- 5 prescriptive easement may petition the county commission to close

- 7 (1) A described right of way exists at another location on,
- 8 the aggressors real property providing access to a public road or
- 9 thoroughfare;

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is authorize county commissions to hear actions for ejectment and other actions in resolution of real property prescriptive easements or disputes.
