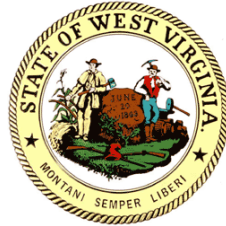

MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

1. ***Brain Under Construction Zone (BUCZ)/ Community Baby Showers***
 - a. *Camden-Clark Medical Center's maternity ward distributes BUCZ portfolios with BUCZ booklet and age-appropriate literature to parents.*
 - b. *Family Resource Networks promote BUCZ and are the point of contact in their respective counties.*
2. ***STARS – Schools Tackling At Risk Situations and Super Teens Achieving Regional Success***
 - a. *Educational component addressed eight(8) at-risk behaviors associated with middle school age students – bullying and peer pressure, eating disorders, depression, anger and violence, substance abuse, dropping out, suicide and homelessness.*
 - b. *Leadership component sponsored its first leadership series with STARS students developing community service projects and being recognized at a Spring Awards Luncheon.*
3. ***Social Networking***
 - a. *Distributed 14,750 Living Life Online booklets to 6th -12th grade students, an excellent resource about online safety and how to correctly communicate in today's world.*
 - b. *Distributed Heads Up: Stop! Think! Connect! Booklets to 3,788 public school employees, 600 Westbrook Health Services' employees and 400 community members.*

SUMMARY OF STRATEGIC PLAN RESULTS:

The primary focus is to develop and/or implement educational programs, services or provide teaching tools that would focus on enhancing positive youth behaviors.

Implementing United Way's Success by 6 (Brain Under Construction Zone locally) encourages parents to work with their children so they will be ready physically, mentally, developmentally, emotionally and socially when they enter kindergarten. The local FRNs in RESA 5's eight-county area promote the project at health fairs and community events.

Underscoring the idea that prevention works best when educational and leadership initiatives merge as one voice in promoting positive youth development to reduce at-risk youth behaviors, Westbrook Health Services (WHS), the behavioral health agency, and the Adolescent Health Initiative collaboratively developed **STARS. Schools Tackling At Risk Situations** is intended to help students in 5th- 8th grades understand behaviors that may indicate a serious problem, what the consequences of certain behaviors may be, and empower students to get help for themselves or others. **Super Teens Achieving Regional Success** is intended to promote youth development in 6th-12th grade

students who have unrecognized leadership potential – the caterpillar versus the butterfly. **STARS** engages youth who are on the fringes of becoming involved in school and/or community activities or involved but not the leaders. Through a regional leadership day, **STARS** students build skills needed to make a positive change in their schools and community. In the spring, **STARS** students are honored at an Awards Luncheon recognizing the *Super Stars*, *Shooting Stars* and *Rising Stars*.

Recognizing the risks and consequences of living online, posting personal information, online predators, bullying (on or offline), inappropriate messages and sexting, RESA 5 and Westbrook Health Services spoke with school officials, counselors, staff and students about maximizing the benefits and minimizing the risks of social media.

The RESA 5 Professional Development Office also coordinates Graduate and Undergraduate classes offered through the Extended Learning Center at West Virginia University.*

MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- Focus and Lead—Building Level School Improvement Professional Learning Community
- RESA 5 conducted a three-day institute (July 30, 31 & August 1) to train building level Professional Learning Communities in the development of a year-long effort to implement a comprehensive approach to school improvement. Using a model of our own design based on the West Virginia High Quality Standards for School Improvement principal-led teams of teachers received training in the elements of effective PLCs and engaged in an improvement planning process.
- Included in the work was the development of an effective strategic plan and a work plan which carefully described what is to be accomplished at the school in the important goal areas of:
 - 1) curriculum, instruction and assessment;
 - 2) school culture and climate and
 - 3) student, parent and community support.
- Participating PLCs will come away with an action plan. Participants developed effective core belief, mission and goal statements supported by examples of curriculum, instructional and assessment planning and implementation. The teams also developed strategies for improving the existing school culture and building stronger connections with both internal and external customers.
- Each team was then be supported by at least one RESA professional who will provided 20 days of on-site technical support throughout the 2012-13 school year to help focus and lead the plan.
- 113 Educators participated in graduate classes offered by RESA 5 in cooperation with the West Virginia University Center for Extended Learning
- Provided leadership development to teachers and principals, assisted with strategic planning and provided instructional improvement professional development for teachers at Calhoun County Middle High School in 10 separate sessions (7/23, 9/11, 10/23, 11/9, 11/13, & 12/18/12 and 2/26, 3/19, 4/16 & 5/15/13) during the 12-13 school year. This planning and execution played a role in the school being designated as a Transition school in the summer of 2013.
- Coordinated and facilitated the work of the RESA 5 Arts Team across 7 meetings throughout the 12-13 school year. RESA 5 will support professional development opportunities that promoted arts education with a particular emphasis on integration with other content areas.

SUMMARY OF STRATEGIC PLAN RESULTS:

Strategic Objective: The RESA 5 office of Professional Development, in cooperation with West Virginia University Center for Extended Learning, will schedule and coordinate a minimum of 15 class offerings that will enroll at least 175 educators between July 1, 2012 and June 30, 2013

Outcome: 113 Educators participated in 9 graduate classes offered by RESA 5 in cooperation with the West Virginia University Center for Extended Learning between July 1, 2012 and June 30, 2013.

Strategic Objective: The RESA 5 office of Professional Development will provide training and onsite support so that at least 3 school-based teams can develop and implement effective, strategic and action-based work plans by June, 2013.

Outcome: Arnoldsburg ES (Calhoun), Criss ES (Wood) and Parkersburg HS (Wood) principals and leadership teams were trained at the RESA 5 Focus and Lead seminar July 30, 31 and August 1, 2012 and the schools were provided on-site support for their whole school improvement effort throughout the 2012-13 school year by RESA personnel

Strategic Objective: The RESA 5 office of Professional Development will provide specific Professional Learning Community training to at least 12 professionals in the region who have served as a building administrator between 0 and 2 years or other educators who aspire to the principalship.

Outcome: No administrators registered for this PLC opportunity.

Strategic Objective: The RESA 5 Professional Development office will coordinate the electronic publication of a capacity matrix of the NxG CSO's for all teachers to use to help students track their own learning progress.

Outcome: This project is 90% complete and is currently in use in some schools.

Strategic Objective: The RESA 5 Professional Development office will conduct two follow-up sessions to the summer WVU-Extended Learning graduate classes Mathematics Content for Elementary Teachers and Social Networking: The Good, The Bad, The Ugly that were held during the 2012 Summer session.

Outcome: No teachers registered for this follow-up opportunity.

Strategic Objective: The RESA 5 Professional Development office will present a "Leadership Series" (October, 2012 and March, 2013) to at least 25 administrators and principals featuring PD on 1) *The Application of Social Media in an Academic Setting* and 2) *What Should Student Personalized Learning Look Like in a School?*

Outcome: The RESA 5 Leadership Series was held on October 19, 2012 with 31 in attendance and February 8 with 17 in attendance.

Strategic Objective: The RESA 5 Professional Development office will provide training to new Kindergarten Teachers during the 12-13 school year who have not been trained on the NxG CSO's.

Outcome: Three teachers attended this training on September 25, October 2 and October 16.

Strategic Objective: The RESA 5 Professional Development office will provide follow-up training and a sustained electronic learning community on scheduling, standards-based grading, and sample lesson designs for at least 25% of RESA 5 teachers who attended this past summer's TLI.

Outcome: No teachers registered to participate.

Strategic Objective: The RESA 5 Professional Development office will coordinate the placement of 5 students from each of the 11 RESA 5 high schools to attend the iBELIEVE! summer camp to be held in June, 2013.

Outcome: Thirty one students from 8 high schools in the region attended this camp in June, 2013

Strategic Objective: The RESA 5 Professional Development office will provide professional development that promotes meaningful connections between and among disciplines (including 21st century learning skills) taught through integrating chosen subject matter CSOs with dance, music, theatre, and/or visual art during the 2012-13 school year.

Outcome: Teaching pairs in Calhoun, Pleasants, Roane, Tyler and Wood Counties participated in this project.
