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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$30-14-3$ of the Code of West Virginia,	
11	1931, as amended, relating to increasing the membership of the	
12	West Virginia Board of Osteopathy by adding an additional	
13	licensed osteopathic physician and a licensed osteopathic	
14	physician assistant.	
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:	
16	That §30-14-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,	
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:	
18	ARTICLE 14. OSTEOPATHIC PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS.	
19	§30-14-3. Board of osteopathy.	
20	There shall be <u>is</u> a board of osteopathy, known as the "West	
21	Virginia Board of Osteopathy" composed of five seven members.	
22	Three Four of the members shall be licensed osteopathic physicians	
23	and surgeons. These members shall be appointed by the Governor by	
24	and with the \underline{advice} and $\underline{consent}$ of the Senate from a list of \underline{six}	
25	\underline{two} or more names \underline{per} member position as recommended by the West	
26	Virginia Osteopathic Society, Incorporated Medical Association.	

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1 One of the members shall be a licensed osteopathic physician
2 assistant. This member shall be appointed by the Governor by and
3 with the advice and consent of the Senate from list of two or more
4 names recommended by the West Virginia Association of Physician
5 Assistants. Each such member of the board shall of these members
6 must have been a resident of and engaged in the practice of his or
7 her profession in this state for a period of at least five years
8 immediately preceding his or her appointment. The lay Two citizen
9 members of the board shall be appointed by the Governor by and with
10 the advice and consent of the Senate.

The members of the board shall be appointed for a term of 11 12 office of three years. The members of the board in office on the 13 effective date this article takes effect of the amendment made to 14 this section during the 2012 regular session of the Legislature 15 shall, unless sooner removed, continue to serve until their 16 respective terms expire and until their successors have been 17 appointed and have qualified. Within sixty days of the effective 18 date of the amendment made to this section during the 2012 regular 19 session of the Legislature the Governor shall appoint the two 20 additional members provided by the amendment. On or before July 1, 21 of each year, the Governor shall appoint one member to serve for a 22 term of three years commencing on said first day of July 1; and any 23 member shall be is eligible for reappointment. When a vacancy in 24 the membership of the board occurs for any cause other than the 25 expiration of a term, the Governor shall appoint a successor as a 26 member of the board to fill the unexpired portion of the term of

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1 office of the member whose office has been vacated.

Each member of the board, excluding lay <u>citizen</u> members, shall take, in addition to the oath of office provided for in article IV, esction 5 of the Constitution of this state, an oath that he <u>or she</u> has been engaged in the practice of his <u>or her</u> profession in this state for at least five years immediately preceding his <u>or her</u> prointment.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to enhance the licensure and regulatory ability of the West Virginia Board of Osteopathy to appropriately fulfill its statutory responsibility. The bill increases the membership of the board by adding an additional licensed osteopathic physician and a licensed osteopathic physician assistant,
