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11	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$16-50-2$, $\$16-50-3$ and $\$16-50-4$ of the
12	Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to amend said
13	code by adding thereto a new section, designated \$16-50-3a,
14	all relating to permitting unlicensed personnel to administer
15	or assist with administration of medications in certain
16	circumstances; defining terms; providing exemptions from
17	licensure; and limitation of liability for registered nurses.
18	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
19	That $\$16-50-2$, $\$16-50-3$ and $\$16-50-4$ of the Code of West
20	Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; and that said
21	code be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §16-50-
22	3a, all to read as follows:
23	ARTICLE 50. MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION BY UNLICENSED PERSONNEL.
2 /	S16-50-2 Definitions

- 1 As used in this article, unless a different meaning appears
- 2 from the context, the following definitions apply:
- 3 (a) "Administration of medication" means:
- 4 (1) Assisting a person in the ingestion, application or
- 5 inhalation of medications, including prescription drugs, or in the
- 6 use of universal precautions or rectal or vaginal insertion of
- 7 medication, according to the legibly written or printed directions
- 8 of the attending physician or authorized practitioner, or as
- 9 written on the prescription label; and
- 10 (2) Making a written record of such assistance with regard to
- 11 each medication administered, including the time, route and amount
- 12 taken. Provided, That However, for purposes of this article,
- 13 "administration" does not include judgment, evaluation,
- 14 assessments, injections of medication, monitoring of medication or
- 15 self-administration of medications, including prescription drugs
- 16 and self-injection of medication by the resident.
- 17 (b) "Authorizing agency" means the department's office of
- 18 Health Facility Licensure and Certification.
- 19 (c) "Department" means the Department of Health and Human
- 20 Resources.
- 21 (d) "Facility" means an ICF/ID, a personal care home,
- 22 residential board and care home, behavioral health group home,
- 23 private residence in which health care services are provided under
- 24 the supervision of a registered nurse or an adult family care home

- 1 that is licensed by or approved by the department.
- 2 (e) "Facility staff member" means an individual employed by a
- 3 facility but does not include a health care professional acting
- 4 within the scope of a professional license or certificate.
- 5 (f) "Health care professional" means a medical doctor or
- 6 doctor of osteopathy, a podiatrist, registered nurse, practical
- 7 nurse, registered nurse practitioner, physician's assistant,
- 8 dentist, optometrist or respiratory care professional licensed
- 9 under chapter thirty of this code.
- 10 (g) "ICF/ID" means an intermediate care facility for
- 11 individuals with an intellectual disability which is certified by
- 12 the department.
- (h) "Location of medication administration" means a facility
- 14 or location where the resident requires administration of
- 15 medication or assistance in taking medications.
- 16 (h) (I) "Medication" means a drug, as defined in section one
- 17 hundred one, article one, chapter sixty-a of this code, which has
- 18 been prescribed by a duly authorized health care professional to be
- 19 ingested through the mouth, applied to the outer skin, eye or ear,
- 20 or applied through nose drops, vaginal or rectal suppositories.
- 21 (I) (j) "Registered professional nurse" means a person who
- 22 holds a valid license pursuant to article seven, chapter thirty of
- 23 this code.
- 24 $\frac{(j)}{(k)}$ "Resident" means a resident of a facility.

- 1 (k) (1) "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Department of 2 Health and Human Resources or his or her designee.
- (1) (m) "Self-administration of medication" means the act of 4 a resident, who is independently capable of reading and 5 understanding the labels of drugs ordered by a physician, in 6 opening and accessing prepackaged drug containers, accurately 7 identifying and taking the correct dosage of the drugs as ordered 8 by the physician, at the correct time and under the correct 9 circumstances.
- (n) "Self-administration of medication with assistance" means

 11 assisting residents who are otherwise able to self administer their

 12 own medications except their physical disabilities prevent them

 13 from completing one or more steps in the process.
- (m) (o) "Supervision of self-administration of medication"

 15 means a personal service which includes reminding residents to take

 16 medications, opening medication containers for residents, reading

 17 the medication label to residents, observing residents while they

 18 take medication, checking the self administered dosage against the

 19 label on the container and reassuring residents that they have

 20 obtained and are taking the dosage as prescribed.
- 21 §16-50-3. Administration of medications in facilities.
- (a) The secretary is authorized to establish and implement a program for the administration of medications in facilities in locations of medication administration where the resident requires

- 1 administration of or assistance in taking medications. The program
- 2 shall be developed and conducted in cooperation with the
- 3 appropriate agencies, advisory bodies and boards.
- 4 (b) Administration of medication pursuant to this article
- 5 shall be performed only by:
- 6 (1) Registered professional nurses;
- 7 (2) Other licensed health care professionals; or
- 8 (3) Facility staff members who have been trained and retrained
- 9 every two years and who are subject to the supervision of and
- 10 approval by a registered professional nurse.
- 11 (c) Subsequent to assessing the health status of an individual
- 12 resident, a registered professional nurse, in collaboration with
- 13 the resident's attending physician and the facility staff member,
- 14 may recommend that the facility authorize a facility staff member
- 15 to administer medication if the staff member:
- 16 (1) Has been trained pursuant to the requirements of this
- 17 article;
- 18 (2) Is considered by the registered professional nurse to be
- 19 competent;
- 20 (3) Consults with the registered professional nurse or
- 21 attending physician on a regular basis; and
- 22 (4) Is monitored or supervised by the registered professional
- 23 nurse.
- 24 (d) Nothing in this article may be construed to prohibit any

- 1 facility staff member from administering medications or providing
- 2 any other prudent emergency assistance to aid any person who is in
- 3 acute physical distress or requires emergency assistance.
- 4 (e) Supervision of self-administration of medication by
- 5 facility staff members who are not licensed health care
- 6 professionals may be permitted in certain circumstances, when the
- 7 substantial purpose of the setting is other than the provision of
- 8 health care.

9 §16-50-3a. Limitation of registered nurse's liability.

- 10 A registered nurse who delegates the provisions of nursing
- 11 care to another pursuant to this article shall not be subject to an
- 12 action for civil damages for the performance of the person to whom
- 13 nursing care is delegated unless the person is acting pursuant to
- 14 specific instructions from the registered nurse.

15 §16-50-4. Exemption from licensure; statutory construction.

- 16 (a) Any individual who is not otherwise authorized by law to
- 17 administer medication may administer medication in a facility
- 18 locations covered by this article if he or she meets the
- 19 requirements and provisions of this article. Any person who
- 20 administers medication pursuant to the provisions of this article
- 21 shall be exempt from the licensing requirements of chapter thirty
- 22 of this code.
- 23 (b) All licensed health care professionals as defined in this
- 24 article remain subject to the provisions of their respective

- 1 licensing laws.
- 2 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
- 3 contrary, the provisions of this article shall not be construed to
- 4 violate or be in conflict with any of the provisions of articles
- 5 seven or seven-a, chapter thirty of this code.
- 6 (d) Residents participating in a department-approved self-
- 7 direction program may choose to self direct their medication
- 8 administration by those personnel that they hire and train to
- 9 perform activities of daily living, including medication
- 10 administration.
- 11 (e) Any parent or guardian may administer medication to his or
- 12 her adult or minor child regardless of whether or not the parent or
- 13 guardian receives compensation for caring for said child.
