10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$20-2-42n$ and $\$20-2-42p$ of the Code of
11	West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to allowing
12	unused Class RG and RRG deer stamps to be used to hunt and
13	take antlerless deer during the appropriate season.
14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That $\$20-2-42n$ and $\$20-2-42p$ of the Code of West Virginia,
16	1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 2. WILDLIFE RESOURCES.
18	§20-2-42n. Class N resident and Class NN nonresident antlerless
19	deer hunting stamp.
20	A Class N stamp is a resident deer hunting stamp for
21	antlerless deer. A Class NN stamp is a nonresident deer hunting
22	stamp for antlerless deer. These stamps entitle the licensee to
23	hunt and take antlerless deer of either sex during the Class N
24	season. The fee for a Class N stamp is \$10 and the fee for a Class

1 NN stamp is \$25. Class N and NN stamps may be issued only for the 2 purpose of removing antlerless deer when the director determines it 3 essential for proper management of the wildlife resources. A Class 4 RG resident or Class RRG nonresident qun deer hunting stamp, issued 5 pursuant to section forty-two-p of this article, that was not used 6 during the regular season, may be used in place of the Class N and 7 Class NN stamp authorized by this section, if the director 8 determines it is essential for the proper management of the 9 wildlife resources. The director may promulgate rules governing 10 the issuance and use of the Class N and NN stamps as deemed 11 necessary to limit, on a fair and equitable basis, the number of 12 persons who may hunt for antlerless deer in a county, or part of a 13 county. When the director determines it essential that a Class N 14 or NN season be held in a particular county or part of a county, 15 that season shall be is set by the Natural Resources Commission as 16 provided in section seventeen, article one of this chapter. Bona 17 fide resident landowners or their resident children, or resident 18 parents, bona fide resident tenants of such land and bona fide 19 resident stockholders of resident corporations which are formed for 20 the primary purpose of hunting or fishing and which are the fee 21 simple owners of no less than one thousand acres of land upon which 22 the antlerless deer may be hunted are not required to have a Class 23 N stamp in their possession while hunting antlerless deer on their 24 own land during the Class N season. A resident hunter, including

- 1 those not required to purchase a license pursuant to section
- 2 twenty-seven of this article, must purchase and carry a valid Class
- 3 N stamp. A nonresident hunter must purchase and carry a valid
- 4 Class NN stamp. These stamps require that the licensee purchase
- 5 the appropriate base license before participating in the activities
- 6 specified in this section, except as noted.
- 7 §20-2-42p. Class RG resident and Class RRG nonresident gun deer
- 8 hunting stamp for an additional deer.
- 9 The director has the authority to issue a Class RG resident
- 10 and a Class RRG nonresident gun deer hunting stamp when deemed
- 11 essential for the proper management of the wildlife resources.
- 12 These stamps allow the licensee to hunt and take an additional deer
- 13 as designated by the director. A Class RG resident or Class RRG
- 14 nonresident gun deer hunting stamp, issued pursuant to this section
- 15 that is not used during the regular season, may be used in place of
- 16 the Class N and Class NN stamp authorized by section forty-two-n of
- 17 this article, if the director determines it is essential for the
- 18 proper management of the wildlife resources. The fee for a Class
- 19 RG stamp is \$20 and the fee for a Class RRG stamp is \$40. The
- 20 director may promulgate rules in accordance with article three,
- 21 chapter twenty-nine-a of this code governing the issuance and use
- 22 of these stamps. These stamps require that the licensee purchase
- 23 the appropriate base license before participating in the activities
- 24 specified in this section, except as noted.

 $\tt NOTE:$ The purpose of this bill is to allow unused Class RG and RRG deer stamps to be used to hunt and take antlerless deer during the appropriate season.
