(2) A person who violates subdivision (1) of this subsection
is quilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not
less than \$50 nor more than \$500. For a second offense the person
is quilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be
confined in jail for twenty-four hours and shall be fined not less
than \$100 nor more than \$750. For a third or subsequent offense
under this subsection, the person is guilty of a misdemeanor and,
upon conviction thereof, shall be confined in jail for not less
than twenty-four hours and not more than \$5,000.
(b) Subdivision (1), subsection (a) of this section does not

12 prohibit a person from taking a photograph of a decedent's corpse

13 at a wake, funeral, or memorial or burial service.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to make it illegal for anyone to photograph a corpse except for certain legitimate purposes.
