15	That §15-2-7 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,	
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:	
17	ARTICLE 2. WEST VIRGINIA STATE POLICE.	
18	\$15-2-7. Cadet selection board; qualifications for and appointment	
19	to membership in State Police; civilian employees;	
20	salaries.	
21	(a) The superintendent shall establish within the West	
22	Virginia State Police a cadet selection board which shall be	
23	representative of commissioned and noncommissioned officers within	
24	the State Police.	

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1 (b) The superintendent shall appoint a member to the position 2 of trooper from among the top three names on the current list of 3 eligible applicants established by the cadet selection board.

4 (c) Preference in making appointments shall be given whenever 5 possible to honorably discharged members of the Armed Forces of the 6 United States and to residents of West Virginia. Each applicant 7 for appointment shall be a person not less than twenty-one years of 8 age nor more than thirty-nine years of age, of sound constitution 9 and good moral character; is required to pass any mental and 10 physical examination; and meet other requirements as provided in 11 rules promulgated by the cadet selection board: *Provided*, That a 12 former member may, at the discretion of the superintendent, be 13 reenlisted.

14 (d) No person may be barred from becoming a member of the 15 State Police because of his or her religious or political 16 convictions.

(e) The superintendent shall adhere to the principles of equal employment opportunity set forth in article eleven, chapter five of this code and shall take positive steps to encourage applications for State Police membership from females and minority groups within the state. An annual report shall be filed with the Legislature on before January 1 of each year by the superintendent which and includes a summary of the efforts and the effectiveness of those those efforts intended to recruit females, African-Americans and other

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1 minorities into the ranks of the State Police.

2 (f) Except for the superintendent, no person may be appointed 3 or enlisted to membership in the State Police at a grade or rank 4 above the grade of trooper.

5 (g) The superintendent shall appoint civilian employees as are 6 necessary and all employees may be included in the classified 7 service of the civil service system except those in positions 8 exempt under the provisions of article six, chapter twenty-nine of 9 this code.

10 (h) Effective July 1, 2001, civilian employees with a minimum 11 of five years' service shall receive a salary increase equal to 12 \$100 a year for each year of service as a civilian employee. Every 13 three years thereafter, civilian employees who have five or more 14 years of service shall receive an annual salary increase of \$300. 15 The increases in salary provided by this subsection are in addition 16 to any other increases to which the civilian employees might 17 otherwise be entitled.

(i) Effective July 1, 2014, the salary range for the following job classifications within the West Virginia State Police Forensic Laboratory shall be:

7	(j) Effective July 1, 2014 all current West Virginia State
8	Police Forensic Laboratory Analysts, Directors, and Evidence
9	Technicians shall receive a one-time across the board salary
10	increase equal to thirty percent of their current salary.
11	(k) Effective July 1, 2015, and each year thereafter West
12	Virginia State Police Forensic Laboratory Analysts, Directors, and
13	Evidence Technicians with a minimum of one years' service shall
14	receive an annual longevity salary increase equal to two percent of
15	their salary.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish salaries and provide raises for employees within the West Virginia State Police Forensic Laboratory.
