23	§64-9-1. Board of Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses.
24	The legislative rule filed in the State Register on the
25	thirty-first day of July, two thousand twelve, authorized under the
26	authority of section five-a, article nine, chapter sixty-a, of this

1 code, modified by the Board of Examiners for Registered 2 Professional Nurses to meet the objections of the Legislative Rule-3 Making Review Committee and refiled in the State Register on the 4 seventh day of December, two thousand twelve, relating to the Board 5 of Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses (practitioner 6 requirements for accessing the West Virginia controlled substances 7 monitoring program database, <u>19 CSR 14</u>), is authorized.
