- 2 the sweets. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit
- 3 or limit sale or distribution of any food item through fund-raising
- 4 activities of students, teachers or educational groups when the
- 5 items are intended for sale off the school grounds.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to allow parents or the school to serve sweets during the holidays if the school receives parental or guardian consent.
