10	A BILL to amend $\$2-2-1a$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as
11	amended, relating to designating the first Thursday in May the
12	West Virginia Day of Prayer.
13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
14	That §2-2-1a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
15	be amended to read as follows:
16	ARTICLE 2. LEGAL HOLIDAYS; SPECIAL MEMORIAL DAYS; CONSTRUCTION OF
17	STATUTES; DEFINITIONS.
18	§2-2-1a. Special memorial days.
19	(a) The Governor shall, by proclamation, declare the week
20	beginning with the Sunday before Thanksgiving as a special memorial
21	week to be known as Native American Indian Heritage Week.
22	(b) The first Tuesday after the first Monday of November is
23	designated Susan B. Anthony Day and shall only be a legal holiday
24	in all years ending in an even number. The Governor shall annually
25	issue a proclamation calling on all schools, civic organizations,
26	government departments and citizens to undertake activities on the
27	designated day and surrounding days to pay tribute to the
28	accomplishments of Susan B. Anthony in securing the civil and
29	political rights of all Americans, including securing equal voting

1 rights for women.

2 (c) The Governor shall, by proclamation, declare December 7 as 3 a special memorial day, to be known as Pearl Harbor Day, honoring 4 all West Virginians who fought in World War II and shall encourage 5 all municipalities in the state to do the same.

6 <u>(d) The Governor shall, by proclamation, declare the first</u> 7 <u>Thursday in May as the West Virginia Day of Prayer. This date</u> 8 <u>corresponds with the National Day of Prayer, 36 U.S.C. §119, on</u> 9 <u>which the people of West Virginia may turn to God in prayer and</u> 10 meditation at churches, in groups, and as individuals.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to make the first Thursday of May the West Virginia Day of Prayer.
