L 4	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
L 5	That $\$7-3-3$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be
L 6	amended and reenacted to read as follows:
L 7	ARTICLE 3. COUNTY PROPERTY.
L 8	§7-3-3. Sale of county or district property.
L 9	(a) Except as may be prohibited by law or otherwise, the
20	county commission of a county is authorized $\frac{by}{aw}$ to sell or
21	dispose of any property, either real or personal, belonging to the
22	county or held by it for the use of any district thereof, by the
23	<pre>following:</pre>
24	(1) The property shall be sold at public auction, unless the
25	county commission finds a specific public interest as set out in
26	subdivision two of this subsection; or

- 2 transaction for adequate consideration based on the fair market
- 3 value of the property if the county commission finds, by adopted
- 4 written resolution that specifically states, that:
- 5 (A) The objectives for the property would not be met if the

- 7 (B) The interests of the public would be better served by the

- 9 (C) The direct sale would not be a detriment to the county.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to deal the sale of property owned by the county commission; and authorizes a sale for adequate consideration under specific circumstances.
