14	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
15	ARTICLE 7. GENERAL PROVISIONS.
16	§49-7-26. Duty of prosecuting attorney.
17	The prosecuting attorney shall render to the State Department
18	of welfare Health and Human Resources, without additional
19	compensation, such legal services as the department may require.
20	This section shall not be construed to prohibit the department from
21	developing plans for cooperation with courts, prosecuting
22	attorneys, and other law-enforcement officials in such a manner as
23	to permit the state and its citizens to obtain maximum fiscal
24	benefits under federal laws, rules and regulations. The prosecuting
25	attorney shall maintain all individual authority and responsibility

- 1 enjoyed by every other attorney-client relationship. Prosecuting
- 2 attorneys have the right and responsibility to represent the
- 3 public interest in protecting abused and neglected children when
- 4 their position conflicts with that of the department.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to add language to West Virginia Code to provide guidance for prosecuting attorneys in cases involving abused and neglected children.
