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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$22\mathchar`-11\mathchar`-6$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to establishing a water
12	quality-based effluent limit for selenium discharges from coal
13	mining operations into waters supporting aquatic life to 30
14	ppb, or .030 mg/L
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §22-11-6 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 11. WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT.
19	§22-11-6. Requirement to comply with standards of water quality
20	and effluent limitations.
21	All persons affected by rules establishing water quality
22	standards and effluent limitations shall promptly comply therewith:
23	Provided, That:
24	(1) Where necessary and proper, the secretary may specify a
25	reasonable time for persons not complying with such standards and

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1 limitations to comply therewith, and upon the expiration of any 2 such period of time, the secretary shall revoke or modify any 3 permit previously issued which authorized the discharge of treated 4 or untreated sewage, industrial wastes or other wastes into the 5 waters of this state which result in reduction of the quality of 6 such waters below the standards and limitations established 7 therefor by rules of the board or secretary;

(2) Notwithstanding any rule or permit condition to the 8 9 contrary, and except for any standard imposed under section 307 of 10 the federal Water Pollution Control Act for a toxic pollutant 11 injurious to human health, compliance with a permit issued pursuant 12 to this article shall be deemed compliance for purposes of both 13 this article and sections 301, 302, 306, 307 and 403 of the federal 14 Water Pollution Control Act. Nothing in this section, however, 15 prevents the secretary from modifying, reissuing or revoking a 16 permit during its term. The provisions of this section addressing 17 compliance with a permit are intended to apply to all existing and 18 future discharges and permits without the need for permit 19 modifications. However, should any such modification be necessary 20 under the terms of this article, then the secretary shall 21 immediately commence the process to effect such modifications; and 22 (3) The Legislature finds that there are concerns within West 23 Virginia regarding the applicability of the research underlying the 24 federal selenium criteria to a state such as West Virginia which

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1 has high precipitation rates and free-flowing streams and that the 2 alleged environmental impacts that were documented in applicable 3 federal research have not been observed in West Virginia and, 4 further, that considerable research is required to determine if 5 selenium is having an impact on West Virginia streams, to validate 6 or determine the proper testing methods for selenium and to better 7 understand the chemical reactions related to selenium mobilization 8 in water.

9 <u>(A)</u> For existing NPDES permits, the department may extend the 10 time period for achieving water quality-based effluent limits for 11 selenium discharges into waters supporting aquatic life uses to 12 July 1, 2012, upon compliance with all federally required public 13 notice requirements for such modifications, upon a finding that the 14 permittee cannot comply with its existing compliance schedule and 15 that an extension is not in violation of any state or federal laws, 16 rules or regulations.

17 (B) The West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection 18 is hereby directed to undertake a comprehensive study relating to 19 selenium and prepare a report detailing such findings and 20 submitting the report to the Joint Committee on Government and 21 Finance no later than January 1, 2010. In conducting such study, 22 the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection shall 23 consult with, among others, West Virginia University and the West 24 Virginia Water Research Institute.

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1 <u>(C) Notwithstanding any other provision in this code or in the</u> 2 <u>regulations to the contrary, there is hereby established a water</u> 3 <u>quality-based effluent limit for selenium discharges from coal</u> 4 <u>mining operations into waters supporting aquatic life of 30 ppb,</u> 5 or,.030 mg/L.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish a water quality-based effluent limit for selenium discharges from coal mining operations into waters supporting aquatic life of 30 ppb, or,.30 mg/L.
