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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$7-7-1$ and $\$7-7-4$ of the Code of West
11	Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to authorizing an
12	increase in the salaries of county commissioners and elected
13	county officials; revising legislative findings; requiring the
14	State Auditor to consider certain factors when certifying
15	whether a county has an amount sufficient for payment of the

salary increases; providing that the State Auditor may not be

held liable for relying upon information and data provided by

a county commission in assessing a county's fiscal condition

or annual budget; requiring submission of a written request

for a salary increase; providing salary ranges for county

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- 1 attorneys to be devoted full time to public duties.
- 2 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
- 3 That \$7-7-1 and \$7-7-4 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as
- 4 amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
- 5 ARTICLE 7. COMPENSATION OF ELECTED COUNTY OFFICIALS.
- 6 §7-7-1. Legislative findings and purpose.
- 7 (a) The Legislature finds that it has, since January 1,  $\frac{2003}{1}$
- 8 2007, consistently and annually imposed upon the county
- 9 commissioners, sheriffs, county and circuit clerks, assessors and
- 10 prosecuting attorneys in each county board, new and additional
- 11 duties by the enactment of new provisions and amendments to this
- 12 code. The new and additional duties imposed upon the aforesaid
- 13 county officials by these enactments are such that they would
- 14 justify the increases in compensation as provided in section four
- 15 of this article, without violating the provisions of section
- 16 thirty-eight, article VI of the Constitution of West Virginia.
- 17 (b) The Legislature further finds that there are, from time to
- 18 time, additional duties imposed upon all county officials through
- 19 the acts of the Congress of the United States and that such acts
- 20 constitute new and additional duties for county officials and, as
- 21 such, justify the increases in compensation as provided by section
- 22 four of this article, without violating the provisions of section

1 thirty-eight, article VI of the Constitution of West Virginia.

(c) The Legislature further finds that there is a direct 2 3 correlation between the total assessed property valuations of a 4 county on which the salary levels of the county commissioners, 5 sheriffs, county and circuit clerks, assessors and prosecuting 6 attorneys are based, and the new and additional duties that each of 7 these officials is required to perform as they serve the best 8 interests of their respective counties. Inasmuch 9 reappraisal of the property valuations in each county has now been 10 accomplished, the Legislature finds that a change in classification 11 of counties by virtue of increased property valuations will occur 12 on an infrequent basis. However, it is the further finding of the 13 Legislature that when such change in classification of counties occur, that new and additional programs, economic 15 developments, requirements of public safety and the need for new 16 services provided by county officials all increase, that the same 17 constitute new and additional duties for county officials as their 18 respective counties reach greater heights of economic development, 19 as exemplified by the substantial increases in property valuations 20 and, as such, justify the increases in compensation provided in 21 section four of this article, without violating the provisions of 22 section thirty-eight, article VI of the Constitution of West

- 1 Virginia.
- 2 (d) The Legislature further finds and declares that the 3 amendments enacted to this article are intended to modify the 4 provisions of this article so as to cause the same to be in full 5 compliance with the provisions of the Constitution of West Virginia 6 and to be in full compliance with the decisions of the Supreme 7 Court of Appeals of West Virginia.
- 8 §7-7-4. Compensation of elected county officials and county
  9 commissioners for each class of county; effective
  10 date.
- (1) The increased salaries to be paid to the county commissioners and the other elected county officials described in this subsection section on and after July 1, 2006 2014, are set out in subdivisions subsections (5) and (7) of this subsection section. Every county commissioner and elected county official in each county, whose term of office commenced prior to or on or after July 17, 2006 2014, shall receive the same annual salary by virtue of legislative findings of extra duties as set forth in section one of this article.
- 20 (2) Before the increased salaries, as set out in subdivisions
  21 subsections (5) and (7) of this subsection section, are paid to the
  22 county commissioners and the elected county officials, the

1 following requirements must be met:

- 2 (A) The Auditor has certified that the proposed annual county 3 budget for the fiscal year beginning the first days of July 1, 4 2006, fiscal condition of the county, considering costs, revenues, 5 liabilities and significant trends of the same; maintenance 6 standards; and the commitment to the provision of county services 7 has increased sufficiently improved over the previous fiscal year 8 years in so that there exists an amount sufficient for the payment 9 of the increase in the salaries set out in <del>subdivisions</del> subsections 10 (5) and (7) of this subsection section and the related employment 11 taxes: Provided, That the Auditor may not approve the budget 12 provide the certification for the payment of the increase in the 13 salaries where any proposed annual county budget containing 14 contains anticipated receipts which are unreasonably greater or 15 lesser than that of the previous year. For purposes of this 16 subdivision subsection, the term "receipts" does not include 17 unencumbered fund balance or federal or state grants: Provided, 18 however, That the Auditor shall not be held liable for relying upon 19 information and data provided by a county commission in assessing 20 the county's fiscal condition or a proposed annual county budget; 21 and
- 22 (B) Each county commissioner or other elected official

1 described in this subsection in office on the effective date of the 2 increased salaries provided by this subsection who desires to 3 receive the increased salary has prior to that date filed in the 4 office of the clerk of the county commission his or her written 5 agreement to accept the salary increase. The salary for the person 6 who holds the office of county commissioner or other elected 7 official described in this subsection who fails to file the written 8 agreement as required by this paragraph shall be the salary for 9 that office in effect immediately prior to the effective date of 10 the increased salaries provided by this subsection until the person 11 vacates the office or his or her term of office expires, whichever 12 first occurs. Each county commissioner or other elected official 13 described in this section in office on the effective date of the 14 increased salaries provided by this section who desires to receive 15 the increased salary shall have prior to that date filed in the 16 office of the clerk of the county commission his or her written 17 request for the salary increase. The salary for the person who 18 holds the office of county commissioner or other elected official 19 described in this section who fails to file the written request as 20 required by this paragraph shall be the salary for that office in 21 effect immediately prior to the effective date of the increased 22 salaries provided by this section until the person vacates the

- 1 office or his or her term of office expires, whichever first
- 2 occurs.
- 3 Any request for a salary increase shall use the following
- 4 language:
- 5 I, [name of office holder], the duly elected [name of office]
- 6 in and for the County of [name of county], West Virginia, do hereby
- 7 request a salary increase pursuant to W. Va. Code §7-7-4, as
- 8 <u>amended</u>. This salary increase is effective July 1, 2014.
- 9 [Signature of office holder]
- 10 [Date]
- 11 (3) If the Auditor has failed to certify that there is  $\frac{1}{2}$
- 12 insufficient projected increase in revenues to pay the increased an
- 13 amount sufficient for the payment of the increase in the salaries
- 14 and the related employment taxes <u>pursuant to this section</u>, then the
- 15 salaries of that county's elected officials and commissioners shall
- 16 remain at the level in effect at the time certification was sought.
- 17 (4) In any county having a tribunal in lieu of a county
- 18 commission, the county commissioners of that county may be paid
- 19 less than the minimum salary limits of the county commission for
- 20 that particular class of the county.
