner. None of these reasons are applicable in this case and even if the funeral director had been told that the person had suffered broken bones at the hospital, that fact alone would not warrant a call to the medical examiner.

This complaint was originally scheduled for February, however, after the complainants received a copy of the response from the funeral home they wanted to submit rebuttal. Those documents are marked Jan 22, 2015.

The wife of the deceased advised Board staff that she had given verbal approval to the funeral home to embalm at the time of death, however she states she was so distraught she didn't know what she was doing. She also signed the Statement of Goods and Services at the time of the arrangements conference acknowledging that she authorized embalming.

The embalming report is not very well done as there were recent surgeries which should have been apparent but are not marked. The time the body was received and when the

embalming took place are also not noted. That being said, the family did refuse autopsy at the time of death and in one document they stated that they waited until the next morning to tell the funeral home they wanted an autopsy.

Whether this should have been an ME case is debatable. Should the funeral director have called the ME about surgical scars, would that have been enough to trigger an investigation? The Committee thinks not.

The complainants have conspiracy theories involving the doctor and the funeral home, and possibly others. They believe that the deceased was poisoned at the hospital and that when he died there was a rush to get him embalmed so that no one would know what happened. They also question a picture that appeared in a newspaper where the treating physician and the funeral director were at a social function at the same time. It is inconceivable that funeral directors and doctors would not know each other, and perhaps would belong to the same social organizations, however, there is simply nothing to suggest that any criminal wrong doing took place here.

The Complaint Committee recommends that the Complaint be dismissed as there is no violation of the Funeral Service Act. However, the Committee does recommend that the Board direct a letter to the funeral home advising them that embalming room reports are vital and must be complete records of the deceased at the time the body is received at the funeral home. Any and all bruising, surgical scars or wounds must be noted. These reports are important in the event that any legal proceedings are instituted against the funeral home or others as they become subject to subpoena.

At this time, Mr. Harding turned the Chair over to Mr. Kimble, who is unable to vote on these matters.

On Motion of Chad Harding, seconded by Chad Hutson, the Board voted unanimously to accept the Committee's recommendation in Complaints 2014-01 and 2014-02 and Complaint 2014-14 and to accept the Consent Decree and Order entered in Complaint 2012-A and 2012-B.

At this time the Chair was returned to Mr. Harding.

The Board then moved to the issue of pay raises of office staff and inspectors. On motion of Chad Hutson, seconded by Sarah Lobban, the Board voted unanimously to increase the salaries of Regina Foster, Amanda Legg, Michael Howard and Ira Handley by five percent (5%) and Constance Sloan is increased to \$20,000 per year pursuant to the Legislative increase allowed retired employees working part time. Raises are effective July 1, 2015.

The Board considered the Minutes of February 10, 2015, and on motion of Chad Hutson, seconded by Keith Kimble, voted unanimously to accept the same.

The P-Card invoices were reviewed and on motion of Chad Hutson, seconded by Sarah Lobban, the Board voted unanimously to accept and approve the same.

Financial reports from January through May 19, 2015 were reviewed and on motion of Chad Hutson, seconded by Keith Kimble, were accepted and approved unanimously.

The application of Yuganda Rash for a reciprocal license was discussed. On motion of Keith Kimble, seconded by Chad Hutson, the Board approved her application subject to Ms. Rash working under the supervision of a licensed funeral director and submitting monthly reports of her funeral directing/embalming activities for a period of one year. The Board makes this stipulation inasmuch as Ms. Rash has not practiced in over ten years.

The Board was appraised of the change in legal fees to be charged by the Attorney General effective July 1, 2015. For a number of years the Board has paid \$50 per hour for legal services, pursuant to an agreement with the former Attorney General. The current Attorney General will no longer honor that agreement. Instead, legal fees will range from \$120 to \$140 per hour depending on each attorney's rate. It was understood at a meeting between Board staff and Mr. Leslie that the Attorney General's Office would not bill our office for activities not requested by the Board and that any inquiries as to funeral services, complaints, etc. would be forwarded to this office to handle in the normal, routine manner.

On motion of Keith Kimble, seconded by Chad Hutson, the Board voted unanimously to continue Chad Harding as President.

On motion of Chad Hutson, seconded by Keith Kimble, the Board voted unanimously to continue John Stump as Chairman.

The President then appointed Chad Hutson and John Stump to the Complaint Committee for a 2-year term, effective July 1, 2015.

The next meeting date will be Tuesday, October 6, 2015 at 1:00 pm.

EMERGENCY MEETING
AUGUST 31, 2015

An Emergency Meeting was held on August 31, 2015, by teleconference, for the sole purpose of electing a President and Secretary of the Board. This action was necessary due to four members being replaced by new appointments by the Governor. The meeting was called to order at 9 am by Regina Foster, Executive Director. Members present: Keith Kimble, Ira Handley, Sarah Lobban, John Taylor, Connie Grisell, Robert Fields and Bill Davis. Non members present, Regina Foster, Executive Director, Amanda Legg, Administrative Assistant and Constance Sloan, Office Manager.

Constance Sloan explained to the new members the necessity for the election of new officers and the floor was opened for nominations. Keith Kimble nominated Ira Handley for the position of President. There were no other nominations. John Taylor seconded the motion and by unanimous vote, Ira Handley was elected President.

For the position of Secretary, Ira Handley nominated Keith Kimble. The motion was seconded by Robert Fields and by unanimous vote Keith Kimble was elected Secretary.

Ira Handley then appointed Connie Grisell and John Taylor to the Complaint Committee to serve the unexpired terms of Chad Hutson and John Stump. These appointments will run through June 30, 2017.

The next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board will be held October 6, 2015 with the Complaint Committee meeting earlier that day.

West Virginia Board of Funeral Service Examiners
October 6, 2015

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m. by Ira Handley, President. Members in attendance were Bill Davis, Robert Fields, Connie Grisell, Keith Kimble, Sarah Lobban and John Taylor. Non members present were Regina Foster, Executive Director, Amanda Legg, Administrative Assistant and Constance Sloan. Rob Kimes was present for the open meeting only.

On motion of Keith Kimble, seconded by Bill Davis, the Board went into Executive Session pursuant to WV Code §6-9A-4(b)(A). Robert Fields and Amanda Legg were excused from the room for the latter part of Executive Session. The Board then returned to public session.

The Board then took up **Complaint 2015-03**. It is Noted that Mr. Fields was not present for discussion in Executive Session or for the vote in public session on this complaint.

The complainant, Cherea Moore, alleges that she arranged with Brown Funeral Home for a direct cremation for her deceased mother and that the price for the same was to include transportation to the cemetery. A review of the GPL does not state that such a service is included, and, in fact is not customarily included unless the funeral home is performing a memorial service at the cemetery, which is another separate charge in most instances.

The problem that arose in this case was the selection of the cemetery to be used. The deceased was eligible for burial in a National Cemetery, however, one cemetery was full, the other required residency in Maryland which finally was established but then required proof that her name had been changed by marriage. It appears that the complainant and her mother were not close as she could provide no information on her mother's marriage or her places of residency. The funeral director made attempts by searching adjoining states for a marriage license, as well as this state, and none could be found.

Ms. Moore called Garrison Forest Cemetery to see if there were any alternatives for burial of her mother's ashes. The cemetery told her the funeral director could get marriage information from Social Security, however, only a relative can obtain that information. The cemetery advised her that her mother could be buried at a national cemetery in Catonsville, MD without proof of address.

The funeral director called the cemetery and arranged for the burial and military honors. The complainant was to pick up the ashes and the flag and take them to the cemetery for the ceremony which was scheduled for June 11, 2015 at 11 am in Baltimore National Cemetery; however, she never picked up the ashes and canceled the ceremony and on June 2, 2015 filed her complaint with this office.

Since that date, she has contacted the funeral home and demanded that they transport, in person, the ashes to her home in Baltimore, a 3-hour round trip for the funeral home. She also

refuses to pay the fee to have the ashes mailed to her.

The Complaint Committee found that the funeral director made concerted efforts to identify the residency of the deceased and to find a marriage license. In fact, it appears he went above and beyond what would normally be required of him. Customarily, transportation of the remains to a cemetery is not included in a direct cremation.

The Complaint Committee recommends that the complaint be dismissed as there is no violation of the Funeral Service Examiners Act.

On motion of Bill Davis, seconded by Sarah Lobban, the Board voted unanimously to accept the recommendation of the Complaint Committee and dismissed the Complaint.

PERSONNEL:

On Motion of Keith Kimble, seconded by Bill Davis, the Board voted unanimously to reaffirm that the duties of staff as designated at the October 7, 2014 meeting.

Regina Foster is primarily to work on the OASIS program in order to be able to pay bills, make deposits, process travel and any other functions which are integral to the operation of the office. She is to gradually phase in Amanda to this system so that eventually the office will have two persons who can conduct the finances of the office.

Amanda Legg will do data entry of all continuing education hours, apprentice reports and inspection reports. She will process new applications for establishments or individual licenses. She will help with filing and eventually the reorganization of the files with Connie.

Connie Sloan is to be the Office Manager and will oversee the workflow of the office, which means designation of tasks, she will coordinate vacation schedules and will keep time records, handle complaints, and assist with Budget preparation.

At this time, Mr. Fields, Rob Kimes and Ms. Legg returned to the meeting.

COMPLAINT 2014-02:

Complainant, Nikki Elswick, alleged she could not get itemized statement or accounting for monies received on her mother's funeral from Elk Funeral Home. This funeral home has had problems in the past with preneed funds and has lost its ability to sell preneed. The records at the funeral home are a mess, to be blunt, and it has taken quite some time to reconstruct the records.

Elk Funeral Home was finally able to reconstruct their records and provide a Statement of Goods and Services and copies of deposit slips which indicated the amounts paid on the funeral bill. There is an insurance policy, however, several signatures are needed from children of the beneficiary in order that it can be assigned to the funeral home and we have advised the complainant that she must get those signatures and take them to the funeral home so that they

can process the payment from the insurance company.

The Complaint Committee finds there is nothing that remains to be done in this matter and recommends that the complaint be dismissed as having been resolved.

COMPLAINT 2014-06

The Complaint Committee recommends that this complaint should be removed from the Complaint List in order that we can be compliant with the Legislative Auditor's instructions. It was initially placed there as we thought the matter would be resolved by a Consent Agreement, however, the funeral director, Joel McGuire, fled the state after embezzling preneed monies and his whereabouts were only recently discovered.

There is a criminal investigation taking place through the State Insurance Commission and an indictment is expected in Monroe County, West Virginia. We will follow up with the Monroe County Prosecuting Attorney and act accordingly.

COMPLAINT 2014-10

This complaint involves the purchase of a cemetery marker from the apprentice at Shanklin Funeral Home, who thinks he is a funeral director especially since he was grandfathered in under the old law. The funeral home, its licensee in charge, nor the owner ever responded. However, the complainant has notified this office that the marker was installed.

As a side note the Attorney General did file suit against the funeral home and the apprentice relating to various cemetery items sold. We have been advised that matter is now being resolved and as soon as the final order and agreement are entered we will see if there are other matters to be addressed by the Board.

The Committee recommends the complaint be dismissed as resolved and that a letter be directed to the Licensee in Charge directing him to be vigilant about the items being sold through his funeral home and reminding him that the actions of his apprentice are his responsibility and subject his license to disciplinary action. He should also be told that when contacted by the Board regarding complaints, he is to respond in writing as requested.

COMPLAINT 2014-13

The complainant, Millie Honaker, is the mother of the deceased, Paula Legg.. The relationship between the deceased and her sister with their mother was estranged and neither sister had contact for at least 15 years prior to the death of Ms. Legg. Paula Legg was gay and that caused the demise of the mother daughter relationship.

Paula Legg and her sister, Lisa McRae, decided at the time of their father's death, that each would take care of the other's funeral arrangements. Both decided on cremation. Both the deceased and her sister made Living Wills naming the other as the person to carry out her wishes. Paula had told her half sister, Charlotte Sheppard, that if anything happened to her that Lisa would be the person to take care of her final arrangements. She was adamant that her mother not be near her in life or death. Both Lisa McRae and Charlotte Sheppard provided the Committee with statements to this effect.

West Virginia law allows a person who has been designated by the deceased, who has expressed their wishes regarding the disposal of their remains, to act as the designated representative of that person. Based on the information given to the funeral director and the statements received from the sister and half sister, the Complaint Committee found that the funeral director acted in good faith in carrying out the wishes of the deceased and recommended that the complaint be dismissed.

COMPLAINT 2015-04

The complainant in this case alleges the when she attempted to arrange for a direct cremation for her deceased husband, the funeral director told her, that she would need the signatures of his children from a prior marriage or he and the crematory could be sued. The children refused to sign the cremation authorization. The funeral director responded and acknowledges that he foresaw a disagreement between the children and the present wife and asked her if she would consider letting the children see their father to which she agreed.

The complainant is upset that she was forced to have a funeral/visitation against her wishes and those of her deceased husband.

On September 28, 2015, the funeral director faxed another letter of response to the Board office.

On the first page of the letter in paragraph 2, he states that "I did, however, tell her if those children did not get to say goodbye to their Father, they would sue us from here and back."

In the next paragraph he states "My intentions from the beginning of the call in reference to Mr. Schoonover's death, and having been told that it would be a direct cremation, I informed Mrs. Schoonover it would be less money to have him cremated in Morgantown."

"Having grown up with the girls, and knowing their Mother, I wanted a time out, and I ask her if I could call her right back. After gathering my thoughts to keep a firestorm from happening, **I thought it best to bring Mr. Schoonover back, dress him and let the children say their goodbye.**" (The mother he refers to is the ex-wife of the deceased.)

The funeral director admits to receiving a phone call from the ex-wife and then he called the current wife and asked her if it would be ok if the children had a short time with their Dad to say goodbye. "Her response was, do I have to? And I said no, you don't have to, but nobody could ever say anything bad about you if you did let them." After more conversation with the wife, he again told her "that if the children got to say a last goodbye to their Dad, nobody could

ever say anything bad about her for that.”

It is clear that the funeral director was not listening to the wife of the deceased and, in fact, acted to steer her to have a service that neither she nor her deceased husband wanted in order to appease the ex-wife and family, and more importantly trying to avoid any type of possible litigation.

Based on the statements contained in the letter of September 18, 2015 (received September 28, 2015 by fax), the recommendation is that the Complaint Committee be allowed to enter into a Consent Agreement with the funeral director wherein he is reprimanded for his conduct in this matter.

COMPLAINT 2015-05:

This complaint was filed by Deborah Petty, one of the siblings of the deceased, and Robert Petty, Jr., the nephew of Deborah Petty, who purportedly has worked at funeral homes for many years and who questioned the way the funeral was conducted.

Ms. Petty was not present at the time the funeral arrangements were made by her three other siblings and arrived at the funeral home just prior to the time of the service. She complains about how the cars were parked; that she and her nephew were told to go to a room and be seated but that she and her nephew disregarded that instruction; that the family was made to go out a back door before the casket was closed and put into the hearse and that she never got a flower at the cemetery.

One of the three other siblings who made the arrangements advised this office in a conversation that the arrangements were that the family was to be seated together off the side of the chapel and to go into the chapel together; that no family car was to be used; that the casket was to be left open during the service and at the conclusion the family would exit a side door and the casket would then be closed and removed from the chapel. The funeral director states that she did hand out flowers but that she did not slight the complainant and apologizes if she thought so. The arrangements made by the three siblings were confirmed by fax to this office stating that everything was done as the funeral director had been instructed.

The Committee recommended that the complaint be dismissed as there is no violation of the Funeral Service Examiners Act.

COMPLAINT 2015-06:

George Cases, Sr. filed a complaint against Wallace & Wallace Funeral Home alleging that the funeral director filled out a “survey” form and fact that an alternative casket had to be used.

The first issue will be the use of an alternate casket. The casket originally selected was an oversized casket and those are not in ready supply in most instances and are in high demand in this day and time. The colors are also limited. Cardinal Casket originally thought they had

one, however, when they went to the warehouse they did not. Matthews Casket was then contacted and they also thought they had a casket that was the same as the one selected by the family, however, they later called and advised that they had an oversized casket but that it was a darker blue shade. This casket was an upgrade but the family was not required to pay extra for it.

The next issue is the survey form or as the complainant called it, a “scam” form. Both the Licensee in Charge and the funeral director involved say there is no such form. The funeral director states that he initially filled out a cemetery contract but that form was discarded. The questions asked to Mr. Cases by the funeral director appear to be routine questions which would be needed to complete a death certificate, for an obituary and to ascertain whether or not an estate would need to be opened for probate.

Mr. Cases also believes that a form letter he received from Phillips & Cohen relating to his son’s estate is connected in some way with the funeral home and that the funeral director would receive a “finders fee” or that he was in some way trying to make Mr. Cases responsible for his son’s past debts. A telephone call from the Board office to that company reveals that no information comes from the funeral home and that the information provided them would have come through public records at the county commission or from a client who had rendered services to the deceased.

It is unfortunate that there was a problem with securing a casket for the deceased, however, oversized caskets are in limited supply. The first company thought they had one but upon a trip to the warehouse found they did not. The second company also thought they had one but also determined the only one they had in stock was of a darker color and a better grade than the one originally selected. It was provided to the family for the same price as the one originally selected.

It is recommended that this complaint be dismissed as there is no evidence of any “scam” paper or survey and the funeral home did everything possible to accommodate the family. There is no evidence of any violation of the Funeral Service Examiners Act.

On motion of Sarah Lobban, seconded by Keith Kimble, the Board voted unanimously to allow the Complaint Committee to enter into a Consent Decree and Order with the funeral director involved in Complaint 2015-04. Should the funeral director not wish to enter into the Agreement, the Board will seek an Administrative Hearing.

On motion of Bill Davis, seconded by Sarah Lobban, the Board voted unanimously to accept the recommendations of the Board on the remaining Complaints and the same are hereby dismissed.

The Board then reviewed the Minutes of the June 8, 2015 and August 31, 2015 and on motion of Keith Kimble, seconded by Connie Grisell, the same were approved unanimously.

The P-Card invoices for May through August 2015 were reviewed and on motion of

Keith Kimble, seconded by Connie Grisell, were approved by unanimous vote.

The financial records for the months of May through August 2015 were reviewed and on motion of John Taylor, seconded by Robert Fields, were approved unanimously.

The approval of the membership in the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Board was discussed. Mr. Fields inquired as to the procedures used in administering the exams. On motion of Bill Davis, seconded by Connie Grisell, the Board voted unanimously to pay the invoice for the membership fees.

Ms. Sloan advised the Board that if they wished to continue the continuing education seminars that she would begin putting together the locations and dates and arranging for instructors.

The Board was also advised that the OASIS training continues and that it requires the full time attention of Regina to utilize that system.

The Board members were advised of the work schedules and holidays for the remainder of the year, as follows:

BOARD MEETING MINUTES
February 9, 2016

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m. by Ira Handley, President. Members in attendance were Bill Davis, Robert Fields, Keith Kimble, and John Taylor. Present by telephone conference were Connie Grisell and Sarah Lobban. Non members present were Regina Foster, Executive Director, Amanda Legg, Administrative Assistant and Constance Sloan. Rob Kimes and several members of the Funeral Directors Association were also present for the open part of the meeting.

On motion of Sarah Lobban, seconded by Keith Kimble, the Board the Board voted unanimously to go into Executive Session pursuant to WV Code §6-9A-4(b)(A). On motion of Keith Kimble, seconded by Bill Davis, the Board unanimously voted to return to public session.

At this time some members of the WVFDA entered the meeting room and disrupted the proceedings. Some of the members began verbally expressing objections concerning matters not on the agenda. None had requested to address the Board prior to the commencement of the meeting. The President stated that the complaint committee decisions and budget matters would be continued to a later date.

The October 6, 2015 Minutes were unanimously approved on motion of Bill Davis, seconded by John Taylor.

The Financial reports for September 2015 through December 2015 were discussed. Mr. Fields raised a question about two expenditures which appeared under the heading "livestock/farm" and "improvements". The charges, in the amount of \$6.99 and \$31.59, were incorrectly coded and Mr. Fields was advised by the Office Manager that they could not be corrected by would carry through until the year ending June 30. On motion of Bill Davis, seconded by Connie Grisell, the Board voted to approve the Financial Reports. Mr. Fields voted no.

On motion of Bob Fields, seconded by Keith Kimble, the Board voted to accept the Consent Decree and Order in Complaint 2015004, and to authorize the President to sign the same on behalf of the Board. In the Consent Decree and Order Jeff Bard agreed to be formally Reprimanded in his action which gave rise to this complaint. The matter is now closed.

On motion of Connie Grisell, seconded by Bob Fields, the Board amended the minutes of the June 2015 meeting in Complaint No. 2015-02 as follows:

COMPLAINT 2015-02

The complaint alleges that they purchased a cremation for their son from Lohr Barb Funeral Home and were charged for an 18 gauge casket and that they did not pick out the casket, the funeral home did. According to complainant, he contacted Pat Boyle at the crematory where the cremation was performed to see if he had been cremated in the

metal casket and was advised that his son was not cremated in the casket. Complainant believes that the casket was then reused by others. Complainant also contacted other funeral homes in the area comparing prices and getting advice on what should have occurred with his son's funeral. This complaint is another example of what happens when competitor funeral homes give advice when they have no idea of the actual situation.

On motion of Connie Grisell, seconded by Sarah Lobban, the Board voted unanimously to approve payment for the membership dues in the West Virginia Association of Licensing Boards.

On motion of Connie Grisell, seconded by Bill Davis, the Board voted unanimously to renew the current office lease for an additional three years.

On motion of Keith Kimble, seconded by Bill Davis, the Board voted unanimously to bring the inspector's per diem pay to the same as other state employees. Kanawha County meal allowance will continue to be \$15 per day. Meal allowance will be paid for one day out of county travel when the inspector does not use his personal vehicle.

On motion of Sarah Lobban, seconded by John Taylor, the Board voted unanimously to do away with morning and afternoon breaks of 15 minutes each and increase the lunch hour by 30 minutes, giving employees 1 hour lunch breaks.

The Office Manager advised the Board that as soon as the Legislature adjourned that she would begin securing meeting places and instructors for continuing education sessions to be held in September and October. The places under consideration are Alkanes, Fairmont or Clarksburg, Charleston, Beckley and possibly Parkersburg. Mr. Fields inquired about meetings in the eastern panhandle and was advised that we had tried to have them in Martinsburg previously but there was no attendance. Board members and licensees will be notified later of the locations and dates.

The Office Manager stated that we are still working on OASIS training, that Regina has done an excellent job in that area and bill paying and deposits are on time. She will move into the payroll aspect of OASIS this month.
