1 shall be construed to require the department to hire additional 2 child protective service workers at any time if the department 3 determines that funds are not available for such workers. 4 Additionally, the secretary shall prepare a plan to allow the 5 department to progressively reduce caseload standards in West 6 Virginia for child protective services workers, which if adopted by 7 the Legislature during the 1995 regular session, shall require 8 implementation no later than July 1, 1996, with said plan to be 9 submitted to the Joint Committee on Government and Finance by 10 September 30, 1994, and a final report to be submitted to the 11 Legislature by January 1, 1995. Additionally, the secretary shall 12 revise the department's plan for progressively reducing caseload 13 standards in West Virginia for child protective services workers in 14 order to further reduce caseloads. If this revised plan is adopted 15 by the Legislature during the 2013 regular session, the secretary 16 shall implement the plan no later than July 1, 2014. The secretary 17 shall submit the revised plan to the Joint Committee on Government 18 and Finance by September, 2012, and a final report shall be 19 submitted to the Legislature by January 1, 2013.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to increase the number of child protective service workers and to reduce the caseloads of child protective service workers.
