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10	A BILL to amend and reenact §18A-3A-2 of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to authorizing certain public
12	teachers to attend a conference at the West Virginia
13	Sesquicentennial Celebration in 2013.
14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That \$18A-3A-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 3A. CENTER FOR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT.
18	§18A-3A-2. Professional development project.
19	Subject to the provisions of section twenty-three-a, article
20	two, chapter eighteen of this code, through this project, the
21	Center <u>for Professional Development</u> shall:
22	(1) Identify, coordinate, arrange and otherwise assist in the
23	delivery of professional development programs and activities that

1 help professional educators acquire the knowledge, skills,
2 attitudes, practices and other such pertinent complements deemed
3 considered essential for an individual to demonstrate appropriate
4 performance as a professional personnel person in the public
5 schools of West Virginia. The basis for such performance shall be
6 are the laws, policies and regulations adopted for the public
7 schools of West Virginia and amendments thereto. The Center also
8 may permit and encourage school personnel such as classroom aides,
9 higher education teacher education faculty and higher education
10 faculty in programs such as articulated tech prep associate degree
11 and other programs to participate in appropriate professional
12 development programs and activities with public school professional
13 educators;

- (2) Identify, coordinate, arrange and otherwise assist in the delivery of professional development programs and activities that help principals and administrators acquire knowledge, skills, attitudes and practices in academic leadership and management principals for principals and administrators and such other pertinent complements deemed considered essential for principals and administrators to demonstrate appropriate performance in the public schools of West Virginia. The basis for such the performance shall be are the laws, policies and regulations adopted for the public schools of West Virginia and amendments thereto;
  - (3) Serve in a coordinating capacity to assure that the

- 2 appropriate professional performance which evolve over time in the
- 3 public school environment are appropriately reflected in the
- 4 programs approved for the education of professional personnel
- 5 including, but not limited to, advising the teacher education
- 6 programs of major statutory and policy changes in the public
- 7 schools which affect the job performance requirements of
- 8 professional educators, including principals and administrators;
- 9 (4) Provide for the routine updating of professional skills of
- 10 professional educators, including principals and administrators,
- 11 through in-service and other programs. Such routine updating may
- 12 be provided by the Center through statewide or regional institutes
- 13 which may require a registration fee;
- 14 (5) All educators who teach West Virginia Studies shall be
- 15 provided two days of professional leave for the purpose of
- 16 attending a conference within the state on the history, culture and
- 17 literature of West Virginia during the West Virginia
- 18 <u>Sesquicentennial Celebration beginning on January 1, 2013, and</u>
- 19 ending on December 31, 2013. The conference goal is to promote
- 20 West Virginia citizenship, achievements, history, culture or
- 21 literature and must have the prior approval of the West Virginia
- 22 Board of Education;
- 23 (5) (6) Provide consultation and assistance to county staff
- 24 development councils established under the provisions of section

1 eight, article three of this chapter in planning, designing,
2 coordinating, arranging for and delivering professional development
3 programs to meet the needs of the professional educators of their
4 district. From legislative appropriations to the Center for
5 Professional Development, exclusive of such amounts required for
6 the expenses of the principals academy, the Center shall, unless
7 otherwise directed by the Legislature, provide assistance in the
8 delivery of programs and activities to meet the expressed needs of
9 the school districts for professional development to help teachers,
10 principals and administrators demonstrate appropriate performance
11 based on the laws, policies and regulations adopted for the public
12 schools of West Virginia; and

(6) (7) Cooperate and coordinate with the institutions of higher education to provide professional staff development programs that satisfy some or all of the criteria necessary for currently certified professional educators to meet the requirements for an additional endorsement in an area of certification and for certification to teach in the middle school grades.

19 If the Center is not able to reach agreement with the 20 representatives of the institutions providing teacher education 21 programs on which courses will be approved for credit toward 22 additional endorsements, the state board may certify certain 23 professional staff development courses to meet criteria required by 24 the state board. This certification shall be done on a course by

1 course basis.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize certain public teachers to attend a conference at the West Virginia Sesquicentennial Celebration in 2013.
