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13	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$7-1-1b$ of the Code of West Virginia,
14	1931, as amended, relating to setting forth residency
15	requirements for county commissioners; clarifying that a
16	person shall reside in the magisterial district from which he
17	or she is seeking election and from which he or she was
18	appointed or elected; and providing that if boundaries of a
19	magisterial district are changed during the term of a county
20	commissioner, he or she may serve out the remainder of the
21	term.
22	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
23	That §7-1-1b of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
24	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
25	ARTICLE 1. COUNTY COMMISSIONS GENERALLY.
26	§7-1-1b. Legislative findings; qualifications for county
27	commissioners.
28	(a) The Legislature finds that:

- 1 (1) There is confusion concerning when a candidate for county 2 commission must be a resident of the magisterial district he or she 3 wants to represent;
- 4 (2) The Supreme Court has discussed the residency requirement 5 in several cases and has conflicting interpretations;
- 6 (3) It is imperative that this issue be permanently resolved 7 at the time of filing to ensure the citizens have \underline{a} choice on the 8 ballot:
- 9 (4) It is essential the citizens know they are voting for a 10 person who is qualified to be a candidate; and
- 11 (5) With the expense of holding an election, tax payer moneys
 12 should not be wasted of on officials who could never serve.
- 13 (b) A candidate for the office of county commissioner shall be
 14 a resident <u>from of</u> the magisterial district for which he or she is
 15 seeking election:
- 16 (1) By the last day to file a certificate of announcement 17 pursuant to section seven, article five, chapter three of this 18 code; or
- 19 (2) At the time of his or her appointment by the county 20 executive committee or the chairperson of the county executive 21 committee.
- (c) A person shall be a resident of the magisterial district
- 23 from which he or she is seeking election as county commissioner and
- 24 from which he or she was appointed or elected county commissioner.
- 25 When a candidate for the office of county commissioner no longer
- 26 resides in the magisterial district, after satisfying the
- 27 requirements of subsection (b) of this section, he or she is deemed
- 28 ineligible for election. When a county commissioner no longer

- 1 resides in the magisterial district for which he or she was elected
- 2 or appointed to represent, his or her seat is deemed vacant:
- 3 Provided, That should boundaries of a magisterial district be
- 4 changed during the term of a commissioner which results in him or
- 5 her no longer residing in the magisterial district from which he or
- 6 she was elected, the commissioner may serve out the remainder of
- 7 his or her term.
