10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\S 21-11-3$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to changes to the definition of
12	electrical contractor.
13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
14	That §21-11-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
15	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
16	ARTICLE 11. WEST VIRGINIA CONTRACTOR LICENSING ACT.
17	§21-11-3. Definitions.
18	(a) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the Division of
19	Labor.
20	(b) "Board" means the West Virginia Contractor Licensing
21	Board.
22	(c) "Contractor" means a person who in any capacity for
23	compensation, other than as an employee of another, undertakes,
24	offers to undertake, purports to have the capacity to undertake or
25	submits a bid to construct, alter, repair, add to, subtract from,

- 1 improve, move, wreck or demolish any building, highway, road,
- 2 railroad, structure or excavation associated with a project,
- 3 development or improvement, or to do any part thereof, including
- 4 the erection of scaffolding or other structures or works in
- 5 connection  $\frac{\text{therewith}}{\text{the cost}}$ , where the cost of the undertaking is \$2,500
- 6 or more.
- 7 Contractor includes a construction manager who performs
- 8 management and counseling services for a construction project for
- 9 a professional fee.
- 10 Contractor does not include:
- 11 (1) One who merely furnishes materials or supplies without
- 12 fabricating or consuming them in the construction project;
- 13 (2) A person who personally performs construction work on the
- 14 site of real property which the person owns or leases whether for
- 15 commercial or residential purposes;
- 16 (3) A person who is licensed or registered as a professional
- 17 and who functions under the control of any other licensing or
- 18 regulatory board, whose primary business is real estate sales,
- 19 appraisal, development, management and maintenance, who acting in
- 20 his or her respective professional capacity and any employee of
- 21 such professional, acting in the course of his or her employment,
- 22 performs any work which may be considered to be performing
- 23 contracting work;
- 24 (4) A pest control operator licensed under the provisions of

- 1 section seven, article sixteen-a, chapter nineteen of this code to
- 2 engage in the application of pesticides for hire, unless the
- 3 operator also performs structural repairs exceeding \$1,000 on
- 4 property treated for insect pests; or
- 5 (5) A corporation, partnership or sole proprietorship, whose
- 6 primary purpose of which is to prepare construction plans and
- 7 specifications used by the contractors defined in this subsection
- 8 and who employs full time a registered architect licensed to
- 9 practice in this state or a registered professional engineer
- 10 licensed to practice in this state. Employees of such a
- 11 corporation, partnership or sole proprietorship shall is also be
- 12 exempt from the requirements of this article.
- (d) "Electrical contractor" means a person who engages in the
- 14 business of contracting to install, erect, repair or alter
- 15 electrical equipment for the generation or transmission or
- 16 utilization of electrical energy.
- 17 (e) "General building contractor" means a person whose
- 18 principal business is in connection with any structures built,
- 19 being built or to be built for the support, shelter and enclosure
- 20 of persons, animals, chattels or movable property of any kind,
- 21 requiring in the construction the use of more than two contractor
- 22 classifications, or a person who supervises the whole or any part
- 23 of such a construction.
- 24 (f) "General engineering contractor" means a person whose

- 1 principal business is in connection with public or private works
  2 projects, including, but not limited to, one or more of the
  3 following: Irrigation, drainage and water supply projects;
  4 electrical generation projects; swimming pools; flood control;
  5 harbors; railroads; highways; tunnels; airports and airways; sewers
  6 and sewage disposal systems; bridges; inland waterways; pipelines
  7 for transmission of petroleum and other liquid or gaseous
  8 substances; refineries; chemical plants and other industrial plants
  9 requiring a specialized engineering knowledge and skill; piers and
  10 foundations; and structures or work incidental thereto incidental
  11 work.
- 12 (g) "Heating, ventilating and cooling contractor" means a
  13 person who engages in the business of contracting to install,
  14 erect, repair, service or alter heating, ventilating and air
  15 conditioning equipment or systems to heat, cool or ventilate
  16 residential and commercial structures.
- 17 (h) "License" means a license to engage in business in this
  18 state as a contractor in one of the classifications set out in this
  19 article.
- 20 (i) "Multifamily contractor" means a person who is engaged in 21 construction, repair or improvement of a multifamily residential 22 structure.
- 23 (j) "Person" includes an individual, firm, sole 24 proprietorship, partnership, corporation, association or other

- 1 entity engaged in the undertaking of construction projects or any 2 combination thereof.
- 3 (k) "Piping contractor" means a person whose principal 4 business is the installation of process, power plant, air, oil, 5 gasoline, chemical or other kinds of piping; and boilers and 6 pressure vessels using joining methods of thread, weld, solvent 7 weld or mechanical methods.
- 8 (1) "Plumbing contractor" means a person whose principal 9 business is the installation, maintenance, extension and alteration 10 of piping, plumbing fixtures, plumbing appliances and plumbing 11 appurtenances, venting systems and public or private water supply 12 systems within or adjacent to any building or structure; included 13 in this definition is installation of gas piping, chilled water 14 piping in connection with refrigeration processes and comfort 15 cooling, hot water piping in connection with building heating and 16 piping for stand pipes.
- 17 (m) "Residential contractor" means a person whose principal
  18 business is in connection with construction, repair or improvement
  19 of real property used as, or intended to be used for, residential
  20 occupancy.
- 21 (n) "Specialty contractor" means a person who engages in 22 specialty contracting services which do not substantially fall 23 within the scope of any contractor classification as set out herein 24 in this article.

- 1 (o) "Residential occupancy" means occupancy of a structure for 2 residential purposes for periods greater than thirty consecutive 3 calendar days.
- (p) "Residential structure" means a building or structure used 5 or intended to be used for residential occupancy, together with 6 related facilities appurtenant to the premises as an adjunct of 7 residential occupancy, which contains not more than three distinct 8 floors which are above grade in any structural unit regardless of 9 whether the building or structure is designed and constructed for 10 one or more living units. Dormitories, hotels, motels or other 11 transient lodging units are not residential structures.
- 12 (q) "Subcontractor" means a person who performs a portion of 13 a project undertaken by a principal or general contractor or 14 another subcontractor.
- 15 (r) "Division" means the Division of Labor.
- 16 (s) "Cease and desist order" means an order issued by the 17 commissioner pursuant to the provisions of this article.
- 18 (t) The term "basic universal design" means the design of 19 products and environments to be useable by all people, to the 20 greatest extent possible, without the need for adaptation or 21 specialization.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to make changes to the definition of electrical contractor in this article.
