18	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
19	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
20	by adding thereto a new section, designated §18-3-9c, to read as
21	follows:
22	ARTICLE 3. STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.
23	§18-3-9c. Reduction of personnel necessary to carry out the
24	duties and meet departmental goals.

- 1 (a) The Legislature finds that the 2012 Education Efficiency
- 2 Audit of West Virginia's Primary and Secondary Education System
- 3 made several findings regarding the West Virginia Department of
- 4 Education, including:
- 5 (1) For the fiscal year 2011, the department lists a total of
- 6 six hundred thirty-seven positions;
- 7 (2) In addition to the superintendent and deputy
- 8 superintendent, the department has four assistant superintendents,
- 9 nineteen executive directors and twenty-seven assistant directors,
- 10 one division assistant chief and one executive director/chief
- 11 financial officer;
- 12 (3) In fiscal year 2011, the department had a total payroll
- 13 of \$45.7 million;
- 14 (4) The West Virginia Department of Education has the second
- 15 highest ratio of state primary and secondary education
- 16 administrators and staff on the state level to students enrolled in
- 17 primary and secondary schools in the nation and the ratio is
- 18 greatly in excess of that in any surrounding state; and
- 19 (5) Taxpayers as well as primary and secondary education
- 20 students in West Virginia deserve the most efficient use of scarce
- 21 education resources possible and classroom education should be the
- 22 primary focus of any education paradigm.
- 23 (b) After June 30, 2017, the number of employees of the
- 24 department may not exceed a ratio greater than one employee for

- 1 every two thousand enrolled students in the state. The
- 2 superintendent shall develop and adopt a strategic plan and policy
- 3 to meet this ratio, which may include, but is not limited to, the
- 4 following:
- 5 (1) Restructure the organization of the department with
- 6 emphasis on meeting the major educational goals and functions of
- 7 the department;
- 8 (2) Identification of and, to the extent practicable, adoption
- 9 of best practices used or recommended by professionally recognized
- 10 resources in the education community;
- 11 (3) Increase the span of supervisory control to not less than
- 12 a one to ten ratio of supervisors to subordinates to facilitate the
- 13 reduction in the number of offices within the department;
- 14 (4) Reduction of the number of funded positions in the
- 15 department; and
- 16 (5) Implementation of additional cross-department initiatives
- 17 to reduce duplication of work and effort to ensure funds are used
- 18 as efficiently as possible.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish a maximum ratio of the number of employees of the West Virginia Department of Education to the number of students enrolled in the state after June 30, 2017 at not greater than one employee to two thousand students; and to require the state superintendent to establish a policy to attain the ratio.
