14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
16	by adding thereto a new section, designated \$11-21-12j, to read as
17	follows:
18	ARTICLE 21. PERSONAL INCOME TAX.
19	§11-21-12j. Additional modification reducing federal adjusted
20	gross income.
21	(a) Allowance of deduction Subject to the limitations
22	provided in subsection (b), there is allowed a deduction against
23	adjusted gross income amounts paid by the taxpayer for the spaying
24	and neutering of dogs and cats which are maintained as pets in the

- 1 taxpayer's household.
- 2 (b) Limitations.
- 3 (1) The deduction provided is allowable only as to sums which 4 have actually been paid.
- 5 (2) The spay or neuter surgical procedure shall have been 6 performed by a duly licensed veterinarian on a live cat or dog.
- 7 (3) The amount of deduction for each cat or dog which have 8 been spayed or neutered may not exceed the reasonable cost of the 9 spay and neuter procedures in the state.
- 10 (4) The deduction is limited to no more than three companion 11 animals, dogs and cats, per household in any taxable year.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide a personal income tax deduction for people who have their dog or cat spayed or neutered.

This section is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
