| 10 | A BILL to repeal $$16-42-7$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as |
| 11 | amended; and to amend and reenact \$16-42-3 of said code, all |
| 12 | relating to the Comprehensive Behavioral Health Commission, |
| 13 | its membership and the membership of the Advisory Board to the |
| 14 | Commission; and to repeal the termination of the commission. |
| 15 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia: |
| 16 | That \$16-42-7 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, |
| 17 | be repealed; and that \$16-42-3 of said code be amended and |
| 18 | reenacted, all to read as follows: |
| 19 | ARTICLE 42. COMPREHENSIVE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH COMMISSION. |
| 20 | §16-42-3. Comprehensive Behavioral Health Commission. |
| 21 | (a) Effective July 1, 2011, the Comprehensive Behavioral |
| 22 | Health Commission is reestablished to continue the study of the |
| 23 | current behavioral health system of care, including services to |
| 24 | adults and children, substance abuse and domestic violence when |

- 1 those conditions have an effect upon or are impacted by the system.
- 2 (b) The commission consists of:
- 3 (1) A representative of the circuit and family court system,
- 4 appointed by the Chief Justice of the West Virginia Supreme Court
- 5 of Appeals;
- 6 (2) A representative of the Commissioner of the Division of 7 Corrections:
- 8 (3) The Commissioner of the Bureau of Senior Services or a 9 designee;
- 10 (4) The Secretary of the Department of Health and Human
- 11 Resources or a designee, who is a nonvoting member;
- 12 (5) The Commissioner of the Bureau for Behavioral Health and
- 13 Health Facilities or a designee, who is a nonvoting member;
- 14 (6) The Commissioner of the Bureau for Children and Families
- 15 or a designee, who is a nonvoting member;
- 16 (7) The Executive Director of the West Virginia Chapter of the
- 17 National Alliance on Mental Illness or a designee; An individual
- 18 who represents a behavioral health consumer's organization
- 19 appointed by the Governor from a list of three recommendations
- 20 submitted by the commission;
- 21 (8) The Chancellor for Higher Education or a designee, who is
- 22 a nonvoting member;
- 23 (9) One physician with a specialty in psychiatry appointed by
- 24 the Governor from a list provided by the West Virginia Medical

- 1 Association;
- 2 (10) One physician with a specialty in child psychiatry,
- 3 appointed by the Governor from a list of names provided by the West
- 4 Virginia Medical Association;
- 5 (11) One member of the advisory board, selected by the
- 6 advisory board, who shall serve as the vice chairperson of the
- 7 commission;
- 8 (12) The director of the Division of Rehabilitative Services
- 9 or his or her designee;
- 10 (13) The executive director of a behavioral health consumer's
- 11 organization or his or her designee;
- 12 <u>(14) The director of the West Virginia Coalition Against</u>
- 13 Domestic Violence or his or her designee
- $\frac{(12)}{(15)}$ One member of the House of Delegates, who is a
- 15 nonvoting member, appointed by the speaker; and
- (13) (16) One member of the Senate, who is a nonvoting member,
- 17 appointed by the president.
- 18 (c) The commission shall meet at times and places as it finds
- 19 necessary and shall be staffed by the Bureau for Behavioral Health
- 20 and Health Facilities.
- 21 (d) The commission shall elect a chairperson from those who
- 22 are appointed. The chairperson's term shall be no longer than two
- 23 consecutive years whereupon the chairperson is to be replaced by a
- 24 vote of the membership.

- 1 (e) The commission shall add or delete additional members of
- 2 the advisory board at the time when it is apparent that certain
- 3 expertise is needed and the members of the commission so decide.
- (e) (f) Effective July 1, 2011, July 1,2012, the Comprehensive
- 5 Behavioral Health Commission Advisory Board is reestablished to
- 6 serve in a consulting role to the commission with the following
- 7 members appointed by the Governor:
- 8 (1) One member from a list of three candidates provided by the
- 9 West Virginia Chapter of the National Association of Social
- 10 Workers;
- 11 (2) One member from a list of three candidates provided by the
- 12 West Virginia Hospital Association;
- 13 (3) One member who is a psychologist from a list of three
- 14 candidates provided by the West Virginia Psychological Association;
- 15 (4) One citizen member representative from each medical school
- 16 affiliated with some aspect of behavioral health from a list of two
- 17 nominees from each medical school three candidates provided by the
- 18 Dean of West Virginia University School of Medicine, the Dean of
- 19 Marshall University School of Medicine and the Dean of the West
- 20 Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine;
- 21 (5) One member who is an The executive director of a federally
- 22 qualified health center in West Virginia of the Primary Care
- 23 Association or his or her designee;
- 24 (6) One member who is the chief executive officer of a

- 1 comprehensive behavioral health center;
- 2 (7) Two members who are the chairperson or the chief executive
- 3 officer of a not-for-profit corporation with its principal
- 4 headquarters in West Virginia, that provides residential or
- 5 nonresidential care or treatment for children; and
- 6 (8) One member from a list of three candidates provided by the
- 7 Council of Churches.
- 8 (9) A consumer of behavioral health services to be selected by
- 9 the commission.
- 10 (10) A child advocate to be selected by the commission from
- 11 suggestions by FAST (Family Advocacy, Support and Training).
- 12 (11) A representative of the West Virginia Coalition Against
- 13 Domestic Violence to be selected by the commission.
- 14 (12) One representative of the county probation program from
- 15 a list of three candidates provided to the Governor by the Supreme
- 16 Court of Appeals;
- 17 $\frac{(f)(g)}{(f)}$ Those persons serving on the commission and the
- 18 advisory board on July 1, 2011, may continue serving on the
- 19 reestablished commission and advisory board and the person so
- 20 designated as chairperson of the commission shall remain as
- 21 chairperson until an election occurs as provided in this section.
- 22 (g) (h) Each member of the commission and advisory board is
- 23 entitled to receive compensation and expense reimbursement for
- 24 attending official meetings or engaging in official duties not to

- 1 exceed the amount paid to members of the Legislature for their
- 2 interim duties as recommended by the citizens legislative
- 3 compensation commission and authorized by law. A commission member
- 4 may not receive compensation for travel days that are not on the
- 5 same day as the official meeting or official duties.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is amend the membership of the Comprehensive Behavioral Health Commission, and the membership of the Advisory Board to the Commission.
