12	A BILL to amend and reenact \$19-20-14, \$19-20-15, \$19-20-16, \$19-
13	20-17 and $$19-20-18$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as
14	amended, all relating to adding captive cervids to the list of
15	animals protected from dogs which have killed, wounded or
16	worried any of the listed animals; recovering damages;
17	assessing damages by appraisers; killing a dog lawfully;
18	harboring a dog unlawfully; and providing penalties.
19	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
20	That $$19-20-14$, $$19-20-15$, $$19-20-16$, $$19-20-17$ and $$19-20-18$
21	of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and
22	reenacted, all to read as follows:
23	ARTICLE 20. DOGS AND CATS.
24	§19-20-14. Dog killing, wounding or worrying livestock; captive
25	cervids or poultry; recovery of damages.
26	If any dog has killed or assisted in killing, wounding or
27	worrying any sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, show
28	or breeding rabbits, horses, colts, captive cervids or poultry out

1 of the enclosure of the owner of the dog, the owner or keeper of 2 the dog shall be liable for the sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, 3 cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, colts, captive 4 cervids or poultry in the amount of the damages sustained, to be 5 recovered in an action before any court or magistrate having 6 jurisdiction of the action. It shall not be necessary to sustain 7 the action to prove that the owner of the dog knew the dog was 8 accustomed to worrying, killing or wounding. A recovery under this 9 section shall bar and preclude bars the owner of the sheep, lambs, 10 goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, 11 horses, colts, captive cervids or poultry from obtaining 12 compensation from the county commission under the provisions of 13 this article. If the person suffering the loss or damage cannot 14 ascertain the owner or keeper of the dog, or if the owner or keeper 15 is not financially responsible, then the person suffering the loss 16 or damage may file his or her claim with and prove the same before 17 the county commission of the county in which the loss or damage is 18 sustained, in the manner provided in this article, and the 19 commission shall pay the loss or damage out of the fund provided 20 for such purposes and according to the provisions of this article. 21 When compensation is so obtained from the county commission, the 22 county commission is authorized to sue under this section and 23 recover as the owner of the sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, 24 cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, colts, captive 25 cervids or poultry. The amount so recovered shall be paid into the 26 county treasury but no suit shall may be commenced unless 27 authorized by the county commission.

28 §19-20-15. Dog killing, wounding or worrying livestock; captive

cervids or poultry; assessment of damages; appraisers.

3 Authority is hereby given to magistrates and notaries public 4 within this state, and within their respective jurisdictions, to 5 summon three substantial, upright and worthy bona fide residents, 6 citizens and taxpayers of his or her county to assess the damages 7 suffered by any a person on account of the destruction, loss or 8 injury of any sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, 9 show or breeding rabbits, horses, colts, captive cervids or poultry 10 by dogs within the county. The appraisers shall be appointed upon 11 the request of a person suffering damages on account of such 12 destruction, loss or injury. The appraisers shall go upon the 13 ground and investigate fully the extent of the destruction, loss or 14 injury, taking all the evidence deemed necessary to arrive at the 15 facts to be passed upon in arriving at the amount of damage, if 16 any, suffered by the party making the complaint. Before the 17 appraisers may be summoned by the magistrate or notary public, the 18 complainant shall be is required to make a sworn complaint before 19 the magistrate or notary public, setting out in plain, easily 20 comprehensible terms the facts concerning his or her damages to the 21 best of his or her knowledge. After making a full investigation of 22 the facts involved, the appraisers, with the assistance of the 23 magistrate or notary public, shall make a sworn statement and 24 report the facts ascertained and the damages suffered. The report 25 and statement shall be filed with the county commission or the 26 clerk thereof in vacation. The fees and mileage for services 27 allowed in such cases shall be the same as are allowed magistrates, 28 witnesses and arbitrators in magistrates' courts in this state for 1 similar services. In the event that If the appraisers find that
2 the complainant has suffered no damage, then the complainant shall
3 be is responsible for and pay all the costs and expenses of the
4 proceeding. In the event that If the complainant has suffered
5 damages on account of the destruction, loss or injury of his or her
6 domestic animals, according to the finding of the appraisers, the
7 owner, keeper or person permitting the dog or dogs causing the
8 damage to remain upon the premises under his or her control shall
9 be is liable for all damages sustained by the complainant,
10 including all costs and necessary expenses. All of the damages
11 shall be collectible by an action at law before any court or
12 magistrate having jurisdiction of the matter. All papers in
13 connection with any a claim shall be filed and preserved in the
14 office of the clerk of the county commission.

- 15 §19-20-16. Dog killing, wounding or worrying livestock; captive cervids or poultry; when lawful to kill dog.
- A person may kill a dog that he <u>or she</u> <u>may see</u> <u>observes</u>

 18 chasing, worrying, wounding or killing any sheep, lambs, goats,

 19 kids, calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses,

 20 colts, <u>captive cervids</u> or poultry outside of the enclosure of the

 21 owner of the dog, unless the chasing or worrying be done by the

 22 direction of the owner of the sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves,

 23 cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits or horses and colts,

 24 <u>captive cervids</u> or poultry.
- 25 §19-20-17. Dog killing, wounding or worrying livestock; captive cervids or poultry; unlawful to harbor dog; penalty.
- 27 A person who shall harbor or secrete or aid harbors, secretes 28 or aids in secreting a dog which he or she knows or has reasons to

1 believe has worried, chased or killed any sheep, lambs, goats, 2 kids, calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, 3 colts, captive cervids or poultry not the property of the owner of 4 the dog, out of his or her enclosure, or knowingly permits the same 5 to be done on any premises under his or her control, is guilty of 6 a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, before any court or 7 magistrate having jurisdiction thereof in the county in which the 8 offense is committed, shall be fined not less than ten dollars \$10 9 nor more than fifty dollars, \$50, and, at the discretion of the 10 court or magistrate, imprisoned in the county jail not more than 11 thirty days. Each day that the dog is harbored, kept or secreted 12 shall constitute constitutes a separate offense.

13 §19-20-18. Dog killing, wounding or worrying livestock; captive

14 cervids or poultry; duty of owner to kill dog;

15 proceeding before magistrate on failure of owner to

16 kill.

The owner or keeper of a dog that has been worrying, wounding, 18 chasing or killing any sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, 19 swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, colts, captive cervids or 20 poultry not the property of the owner or keeper, out of his or her 21 enclosure, shall, within forty-eight hours after having received 22 notice thereof in writing from a reliable and trustworthy source, 23 under oath, kill the dog or direct that the dog be killed. If the 24 owner or keeper refuses to kill the dog as hereinbefore provided, 25 the magistrate, upon information, shall summon the owner or keeper 26 of the dog, and, after receiving satisfactory proof that this dog 27 did the mischief, shall issue a warrant on application being made 28 by the owner of the sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle,

1 swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, or colts, <u>captive cervids</u>
2 or poultry killed and give it <u>into the hands of to</u> the sheriff, who
3 shall kill the dog forthwith or dispose of by other available
4 methods. The cost of the proceedings shall be paid by the owner or
5 keeper of the dog so killed, including a fee of <u>fifty cents 50¢</u> to
6 the officer killing the dog. The owner or keeper of the dog, so
7 killed shall, in addition to the costs, be <u>in addition to the</u>
8 <u>costs, is</u> liable to the owner of the sheep, lambs, goats, kids,
9 calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, colts,
10 <u>captive cervids</u> or poultry or to the county commission for the
11 value of the sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, show
12 or breeding rabbits, horses or colts, <u>captive cervids</u> or poultry so
13 killed or injured.
