17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
19	by adding thereto a new section, designated $$5-10D-11$, to read as
20	follows:
21	ARTICLE 10D. CONSOLIDATED PUBLIC RETIREMENT BOARD.
22	§5-10D-11. Liability of participating public employer for
23	delinquent retirement contributions; liability of
24	participating public employer's successor for
25	delinquent retirement contributions; lien for

delinquent contributions; collection by suit.

- 2 (a) A participating public employer of a public retirement
 3 system administered pursuant to this article that fails, for a
 4 period of sixty days, to pay: (i) An employee retirement
 5 contribution; (ii) an employer retirement contribution; (iii) A
 6 delinquency fee; (iv) any other fees, charges or costs related to
 7 participation in the public retirement system; or (v) any
 8 combination of subdivisions (i) through (iv) of this subsection, is
 9 liable for the amount pursuant to this article.
- (b) If a participating public employer of a public retirement system administered pursuant to this article: (i) Sells all or substantially all of its stock or assets; (ii) merges with another entity; (iii) dissolves its business; or (iv) participates, voluntarily or involuntarily, in an event which causes its business to terminate, all unpaid employee retirement contributions, employer retirement contributions, delinquency fees and other fees, charges, or costs related to participation in the public retirement system, shall be paid within thirty days of the date of applicable event identified in subdivision (i) through (iv) of this subsection.
- (c) A transferee, successor or assignee of a participating public employer of a public retirement system administered pursuant to this article is liable for the payment of all employee retirement contributions, employer retirement contributions, delinquency fees and other fees, charges or costs related to participate in the public retirement system, if the participating

- 1 public employer does not pay those amounts as provided in 2 subsection (b) of this section.
- (d) All amounts due to the Consolidated Public Retirement 4 Board from a participating public employer under this article is a 5 debt owed to the Consolidated Public Retirement Board enforceable 6 by a lien on all assets of a participating public employer, or its 7 transferee, successor or assignee within this state. 8 attaches to all assets of a participating public employer within 9 this state, or all assets of its transferee, successor or assignee 10 on the date that any amount owed to the Consolidated Public 11 Retirement Board is due. If a participating public employer, or 12 its transferee, successor or assignee fails to pay an amount owed 13 to the Consolidated Public Retirement Board under this article for 14 a period of more than sixty days, the Consolidated Public 15 Retirement Board may enforce the lien against the participating 16 public employer, or its transferee, successor or assignee by 17 instituting an action in the Circuit Court of Kanawha County. In 18 the event that the Consolidated Public Retirement Board institutes action against a participating public employer, or 20 transferee, successor or assignee to enforce a lien, 21 Consolidated Public Retirement Board is entitled to recover the 22 amounts identified in subsection (a) of this section and in 23 addition to those amounts, is entitled to recover all fees and 24 costs incurred by the Consolidated Public Retirement Board during 25 the pendency of the action, including, without limitation, accrued 26 interest, expert witness costs, filing fees, deposition costs and

1 reasonable attorney fees.

(e) If a section, subsection, subdivision, provision, clause 3 or phrase of this article or its application to any person or held unconstitutional 4 circumstance is invalid, or the 5 unconstitutionality or invalidity does not affect other sections, 6 subsections, subdivisions, provisions, clauses or phrases or 7 applications of the article, and to this end each and every 8 section, subsection, subdivision, provision, clause and phrase of 9 this article are declared to be severable. The Legislature 10 declares that it would have enacted the remaining sections, 11 subsections, subdivisions, provisions, clauses and phrases of this 12 article even if it had known that any sections, subsections, 13 subdivisions, provisions, clauses and phrases of this article would 14 be declared to be unconstitutional or invalid, and that it would 15 have enacted this article even if it had known that its application 16 to any person or circumstance would be held to be unconstitutional 17 or invalid.
