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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$18A-3-1a$ and $\$18A-3-1b$ of the Code of
11	West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to alternative
12	programs for teacher education; providing definitions;
13	including entity affiliated with approved teacher education
14	programs to be a partner in offering programs; defining
15	approved education provider; generally reorganizing section,
16	updating terms and eliminating duplicative language; allowing
17	participation of candidates pursuing certification to teach
18	American Sign Language; eliminating requirement to post
19	position of alternative program teacher each year prior to
20	rehiring; authorizing alternative methods of instructional
21	delivery and candidate supervision and modifying existing
22	methods; modifying reporting and recommendation requirements;
23	and requiring certain legislative rules.
24	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

1	That $18A-3-1a$ and $18A-3-1b$ of the Code of West Virginia,
2	1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
3	ARTICLE 3. TRAINING, CERTIFICATION, LICENSING, PROFESSIONAL
4	DEVELOPMENT.
5	<pre>\$18A-3-1a. Alternative programs for the education of teachers;</pre>
6	legislative rules required.
7	(a) By August 15, 2005, the state board, after consultation
8	with the Secretary of Education and the Arts, shall promulgate
9	rules in accordance with the provisions of article three-b, chapter
10	twenty-nine-a of this code for the approval and operation of
11	teacher education programs which are an alternative to the regular
12	college or university programs for the education of teachers.
13	(a) Definitions For the purposes of this section, the
14	following terms have the meaning ascribed to them, unless the
15	context in which a term is used clearly requires a different
16	meaning:
17	(1) "Alternative program teacher certificate" means a
18	certificate issued for one year to a candidate who does not meet
19	the standard educational requirements for teacher certification;
20	(2) "Approved education provider" means a partnership between
21	one or more schools, school districts or regional educational
22	service agencies and an institution of higher education in this
23	state with a regionally accredited program for the education of
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professional educators approved by the state board or an entity affiliated with such an institution's approved program, that has submitted to the state board a plan and agreement between the organizations for the delivery of an alternative program in accordance with this section, and the state board has approved the plan and agreement; and

7 <u>(3) "Area of critical need and shortage" means an opening in</u> 8 <u>an established, existing or newly-created position which has been</u> 9 <u>posted at least two times in accordance with section seven-a,</u> 10 <u>article four of this chapter and for which no fully-qualified</u> 11 <u>applicant has been employed.</u>

12 (b) Establishment of alternative teacher education programs. -- After consultation with the Secretary of Education and the Arts 13 14 and the Chancellor of the Higher Education Policy Commission, the 15 state board shall promulgate a legislative rule or rules in 16 accordance with article three-b, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to implement the provisions of this section. The proposed rule or 17 rules shall be submitted to the Legislative Oversight Commission on 18 19 Education Accountability for review prior to adoption. The rule or 20 rules shall include, but are not limited to, the following issues: 21 (1) Separate procedures for the approval and operation of each 22 of the alternative teacher education programs as provided in this 23 section:

1	(A) These programs are an alternative to the regular college
2	or university programs for the education of teachers and may only
3	be offered by approved education providers; and
4	(B) Each program is separate from other programs established
5	by this section;
6	(2) Procedures for approving an approved education provider as
7	defined in this section. Approval is required prior to
8	implementation the provider's program leading to certification to
9	teach in the public schools of this state;
10	(3) Provisions for setting tuition charges to offset program
11	<u>costs;</u>
12	(4) The recommendation to rehire an alternative education
13	program teacher, is subject to satisfactory progress in the
14	applicable alternative education program by the holder of the
15	alternative program certificate; and
16	(5) When making decisions affecting the hiring of a teacher
17	authorized to teach under an alternative program certificate as
18	provided in this section, a county board shall give preference to
19	applicants who hold a valid West Virginia professional teaching
20	certificate.
21	(c) Alternative teacher education program
22	(1) To participate in an approved alternative teacher
23	education program, the candidate must hold an alternative program

teacher certificate issued by the <u>state</u> superintendent and endorsed for the instructional field in which the candidate seeks certification. An alternative program teacher certificate is a certificate issued for one year to a candidate who does not meet the standard educational requirements for certification.

6 <u>(2)</u> The certificate may be renewed no more than two times 7 <u>twice and</u> no individual may hold an alternative program teacher 8 certificate for a period exceeding three years. The alternative 9 program teacher certificate shall be considered <u>is equivalent to</u> a 10 professional teaching certificate for the purpose of the issuance 11 <u>of issuing</u> a continuing contract.

12 <u>(3)</u> To be eligible for an alternative program teacher 13 certificate, an applicant shall <u>meet the following criteria:</u>

14 (1) (A) Possess at least a bachelor's degree from a regionally 15 accredited institution of higher education in a discipline taught 16 in the public schools, except that the rules established by the 17 board pursuant to subsection (b) of this section may exempt from 18 this requirement candidates for alternative certification to teach 19 in selected vocational and technical areas who have at least ten 20 years' experience in the subject field; from this requirement

(2) (B) Pass an appropriate state board approved the same
 basic skills and subject matter test or tests required by the state
 board for traditional program candidates to become certified in the

1 area for which licensure is being sought;

2	(3) <u>(C)</u> Be a citizen of the <u>Hold</u> United States <u>citizenship;</u> be
3	of good moral character and <u>be</u> physically, mentally and emotionally
4	qualified to perform the duties of a teacher; and have attained
5	(D) Attain the age of eighteen years on or before October 1 of
6	the year in which the alternative program teacher certificate is
7	issued;
8	(4) <u>(E)</u> Have been offered <u>Receive a formal offer of</u> employment
9	<u>in an area of critical need and shortage</u> by <u>from</u> a county board
10	superintendent; in an area of critical need and shortage and
11	(5) <u>(F)</u> Qualify <u>for employment</u> following a criminal history
12	check pursuant to section ten of this article; and
13	(G) In the case of an applicant pursuing certification to
14	teach American Sign Language, in lieu of paragraphs (A) and (B) of
15	this subdivision, the applicant shall possess at least a bachelor's
16	degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education
17	and pass an appropriate state board approved test or tests
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19	demonstrating the applicant's proficiency in American Sign
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	Language.
20	Language. (4) Persons <u>A person</u> who satisfy <u>satisfies</u> the requirements

1 Virginia.

2 (b) The rules adopted by the board shall include provisions for the approval of alternative teacher education programs which 3 may be offered by schools, school districts, consortia of schools, 4 or regional educational service agency and for the setting of 5 tuition charges to offset the program costs. An approved 6 alternative teacher education program shall be in effect for a 7 8 school, school district, consortium of schools or regional 9 educational service agency before an alternative program teacher 10 may be employed in that school, school district, consortium of 11 schools or regional educational service agency.

12 <u>(5)</u> An approved alternative program shall provide provides 13 essential knowledge and skills to alternative program teachers 14 through the following phases of training:

(1) (A) Instruction. -- The alternative preparation program 15 16 shall provide a minimum of eighteen semester hours of instruction in the areas of student assessment; development and learning; 17 18 curriculum; classroom management; the use of educational computers and other technology; and special education and diversity. All 19 20 programs shall contain a minimum of three semester hours of 21 instruction in special education and diversity out of the minimum 22 eighteen required semester hours. Subject to the approval of the 23 state board, an approved education provider may provide instruction

equivalent to the eighteen semester hours required by this
paragraph through nontraditional methods, including, but not
limited to, methods such as a series of modules covering the
various topics, electronically delivered instruction, summer
sessions, professional development and job-embedded mentoring.

(2) (B) Phase I. -- Phase I shall consist consists of a period 6 7 of intensive, on-the-job supervision by an assigned mentor and the school administrator for a period of not less fewer than two weeks 8 and no more than four weeks. The assigned mentor shall meet the 9 10 requirements for a beginning teacher internship mentor set forth in 11 section two-b of this article and shall be paid the stipend authorized pursuant to that section. During this time, the teacher 12 13 The state board shall provide, in its rule for the approval and 14 operation of this program, requirements for the frequency and 15 duration of time periods for the person holding an alternative 16 certificate to observe in the classroom of the mentor. The person 17 holding an alternative certificate shall be observed daily by the 18 mentor or the school administrator during this phase. This phase shall include includes an orientation to the policies, organization 19 20 and curriculum of the employing district. The alternative program 21 teacher shall begin to receive formal instruction in those areas listed in subdivision (1) paragraph (A) of this subsection 22 23 subdivision.

1 (3) (C) Phase II. -- Phase II shall consist consists of a period of intensive, on-the-job supervision beginning the first day 2 3 following the completion of Phase I and continuing for a period of 4 at least ten weeks. During Phase II, the alternative program teacher shall be is visited and critiqued no less than at least one 5 6 time per week by members of a professional support team, as defined 7 in subsection © subdivision (6) of this section subsection, and 8 shall be is observed and formally evaluated by the appropriately 9 certified members of the team at the end of five weeks and again at 10 the end of ten weeks by the appropriately certified members of the 11 team at five-week intervals until the completion of this phase. At the end of the ten-week period completion of this phase, the 12 13 alternative program teacher shall receive a formal written progress 14 report from the chairperson of the support team evaluation by the 15 principal. The alternative program teacher shall continue to 16 receive formal instruction in those areas listed above under in paragraph (A), subdivision (1) of this subsection subdivision. 17

18 (4) (D) Phase III. -- Phase III shall consist consists of an 19 additional period of continued supervision and evaluation of no 20 less fewer than twenty weeks duration. The professional support 21 team will determine determines the requirements of this phase, with 22 but those requirements shall include at least one formal evaluation 23 being conducted at the completion of the phase by the principal.

1 The alternative program teacher shall continue to receive formal 2 instruction in those areas listed above in paragraph (A) 3 subdivision (1) of this subsection subdivision, and receive shall 4 <u>be given</u> opportunities to observe the teaching of experienced 5 colleagues.

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🖶 <u>(6) Professional support team. --</u>

7 (A) Training and supervision of alternative program teachers shall be are provided by a professional support team comprised of 8 a school principal, or his or her designee, an experienced 9 10 classroom teacher who satisfies the requirements for mentor for the 11 Beginning Educator Internship as specified in pursuant to section two-b of this article, a college or university education faculty 12 13 member a nonpublic education representative of the approved 14 education provider, and a curriculum supervisor or other central 15 office administrator with certification and training relevant to 16 the training and supervision of the alternative program candidate. 17 (B) Districts or schools which do not employ curriculum 18 supervisors or have been unable to establish a relationship with a college or university shall provide for comparable expertise on the 19

20 team.

<u>(C)</u> The school principal, <u>or his or her designee</u>, shall serve
 <u>serves</u> as chairperson of the team.

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(D) The duration of each of the three phases of the program

1 specified in paragraphs (B), (C) and (D), subdivision (5) of this
2 subsection, in excess of the minimum durations provided in those
3 paragraphs, shall be determined by the professional support team
4 within guidelines provided by the state board in its rule for the
5 approval and operation of this program.

6 (E) In addition to other duties assigned to it under this 7 section and section one-b of this article, the approved education provider shall submit a written evaluation of the alternative 8 program teacher to the county superintendent. 9 The written 10 evaluation shall be in a form specified by the countv 11 superintendent and submitted on a date specified by the county superintendent that is prior to the first Monday of May. 12 The 13 evaluation shall report the progress of the alternative program 14 teacher toward meeting the academic and performance requirements of 15 the program.

16 (d) (F) The training for professional support team members shall may be coordinated and provided by the Center for 17 Professional Development in coordination with the school district, 18 19 consortium of schools, regional educational service agency, and 20 institution of higher education approved education provider or any combination of these agencies as set forth in the plan approved by 21 22 the state board pursuant to subsection (e) subdivision (8) of this 23 section.

(7) In lieu of and as an alternative to the professional 1 2 support team specified in subdivision (6) of this section and its specific duties throughout the program phases as set forth in 3 subdivision (5) of this section, a school or school district that 4 5 has implemented a comprehensive beginning teacher induction program 6 may, subject to the approval of the state board, provide for the training and supervision of alternative program teachers using a 7 structure consistent with the structure implemented for the 8 support, supervision and mentoring of beginning teachers: 9 Provided, That all final decisions on the progress of the 10 alternative program teacher and recommendations upon program 11 completion shall rest with the principal. 12

13 (e) (8) A school, school district, consortium of schools, or 14 regional educational service agency <u>An approved education provider</u> 15 seeking to employ <u>approval for</u> an alternative <u>certification</u> program 16 teacher must <u>shall</u> submit a plan to the state board. and receive 17 approval

18 (A) No alternative certification program may be implemented 19 prior to receiving state board approval.

20 <u>(B)</u> Each plan shall describe how the proposed training program 21 will accomplish the key elements of an alternative program for the 22 education of teachers as set forth in this section. Each school, 23 school district, consortium of schools or regional educational 1 service agency shall show evidence in its plan of having sought 2 joint sponsorship of their training program with institutions of 3 higher education.

4 (f) The state board shall promulgate a rule in accordance with
5 article three-b, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code for the
6 approval and operation of alternative education programs to prepare
7 highly qualified special education teachers that

8 (d) Alternative highly qualified special education teacher
 9 education program. --

10 (1) These programs are separate from the programs established 11 under the other provisions of this section and are applicable only 12 to teachers who have at least a bachelor's degree in a program for 13 the preparation of teachers from a regionally accredited 14 institution of higher education.

15 <u>(2)</u> These programs are subject to the other provisions of this 16 section only to the extent specifically provided for in the rule.

17 <u>(3)</u> These programs may be an alternative to the regular 18 college and university programs for the education of special 19 education teachers and also may address the content area 20 preparation of certified special education teachers.

21 <u>(4)</u> The programs shall incorporate professional development to 22 the maximum extent possible to help teachers who are currently 23 certified in special education to obtain the required content area

1 preparation.

2 (5) Participation in an alternative education program pursuant to this subsection shall may not affect any rights, privileges or 3 benefits to which the participant otherwise would otherwise be 4 entitled as a regular employee nor does it and may not alter any 5 rights, privileges or benefits of participants on continuing 6 contract status. The state board shall report to the Legislative 7 8 Oversight Commission on Education Accountability on the programs 9 authorized under this subsection during the July, 2005, interim 10 meetings or as soon thereafter as practical prior to implementation 11 of the programs.

12 (g) The state board shall promulgate a rule in accordance with 13 article three-b, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code for the 14 approval and operation of alternative education programs to prepare 15 highly qualified special education teachers that

(e) Additional alternative education program to prepare highly qualified special education teachers. --

18 <u>(1) These programs</u> are separate from the programs established 19 under the other provisions of this section and are applicable only 20 to persons who hold a bachelor's degree from a regionally 21 accredited institution of higher education.

22 <u>(2)</u> These programs are subject to the other provisions of this 23 section only to the extent specifically provided for in this the

1 rule.

2 (3) These programs may be an alternative to the regular college and university programs for the education of special 3 education teachers and also may address the content area 4 preparation of such these persons. The state board shall report to 5 the Legislative Oversight Commission on Education Accountability on 6 the programs authorized under this subsection during the July, 7 8 2005, interim meetings or as soon thereafter as practical prior to 9 implementation of the programs.

10 (h) For the purposes of this section, "area of critical need 11 and shortage" means an opening in an established, existing or newly 12 created position which has been posted in accordance with the 13 provisions of section seven-a, article four of this chapter, and 14 for which no fully qualified applicant has been employed.

(I) The recommendation to rehire an alternative education program teacher, pursuant to section eight-a, article two of this chapter is subject to the position being posted and no fully qualified applicant being employed: *Provided*, That this provision does not apply to teachers who hold a valid West Virginia professional teaching certificate and who are employed under a program operated pursuant to subsection (f).

(j) When making decisions affecting the hiring of an
 alternative program teacher under the provisions of this section,

a county board shall give preference to applicants who hold a valid
 West Virginia professional teaching certificate.

§18A-3-1b. Recommendation for certification of alternative program teachers.

At the conclusion of an alternative teacher education program, 5 6 the principal chairperson of the professional support team, 7 approved education provider shall prepare a comprehensive evaluation report on the alternative program teacher's performance. 8 9 This report shall be submitted directly to the State Superintendent 10 of Schools and shall contain a recommendation as to whether or not a professional certificate should be issued to the alternative 11 12 program teacher. The report shall be made on standard forms 13 developed by the State Superintendent.

14 The comprehensive evaluation report shall include one of the 15 following recommendations:

16 (1) Approved: Recommends issuance of a professional 17 certificate;

18 (2) Insufficient: Recommends that a professional certificate 19 not be issued but that the candidate be allowed to seek reentry on 20 one or more occasions in the future into an approved alternative 21 teacher education program; or

(3) Disapproved: Recommends that a professional certificatenot be issued and that the candidate not be allowed to enter into

1 another approved alternative teacher education program in this
2 state, but shall not be prohibited from pursuing teacher
3 certification through other approved programs for the education of
4 teachers in this state.

5 The chairperson of the professional support team approved education provider shall provide the alternative program teacher 6 with a copy of the alternative program teacher's written evaluation 7 8 report and certification recommendation before submitting it to the 9 state superintendent. If the alternative program teacher disagrees 10 with the chairperson's provider's recommendation, the alternative 11 program teacher may, within fifteen days of receipt, request an 12 appeal in accordance with the certification appeals process 13 established by the State Board of Education.
