Wood County Commissioner Blair Couch said that he is upset that the fifth largest county in the state is not directly represented on the decision-making task force.

# State districts will soon change

PARKERSBURG - The West Virginia Senate will soon be redistricting the state after

the recent U.S. Census Bureau released information on changes to West Virginia's population statistics. Senate Majority Leader John

Unger, D-Berkeley, said the decisions will be decided by the 17-member Senate Redistricting Unger

"We picked a senator from each of the 17 senatorial districts," Unger said. "This way every district is represented." Unfortunately, through this process, the senators did no chose a representative fror Wood County.

"(State) Sen. Donny Boley. R-Pleasants, is a representative for the 3rd District and she represents Wood County very well as a senator and will do a great job representing the people of Wood County in the task force." Unger said. Wood County is the fifth

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largest county in the state behind Kanawha, Berkeley, Cabell and Monongalia counties. Parkersburg, however, remains the third largest city in West Virginia.

"As the fifth largest county, you would think we would have direct representation," said

Wood County Commissioner Blair Couch. Couch cited the Friday visit from acting Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin to Parkersburg as a reason for Wood County to have direct representation in the task force.

"It's just very interesting that it's well and good that state officials can come here to ask for funds, but Wood County has no (direct) say in what affects the state for the next 10 years," Couch added.

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
