If At 7 any time after notice is given, and before or on the day so fixed 8 for making appointments, the chairman of each of the committees 9 shall designate, in writing, a member of such his or her party as 10 ballot commissioner. Each designee shall be appointed if he or she 11 meets the qualifications of a voter. Ballot commissioners shall be 12 appointed between the fifteenth and thirtieth days of January 15 13 and 30, in each year in which a general election is to be held, for 14 a term of two years beginning on February 1 next ensuing. They 15 shall perform the duties of ballot commissioners at all general, 16 special and primary elections held in the county or any magisterial 17 district thereof during their term of office. A vacancy shall be 18 filled in the same manner as an original appointment, but immediate 19 notice of a vacancy shall, where necessary, be deemed compliance 20 with the five-day notice provision.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to ensure that county executive committees, not the county clerk have control of designating the persons who serve as ballot commissioner.
