| 17 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:                        |
| 18 | That §24B-4-6 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,             |
| 19 | by amended and reenacted to read as follows:                              |
| 20 | ARTICLE 4. HEARINGS; BURDEN OF PROOF; ENFORCEMENT.                        |
| 21 | §24B-4-6. Penalties.  |
| 22 | (a) Any person who violates any provision of this chapter or              |

1 any valid regulation or order issued thereunder shall be <u>is</u> subject 2 to a civil penalty to be imposed by the commission not to exceed 3 \$1,000 \$200,000 for each violation for each day the violation 4 persists: *Provided*, That the maximum <u>aggregate</u> civil penalty <del>shall</del> 5 <u>may</u> not exceed \$200,000 \$2 million for any related series of 6 violations.

7 (b) Any civil penalty may be compromised by the commission. 8 In determining the amount of penalty, or the amount agreed upon in 9 compromise, <u>the commission shall consider</u> the appropriateness of 10 the penalty to the size of the business of the person charged, the 11 gravity of the violation, and the good faith of the person charged 12 in attempting to achieve compliance after notification of the 13 violation. <del>shall be considered</del> The amount of the penalty, when 14 finally determined, or the amount agreed upon in compromise, may be 15 deducted from any sums owing by the state to the person charged or 16 may be recovered in a civil action in the state courts.

17 (c) Civil penalties collected <u>by the commission</u> under this
18 section shall be <del>paid into the State Treasury</del> <u>submitted to the</u>
19 <u>Treasurer for deposit into the General Revenue Fund.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to increase civil penalties for pipeline safety violations to make West Virginia law consistent with federal law. Moreover, the bill clarifies that civil penalties collected by the Public Service Commission are to be

submitted to the Treasurer for deposit into the General Revenue Fund.
