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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$8-1-5a$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to increasing the number of
12	municipalities that may participate in the Municipal Home Rule
13	Pilot Program; providing that if the two legislative members
14	of the Municipal Home Rule Board permit designees to sit in
15	their place, those persons sit ex officio; and extending
16	certain deadline dates.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That §8-1-5a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
19	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
20	ARTICLE 1. PURPOSE AND SHORT TITLE; DEFINITIONS; GENERAL
21	PROVISIONS; CONSTRUCTION.
22	§8-1-5a. Pilot program to increase powers of municipal self
23	government.
24	(a) The Legislature finds and declares that:

- 1 (1) The future economic progress for the State of West
- 2 Virginia is directly related to the success of its municipalities
- 3 in that stronger municipalities will make for a stronger West
- 4 Virginia;
- 5 (2) Municipalities face numerous challenges managing their
- 6 budgets and delivering services required by federal or state law or
- 7 demanded by their constituents;
- 8 (3) Municipalities are sometimes restricted by state statutes,
- 9 policies, rules and responsibilities that prevent them from
- 10 carrying out their duties and responsibilities in a cost-effective,
- 11 efficient and timely manner; and
- 12 (4) Authorizing pilot municipalities and metro governments in
- 13 West Virginia to exercise broad-based home rule will allow the
- 14 Legislature the opportunity to evaluate the viability of allowing
- 15 municipalities to have broad-based state home rule to improve urban
- 16 and state development.
- 17 (b) It is the intent of the Legislature in enacting this
- 18 section to establish a framework for municipalities within which
- 19 new ideas can be explored to see if they can or should be
- 20 implemented on a statewide basis.
- 21 (c) Effective July 1, 2007, there is hereby created a pilot
- 22 program to be known as the Municipal Home Rule Pilot Program
- 23 authorizing five seven selected Class I, Class II and/or Class III
- 24 municipalities and/or metro governments the authority to enact any

- 1 ordinances, acts, resolutions, rules and regulations not contrary
- 2 to the Constitutions of the United States or West Virginia, federal
- 3 law or chapters sixty-a, sixty-one and sixty-two of this code.
- 4  $\,$  (d) To be eligible to participate in the Municipal Home Rule
- 5 Pilot Program the applicant shall:
- 6 (1) Be a Class I, Class II and/or Class III municipality
- 7 and/or a metro government: Provided, That a municipality
- 8 considering consolidation or establishing a metro government shall
- 9 have no more than two years from the date it is selected for the
- 10 pilot program to complete its consolidation or metro government
- 11 process or its participation in the pilot program will terminate at
- 12 the end of the two-year period; and
- 13 (2) Have a written plan stating in detail the following:
- 14 (A) The specific laws, policies, rules or regulations which
- 15 prevent the municipality from carrying out its duties in the most
- 16 cost-efficient, effective and timely manner;
- 17 (B) The problems created by the laws, policies, rules or
- 18 regulations; and
- 19 (C) The proposed solutions to the problems, including all
- 20 proposed changes to ordinances, acts, resolutions, rules and
- 21 regulations.
- 22 (e) Effective July 1, 2007, there is hereby created a
- 23 Municipal Home Rule Board consisting of the following seven
- 24 members:

- 1 (1) The Governor, or a designee, who shall serve as chair;
- 2 (2) The Executive Director of the West Virginia Development
- 3 Office or a designee;
- 4 (3) The chair of the Senate Committee on Government
- 5 Organization or a designee <u>sitting ex officio;</u>
- 6 (4) The chair of the House of Delegates Committee on
- 7 Government Organization or a designee sitting ex officio;
- 8 (5) One member shall be a representative of the business and
- 9 Industry Council;
- 10 (6) One member shall be a representative of the largest labor
- 11 organization in the state; and
- 12 (7) One member shall be a representative of the West Virginia
- 13 Chapter of American Institute of Certified Planners.
- 14 (f) The board has the powers necessary to implement the
- 15 provisions of this section, including the following:
- 16 (1) Reviewing, evaluating and making recommendations to the
- 17 proposed plans submitted by eligible municipalities and/or metro
- 18 governments;
- 19 (2) Consulting with state agencies affected by the proposed
- 20 plans;
- 21 (3) Selecting municipalities and/or metro governments to
- 22 participate in the pilot program;
- 23 (4) Approving the plans of recommended pilot program
- 24 participants, as submitted or as modified; and

- 1 (5) Authorizing amendments to approved plans.
- 2 (g) On or before January 1,  $\frac{2008}{2013}$  an eligible
- 3 municipality and/or metro government wanting to participate in the
- 4 pilot program shall submit a written plan as described in
- 5 subdivision (2), subsection (d) of this section to the board.
- 6 (h) Prior to submitting a written plan, the municipality 7 shall:
- 8 (1) Conduct a public hearing on the proposed written plan;
- 9 (2) Provide at least thirty days' notice of the public hearing 10 by a Class II legal advertisement;
- 11 (3) Make a copy of the proposed written plan available for 12 public inspection at least thirty days prior to the public hearing; 13 and
- (4) After the public hearing, adopt a municipal ordinance authorizing the municipality to submit a proposed written plan to the Municipal Home Rule Board after the proposed municipal ordinance has been read two times.
- (i) On or before June 1, 2008 2013, the board shall select by 19 a majority vote of the board at least one, but not more than five 20 ten municipalities and/or metro governments to participate in the 21 pilot program.
- (j) The pilot municipalities and/or metro governments selected 23 to participate in the pilot program shall have the following 24 powers:

- 1 (1) The authority to pass any ordinances, acts, resolutions,
- 2 rules and regulations not contrary to the Constitutions of the
- 3 United States or West Virginia, federal law or chapters sixty-a,
- 4 sixty-one and sixty-two of this code as specified in their written
- 5 and approved plans: Provided, That the pilot municipalities may
- 6 not adopt any ordinance, rule, regulation or resolution or take any
- 7 action that would create a defined contribution employee pension or
- 8 retirement plan for its employees currently covered by a defined
- 9 benefit pensions plan; and
- 10 (2) Any other powers necessary to implement the provisions of
- 11 its approved plan.
- 12 (k) Before July 1, 2012 2016, the Joint Committee on
- 13 Government and Finance shall conduct a performance review on the
- 14 pilot program and the participating municipalities and/or metro
- 15 governments. The review shall include the following:
- 16 (1) An evaluation of the effectiveness of expanded home rule
- 17 on the participating municipalities and/or metro governments;
- 18 (2) A recommendation as to whether the expanded home rule
- 19 should be continued, reduced, expanded or terminated;
- 20 (3) A recommendation as to whether any legislation is
- 21 necessary; and
- 22 (4) Any other issues considered relevant.
- 23 (1) On or before January 1, 2013 2016, the Joint Committee on
- 24 Government and Finance shall report to the Joint Committee on

- 1 Government Organization the findings of the performance review.
- 2 (m) The pilot program terminates on July 1, 2013 2017.
- 3 (n) No ordinances, acts, resolutions, rules or regulations may
- 4 be enacted by a municipality or metro government after July 1, 2013
- 5 2017, pursuant to the provisions of this section, unless otherwise
- 6 authorized by the Legislature.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to increase the number of municipalities that may participate in the Municipal Home Rule Pilot Program. The bill provides that if the chair of the Senate Committee on Government Organization or the chair of the House of Delegates Committee on Government Organization who serve as members of the Municipal Home Rule Board permit a designee to sit in his or her place, that person sits ex officio. The bill also extends certain deadline dates.
