- 5 (a) It is unlawful for any licensee, or agent, employee or 6 member thereof, on such licensee's premises to:

- 16 It shall be is unlawful for a retailer, farm winery, wine

- 19 agents or employees to sell or deliver wine between the hours of

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit the sale of wine and other legal beverages by private clubs and the sale of wine by private wine bed and breakfasts, private wine restaurants or private wine spa licensees between the hours of ten thirty o'clock a.m. and one o'clock p.m. on Sundays.
