17 §9-5-22. Required coverage for colorectal cancer examination and

(a) Notwithstanding any provision of any policy, provision, contract, plan or agreement applicable to this article, coverage shall be provided for colorectal cancer examinations and laboratory testing for a nonsymptomatic person fifty years of age or older or a symptomatic person under fifty years of age when performed for colorectal cancer screening or diagnostic purposes at the direction

1 of a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery by the West 2 Virginia Board of Medicine. The tests include an annual fecal 3 occult blood test, a flexible sigmoidoscopy repeated every five 4 years, a colonoscopy repeated every ten years, a double contrast 5 barium enema repeated every five years or other test and testing 6 procedure generally accepted by the medical community.

7 (b) A symptomatic person is defined as:

8 (1) An individual who experiences a change in bowel habits, 9 rectal bleeding or stomach cramps that are persistent; or

10 (2) An individual who poses a higher than average risk for 11 colorectal cancer because he or she has had colorectal cancer or 12 polyps, inflammatory bowel disease or an immediate family history 13 of such conditions.

14 (c) The same deductibles, coinsurance, network restrictions 15 and other limitations for covered services found in the policy, 16 provision, contract, plan or agreement of the covered person may 17 apply to colorectal cancer examinations and laboratory testing.

The tests are as follows: An include 11 an annual fecal occult blood test, a flexible sigmoidoscopy 12 repeated every five years, a colonoscopy repeated every ten years, 13 and a double contrast barium enema repeated every five years or 14 other test or testing procedure generally accepted by the medical 15 community.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require health insurance coverage for colorectal cancer examination and testing for individuals fifty years of age or older.
