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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$18A-4-2b$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to including school social workers
12	in minimum salary supplement; and educational expense
13	reimbursement for professional personnel with recognized
14	national certification.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §18A-4-2b of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 4. SALARIES, WAGES AND OTHER BENEFITS.
19	§18A-4-2b. State minimum salary supplement and educational expense
20	reimbursement for professional personnel with
21	recognized national certification in speech-language
22	pathology, audiology, counseling, school psychology,
23	or school nursing or school social work.

(a) (1) The Legislature finds that achieving a nationally 1 2 recognized professional certification in speech-language pathology 3 or audiology involves a rigorous process of demonstrating both 4 knowledge and skills and results in highly trained and capable Individuals who attain national professional 5 employees. 6 certification by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association 7 provide needed and essential services to the school students of Individuals should be encouraged to achieve and 8 this state. 9 maintain the national professional certification through 10 reimbursement of expenses and a salary bonus which reflects their 11 additional certification.

12 (2) The Legislature finds that the rigorous standards and 13 processes for advanced certification by either the National Board 14 of Certified Counselors or the West Virginia Board of Examiners in 15 Counseling helps to promote the quality of counseling in schools. 16 Counselors in the public schools of West Virginia should be 17 encouraged to achieve and maintain the advanced certification 18 through reimbursement of expenses and a salary bonus that reflects 19 their additional certification.

20 (3) The Legislature finds that achieving a nationally 21 recognized professional certification in school psychology involves 22 a rigorous process of demonstrating competencies in scientific 23 research-based knowledge and skills. School psychologists provide 24 assessment, counseling and consultation to students, teachers,

1 school administrators and parents. Individuals who attain national 2 professional certification by the National Association of School 3 Psychologists provide services to students, families and school 4 systems in this state. School psychologists should be encouraged 5 to achieve and maintain this national professional certification 6 through reimbursement of expenses and a salary bonus which reflects 7 their additional certification.

8 (4) The Legislature finds that achieving a nationally 9 recognized professional certification in school nursing involves a 10 rigorous process of demonstrating competencies in health care and 11 nursing applications, knowledge and skills. School nurses provide 12 assessment, counseling and consultation to students, teachers, 13 school administrators and parents. School nurses who attain 14 national professional certification by the National Board for 15 Certification of School Nurses provide services to students, 16 families and school systems in this state. School nurses should be 17 encouraged to achieve and maintain this national professional 18 certification through reimbursement of expenses and a salary bonus 19 which reflects their additional certification.

20 (5) <u>The Legislature finds that achieving a nationally</u> 21 <u>recognized professional certification in school social work helps</u> 22 <u>promote the quality of social work services in schools. School</u> 23 <u>social workers provide psychosocial assessment, counseling,</u> 24 conflict resolution, case management, community resource

1 development, referral services and consultation to students,
2 teachers, school administrators and parents. School social workers
3 who achieve certification are better equipped to address the
4 negative psycho-social, socio-economic, human relationship, family
5 and systemic factors which impair student attendance and success.
6 Individuals who attain the National Association of Social Workers'
7 Certified School Social Work Specialist certification provide
8 services to students, families and school systems in this state.
9 School social workers should be encouraged to achieve and maintain
10 this national professional certification through reimbursement of
11 expenses and a salary bonus which reflects their additional
12 certification.

13 (6) Therefore, the purpose of this section is:

14 (A) To provide a statewide salary supplement for certain 15 professional personnel employed in the public schools who hold 16 nationally recognized professional certification in speech-language 17 pathology, audiology, counseling, school psychology, or school 18 nursing, or school social work;

19 (B) To treat these professional certifications equally;

(C) To encourage others to attain such a certification; and
(D) To help school systems recruit these highly qualified
professionals.

(b) In addition to any amounts prescribed in the applicable24 state minimum salary schedule, any professional personnel who hold

1 national certification or other credential as provided in this
2 section shall be paid an annual salary supplement of \$2,500. The
3 payment is:

4 (1) To be made in equal monthly installments;

5 (2) To be considered a part of the state minimum salaries for 6 teachers; and

7 (3) To continue for the life of the certification, or for ten8 years for any one certification, whichever first expires.

9 (c) Professional personnel employed as speech-language 10 pathologists, audiologists, counselors, school psychologists, or 11 school nurses or school social work are eligible upon enrollment 12 for reimbursement for one half of the fee for certification in 13 accordance with this section. In addition, these personnel are 14 eligible upon attainment of the certification for reimbursement of 15 the remainder of the application fee plus other expenses actually 16 incurred toward attainment of the certification. Not more than 18 one hundred fifteen speech-language pathologists, audiologists, 19 counselors, school psychologists, and school nurses or school 20 <u>social workers,</u> combined total, are eligible for reimbursement in 21 any one fiscal year.

(d) Notwithstanding subsection (b) of this section, for the 23 school year beginning July 1, 2008, the number of speech-language 24 pathologists, audiologists, counselors, school psychologists, and

1 school nurses <u>or school social workers</u> paid the annual salary 2 supplement provided for in said subsection may not exceed the 3 number of speech-language pathologists, audiologists, <del>and</del> 4 counselors <u>or school social workers</u> eligible to be paid the annual 5 salary supplement under the provisions of this section in effect 6 during the school year beginning July 1, 2007, by more than one 7 hundred fifteen qualified recipients, and the total amount of 8 qualified recipients may not increase thereafter by more than one 9 hundred fifteen in each subsequent fiscal year.

10 (e) The state board shall promulgate a legislative rule 11 establishing criteria for selection of the individuals eligible for 12 reimbursement and a salary supplement in accordance with this 13 section. The selection criteria shall prioritize the length of 14 time the certification has been held and the years of experience of 15 the holder in determining eligibility.

16 (f) The state board shall report the rule to the Legislative 17 Oversight Commission on Education Accountability by the January, 18 2009, legislative interim meeting period and shall report on its 19 progress in developing the rule to the commission during prior 20 interim meetings as requested.

(g) No provision of this section may be construed to require 22 any appropriation, or any specific level of appropriation, by the 23 Legislature, or payment of any supplement or reimbursement 24 described in this section for which a specific appropriation has

1 not been made.

2 (h) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section or the 3 provisions of section two-a of this article, professional personnel 4 may not be paid a salary supplement pursuant to the provisions of 5 both said sections.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to add school social workers to the list of professional personnel who may receive salary supplement and educational expense reimbursement for achieving recognized national certification. The maximum number of professional personnel eligible to receive salary supplement and education expense reimbursement remains unchanged.
