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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$24\mathchar`-1\mathchar`-3$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to requiring that the chairperson
12	of the Public Service Commission be elected on a nonpartisan

14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That §24-1-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS.
18	<pre>§24-1-3. Commission continued; membership; chairman; compensation;</pre>
19	quorum.
20	(a) The Public Service Commission of West Virginia is
21	continued and directed as provided by this chapter, chapter twenty-
22	four-a, chapter twenty-four-b and chapter twenty-four-d of this
23	code. The Public Service Commission may sue and be sued by that
24	name.
25	(b) The Public Service Commission shall consist of three

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1 members who shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and 2 consent of the Senate. The commissioners shall be citizens and 3 residents of this state and at least one of them shall be duly 4 licensed to practice law in West Virginia, with not less than ten 5 years' actual work experience in the legal profession as a member 6 of a State Bar.

7 (c) No more than two of the commissioners shall be members of8 the same political party.

9 (d) Each commissioner shall, before entering upon the duties 10 of his or her office, take and subscribe to the oath provided by 11 section five, article IV of the Constitution of this state. The 12 oath shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of State.

(e) The Governor shall designate one of the commissioners to 14 serve as chairman chairperson at the Governor's will and pleasure. 15 The chairman chairperson shall be the chief administrative officer 16 of the commission. The Governor may remove any commissioner only 17 for incompetency, neglect of duty, gross immorality, malfeasance in 18 office or violation of subsections (g) and (h) of this section.

(f) Upon expiration of the terms, appointments are for terms of six years, except that an appointment to fill a vacancy is for the unexpired term only.

(g) No person while in the employ of, or holding any official relation to, any public utility subject to the provisions of this chapter or holding any stocks or bonds of a public utility subject

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1 to the provisions of this chapter or who is pecuniarily interested 2 in a public utility subject to the provisions of this chapter may 3 serve as a member of the commission or as an employee of the 4 commission.

6 (h) Nor may any commissioner be a candidate for or hold public 6 office or be a member of any political committee while acting as a 7 commissioner; nor may any commissioner or employee of the 8 commission receive any pass, free transportation or other thing of 9 value, either directly or indirectly, from any public utility or 10 motor carrier subject to the provisions of this chapter. In case 11 any of the commissioners becomes a candidate for any public office 12 or a member of any political committee, the Governor shall remove 13 him or her from office and shall appoint a new commissioner to fill 14 the vacancy created.

(i) The annual salary of each commissioner provided in section two-a, article seven, chapter six of this code shall be paid in monthly installments from the special funds in the percentages that follow:

(1) From the Public Service Commission Fund collected under the provisions of section six, article three of this chapter, eighty percent;

(2) From the Public Service Commission Motor Carrier Fund
collected under the provisions of section six, article six, chapter
twenty-four-a of this code, seventeen percent; and

(3) From the Public Service Commission Gas Pipeline Safety
 Fund collected under the provisions of section three, article five,
 chapter twenty-four-b of this code, three percent.

4 (j) In addition to the salary provided for all commissioners 5 in section two-a, article seven, chapter six of this code, the 6 chairman chairperson of the commission shall receive \$5,000 per 7 annum to be paid in monthly installments from the Public Service 8 Commission Fund collected under the provisions of section six, 9 article three of this chapter.

10 <u>(k) Beginning with the 2018 general election, the Chairperson</u> 11 <u>of the Public Service Commission shall be elected on a nonpartisan</u> 12 <u>basis for four-year terms. The other two members of the commission</u> 13 <u>shall be appointed by the Governor with advice and consent of the</u> 14 <u>Senate.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide for the chairperson of the Public Service Commission to be elected on a nonpartisan basis beginning in 2018.
