14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That §22-1-7 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 1. DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.
18	§22-1-7. Offices and divisions within department.
19	(a) Consistent with the provisions of this article, the
20	secretary shall, at a minimum, maintain the following offices $\underline{\text{and}}$
21	<u>divisions</u> within the <u>division</u> <u>department:</u>
22	(1) The Office of Abandoned Mine Lands and Reclamation, which
23	is charged, at a minimum, with administering and enforcing, under

- 1 the supervision of the director secretary, the provisions of 2 article two of this chapter;
- 3 (2) The Division of Mining and Reclamation, which is charged,
- 4 at a minimum, with administering and enforcing, under the
- 5 supervision of the director secretary, the provisions of articles
- 6 three and four of this chapter;
- 7 (3) The Division of Air Quality, which is charged, at a
- 8 minimum, with administering and enforcing, under the supervision of
- 9 the director secretary, the provisions of article five of this
- 10 chapter;
- 11 (4) The Office of Oil and Gas, which is charged, at a minimum,
- 12 with administering and enforcing, under the supervision of the
- 13 director secretary, the provisions of articles six, seven, eight,
- 14 nine and ten of this chapter;
- 15 (5) The Division of Water and Waste Management, which is
- 16 charged, at a minimum, with administering and enforcing, under the

- 20 (6) The Office of Explosives and Blasting, which is charged,
- 21 at a minimum, with administering and enforcing, under the
- 22 supervision of the director secretary, the provisions of article
- 23 three-a of this chapter.
- 24 (b) In addition to the offices and divisions provided in

- 1 subsection (a) of this section, the secretary shall maintain an
- 2 Office of Internal Auditing. The office shall be staffed by an
- 3 auditor and other necessary support staff. The auditor is required
- 4 to have at least five years of experience auditing governmental
- 5 agencies. The auditor and all support staff within the office are
- 6 required to be nonexempt civil service employees. The auditor is
- 7 required to be a full-time employee. The auditor's primary
- 8 responsibility is to conduct a continuous audit and analysis of the
- 9 internal controls of the department.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require the Department of Environmental Protection to maintain an Office of Internal Auditing.
