20	§18-21-2. Creation of a Special Community-Based Pilot
21	Demonstration Project to Improve Outcomes for
22	At-Risk Youth.

1 Effective July 1, 2012, and if funds are available, the 2 Secretary of the West Virginia Department of Health and Human 3 Resources shall select a community-based organization to establish 4 a special Community-Based Pilot Demonstration Project to Improve 5 Outcomes for At-Risk Youth in a specified community for a duration 6 of four years. The project will identify, implement and document 7 best practices that can be replicated in other communities. The 8 designated community-based organization shall operate the special 9 pilot project under the direction of the Secretary of the 10 Department of Health and Human Resources and shall work in 11 collaboration with the State School Superintendent, local county 12 school superintendent, Executive Director of the President or the 13 Chancellor of the Community and Technical College System, the 14 closest community and technical college and four-year college or 15 university, State Workforce Investment Division, Executive Director 16 of the West Virginia Vocational Rehabilitation Services, the local 17 juvenile court system, the local workforce investment board, the 18 Chancellor of the Higher Education Policy Commission, the Director West Virginia Division of Juvenile Services, the local 19 of 20 mental/behavior health organizations and other governmental and 21 community-based organizations.

22 §18-21-4. Organization and goals of the Community-Based Pilot
Demonstration Program.

1 operated by (a) The pilot program shall be а local 2 community-based organization under the direction the Secretary of 3 the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources and in 4 collaboration with the State School Superintendent, county school Workforce 5 superintendent, Executive Director of the State 6 Investment Division, Executive Director of WV Vocational 7 Rehabilitation Services, the local juvenile court system, the 8 Chancellor of the Higher Education Policy Commission, President 9 Chancellor of the Community and Technical College System, president 10 of the local community and technical college and four-year college 11 or university, the Director of the West Virginia Division of 12 Juvenile Services, the local mental/behavior health organizations 13 and other governmental and community-based organizations and 14 partner agencies to serve as a clearinghouse to coordinate 15 comprehensive youth and family services. The pilot project shall be 16 housed within the community and will be directed by a local 17 community-based nonprofit organization.

(b) The pilot project shall operate out of a centrally located 19 building to coordinate services to youth and their families in the 20 selected county from birth to seventeen years of age who are 21 referred by the Department of Health and Human Resources.

(c) The goal of the pilot program is to improve outcomes forat-risk youth as measured by the following metrics:

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(1) Early childhood development:

2 (A) Increase in the number of mothers receiving early prenatal3 care;

4 (B) Increase in number of mothers participating in the Right5 From the Start Program;

6 (C) Increase in the number of children screened by birth to 7 three year-old program for early development delays;

8 (D) Increase in the number of three year-olds enrolled in Head9 Start;

10 (E) Increase in the number of four year-olds enrolled in 11 preschool.

12 (2) Preschool youth and teen measures:

13 (A) Decrease in school truancy;

14 (B) Decrease in truancy hearings;

15 (C) Decrease in school suspensions;

16 (D) Decrease in school expulsions;

17 (E) Decrease in high school dropouts at a select school;

18 (F) Increase in the number of youth participating in a 19 mentoring program;

20 (G) Increase in academic performance for select students;

21 (H) Increase in number of youth participating in summer 22 employment; and

23 (I) Increase in number of youth entering postsecondary

1 education or job.

2 (3) Parent Measures:

3 (A) Increase in the number of individuals registered at the4 WorkForce West Virginia Center;

5 (B) Increase in the number of individuals enrolled in job 6 training;

7 (C) Increase in the number of individuals completing job 8 training with a certification or credential;

9 (D) Increase in the number of individuals placed in 10 employment; and

11 (E) Increase in number of children enrolled in the CHIP 12 program.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to amend language in the code for accuracy and clarification concerning the special community-based pilot demonstration project.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
