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1 (a) The term "resident" or "residency", or any other term or 2 expression used to designate a West Virginia resident student, when 3 used to determine the rate of tuition to be charged students 4 attending community colleges and state-related and state-owned 5 institutions of higher education shall be construed to include the 6 nonresident children of graduates of any West Virginia institution 7 of higher education.

8 (b) A nonresident child of a West Virginia institution 9 graduate who qualifies as a resident, as the term is defined in 10 subsection (a) of this section, on the first day of the semester or 11 term of the college or institution, shall be charged resident 12 tuition rates.

13 (c) The provisions of this section apply at the beginning of 14 the semester or term immediately following the effective date of 15 this section.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide resident tuition rates to nonresident children of West Virginia institution graduates.
