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
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

AN ACT to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article, designated §5A-6A-1, §5A-6A-2, §5A-6A-3, §5A-6A-4, §5A-6A-5, §5A-6A-6, §5A-6A-7, §5A-6A-8 and §5A-6A-9, all relating to establishing the Permitting and Licensing Information Act; authorizing the Governor's Office of Technology to establish a permitting and licensing information system; providing legislative findings; definitions; establishing authority and duties of the office; creating duty for

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agencies to provide permitting and licensing information; reporting requirements; granting rule-making authority; and providing for limitations of the article.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new article, designated §5A-6A-1, §5A-6A-2, §5A-6A-3, §5A-6A-4, §5A-6A-5, §5A-6A-6, §5A-6A-7, §5A-6A-8 and §5A-6A-9, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 6A. PERMITTING AND LICENSING INFORMATION ACT.

§5A-6A-1. Short title.

- 1 Short title. This article may be known and cited as
- 2 the Permitting and Licensing Information Act.

§5A-6A-2. Legislative findings.

- 1 (a) The Legislature finds that:
- 2 (1) Persons conducting business activities in this state
- 3 are required to obtain permits and licenses from various
- 4 agencies that regulate those activities;
- 5 (2) The efficiency of the permitting and licensing
- 6 process is an integral component of effective
- 7 government, business development and public
- 8 participation; and
- 9 (3) It is in the public interest that the permitting and
- 10 licensing process for business activities should be
- 11 efficient and streamlined.
- 12 (b) Therefore, the Legislature declares that the

- 13 permitting and licensing process for business activities
- 14 be facilitated and coordinated by the Governor's Office
- 15 of Technology.

§5A-6A-3. Definitions.

- 1 For the purposes of this article, the following words
- 2 have the meaning assigned unless the context indicates
- 3 otherwise:
- 4 (1) "Agency" means any board, department, division,
- 5 authority, commission or other public entity that
- 6 requires a permit or license to be obtained from the
- 7 entity to conduct a business activity in this state.
- 8 (2) "Office" means the Governor's Office of
- 9 Technology.
- 10 (3) "Permit" means any permit, license, authorization,
- 11 certification, registration or other approval required to
- 12 perform a business activity.

§5A-6A-4. Permit and license information authority.

- 1 (a) The Legislature hereby authorizes the Governor's
- 2 Office of Technology to facilitate and coordinate the
- 3 permitting and licensing process for business activities
- 4 in this state.
- 5 (b) The office has the following authority to:
- 6 (1) Establish a central permit and license information
- 7 repository;
- 8 (2) Determine the type of information that each

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- 9 agency must submit in order to provide adequate
- 10 information to the public regarding the permits and
- 11 licenses needed for a particular business activity;
- 12 (3) Require state agencies and local agencies to
- 13 provide their permit and license information, including
- 14 the type and purpose of all permits and licenses the
- 15 agency issues;
- 16 (4) Create an online permitting and licensing program
- 17 monitored through the state web page; and
- 18 (5) Make recommendations to the Governor and the
- 19 Legislature concerning the functionality of the central
- 20 permit and license information repository to ensure its
- 21 accessibility and reliability for use by agencies and the
- 22 public.

§5A-6A-5. Duty of agencies to provide permitting and licensing information; development of permitting and licensing information repository.

- 1 (a) On or before the first day of October, two thousand
- 2 eight, the office shall provide notice to all agencies that
- 3 beginning on the first day of February, two thousand
- 4 nine, that the agency shall submit licensing and
- 5 permitting information to the office.
- 6 (b) On or before the first day of December, two
- 7 thousand eight, the office shall establish, and provide to
- 8 agencies that issue permits and licenses, the procedures
- 9 and methods for submission of required permitting and
- 10 licensing information for the permitting and licensing
- 11 information repository.

- 12 (c) On or before the first day of February, two
- 13 thousand nine, an agency that issues permits and
- 14 licenses shall submit the required permitting and
- 15 licensing information to the office in accordance with
- the procedures and methods established in this article.
- 17 (d) On or before the first day of July, two thousand
- 18 nine, the office will create an internet-based, publicly
- 19 accessible permitting and licensing information
- 20 repository, in coordination with the state's e-
- 21 government initiatives, that contains the following:
- 22 (1) A comprehensive detailed listing of the types of
- 23 permits and licenses required for specific business
- 24 activities;
- 25 (2) The purposes of the permits and licenses; and
- 26 (3) The agencies responsible for issuance of the
- 27 permits and licenses, including the agency contact
- 28 information.
- 29 (e) The permitting and licensing information
- 30 repository shall allow individuals to obtain a listing of
- 31 the types of permits and licenses required for specific
- 32 business activities.

§5A-6A-6. Requirements for adopted, revised or terminated permitting or licensing information.

- 1 No later than thirty days prior to the effective date of
- 2 the implementation, revision or termination of any
- 3 permitting or licensing requirement, an agency, subject
- 4 to the provisions of this article, is required to provide
- 5 to the office the current information relating to a

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6 permit or license.

§5A-6A-7. Reporting requirements.

- 1 Annually, by the thirtieth day of December, the office
- 2 shall report to the Joint Committee on Government and
- 3 Finance and the Governor the status of the permitting
- 4 and licensing information repository and identify any
- 5 agency that has failed to comply with the requirements
- 6 of this article.

§5A-6A-8. Rule-making authority.

- 1 The office may propose rules for legislative approval
- 2 pursuant to the provisions of article three, chapter
- 3 twenty-nine-a of this code to effectuate the purpose
- 4 and provisions of this article.

§5A-6A-9. Limitation.

- 1 Although this article creates a central permitting and
- 2 licensing information repository, each agency shall
- 3 continue to administer its own permitting and licensing
- 4 procedures and charge and collect the appropriate fees.
