13	to higher education; appointment of members to the Higher
14	Education Policy Commission; appointment of members to the
15	institutional boards of Governors; and appointment of members
16	to the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical
17	College Education.
18	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
19	That §18B-1B-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
20	be amended and reenacted; that §18B-2A-1 of said code be amended
21	and reenacted; and that §18B-2B-4 of said code be amended and
22	reenacted, all to read as follows:
23	ARTICLE 1B. HIGHER EDUCATION POLICY COMMISSION.

\$18B-1B-2. Composition of commission; terms and qualifications of
 members; vacancies; eligibility for reappointment;
 oath of office; removal from office.

4 (a) The commission is comprised of ten members, all of whom 5 are entitled to vote. The membership of the commission is as 6 follows:

7 (1) The Secretary of Education and the Arts, ex officio;

8 (2) The State Superintendent of Schools, ex officio;

9 (3) The chair of the West Virginia Council for Community and 10 Technical College Education, ex officio; and

(4) Seven at-large members who are citizens of the state, 11 12 appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of 13 the Senate: Provided, That prior to appointment, the Governor 14 shall interview each candidate to assure that the person selected 15 understands and is committed to achieving the goals and objectives 16 as set forth in the institutional compacts and in section one-a, 17 article one of this chapter. The Governor shall invite the 18 President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Delegates, the 19 chairs of the Senate and House of Delegates committees on finance 20 and education and such other legislative leaders as the Governor 21 may determine to participate in interviewing potential candidates. 22 (b) Each of the at-large members appointed by the Governor 23 shall represent the public interest and shall be committed to the

1 legislative intent and goals set forth in state law and policy.

2 (c) The Governor may not appoint any person to be a member of 3 the commission who is an officer, employee or member of the council 4 or an advisory board of any state college or university; an officer 5 or member of any political party executive committee; the holder of 6 any other public office or public employment under the government 7 of this state or any of its political subdivisions; an appointee or 8 employee of any governing board; or an immediate family member of 9 any employee under the jurisdiction of the commission, the council 10 or any governing board.

(d) Of the seven at-large members appointed by the Governor:
(1) No more than four may belong to the same political party;
(2) At least two shall be appointed from each congressional
14 district; and

15 (3) Effective July 1, 2008, no more than one member may serve 16 from the same county.

17 (e) The at-large members appointed by the Governor serve 18 overlapping terms of four years.

19 (f) The Governor shall appoint a member to fill any vacancy 20 among the seven at-large members, by and with the advice and 21 consent of the Senate. Any member appointed to fill a vacancy 22 serves for the unexpired term of the vacating member. The Governor 23 shall fill the vacancy within thirty days of the occurrence of the

1 vacancy.

(g) An at-large member appointed by the Governor may not serve
more than two consecutive terms. <u>If the Governor intends to</u>
<u>reappoint an at-large member for a second term, the Governor shall</u>
<u>do so within thirty days of the expiration of that member's term.</u>
<u>If reappointment does not occur within thirty days, the at-large</u>
<u>member's term shall be deemed expired, effective upon the date of</u>
<u>the expiration of the member's term.</u>

9 <u>(h) Upon the expiration of an at-large member's term, the</u> 10 <u>Governor shall appoint a successor within thirty days of the end of</u> 11 <u>the member's term. The at-large member whose term has expired</u> 12 <u>shall not serve more than sixty days after the expiration of his or</u> 13 her term.

(h) (I) Before exercising any authority or performing any duties as a member of the commission, each member shall qualify as such by taking and subscribing to the oath of office prescribed by rection five, article IV of the Constitution of West Virginia and the certificate thereof shall be filed with the Secretary of State. (i) (i) A member of the commission appointed by the Governor may not be removed from office by the Governor except for official misconduct, incompetence, neglect of duty or gross immorality and then only in the manner prescribed by law for the removal of the state elective officers by the Governor.

1 ARTICLE 2A. INSTITUTIONAL BOARDS OF GOVERNORS.

2 §18B-2A-1. Findings; composition of boards; terms and qualifications of members; vacancies; eligibility 4 for reappointment.

5 (a) *Findings.* -- The Legislature finds that the State of West 6 Virginia is served best when the membership of each governing board 7 includes the following:

8 (1) The academic expertise and institutional experience of 9 faculty members and a student of the institution governed by the 10 board;

11 (2) The technical or professional expertise and institutional 12 experience of a classified employee of the institution governed by 13 the board;

14 (3) An awareness and understanding of the issues facing the 15 institution governed by the board; and

16 (4) The diverse perspectives that arise from a membership that 17 is balanced in terms of gender and varied in terms of race and 18 ethnic heritage.

(b) Boards of Governors established. -- A board of Governors 20 is continued at each of the following institutions: Bluefield 21 State College, Blue Ridge Community and Technical College, 22 Bridgemont Community and Technical College, Concord University,

1 Eastern West Virginia Community and Technical College, Fairmont 2 State University, Glenville State College, Kanawha Valley Community 3 and Technical College, Mountwest Community and Technical College, 4 Marshall University, New River Community and Technical College, 5 Pierpont Community and Technical College, Shepherd University, 6 Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College, West 7 Liberty University, West Virginia Northern Community and Technical 8 College, the West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine, West 9 Virginia State University, West Virginia University and West 10 Virginia University at Parkersburg.

11 (c) Board membership. --

12 (1) An appointment to fill a vacancy on the board or 13 reappointment of a member who is eligible to serve an additional 14 term is made in accordance with the provisions of this section.

15 (2) The Board of Governors for Marshall University consists of 16 sixteen persons. The Board of Governors for West Virginia 17 University consists of seventeen persons. The boards of governors 18 of the other state institutions of higher education consist of 19 twelve persons.

(3) Each board of governors includes the following members:
(A) A full-time member of the faculty with the rank of
instructor or above duly elected by the faculty of the respective
institution;

1 (B) A member of the student body in good academic standing, 2 enrolled for college credit work and duly elected by the student 3 body of the respective institution; and

4 (C) A member from the institutional classified employees duly
5 elected by the classified employees of the respective institution;
6 (4) For the Board of Governors at Marshall University,
7 thirteen lay members appointed by the Governor, by and with the
8 advice and consent of the Senate, pursuant to this section;

9 (5) For the Board of Governors at West Virginia University, 10 twelve lay members appointed by the Governor, by and with the 11 advice and consent of the Senate, pursuant to this section, and 12 additionally:

13 (A) The Chairperson of the Board of Visitors of West Virginia14 University Institute of Technology;

15 (B) A full-time faculty member representing the extension 16 service at the institution or a full-time faculty member 17 representing the health sciences, selected by the faculty senate. 18 (6) For each board of governors of the other state 19 institutions of higher education, nine lay members appointed by the 20 Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, 21 pursuant to this section.

22 (A) Of the nine members appointed by the Governor, no more 23 than five may be of the same political party. Of the thirteen

1 members appointed by the Governor to the governing board of 2 Marshall University, no more than eight may be of the same 3 political party. Of the twelve members appointed by the Governor 4 to the governing board of West Virginia University, no more than 5 seven may be of the same political party.

6 (B) Of the nine members appointed by the Governor, at least 7 five shall be residents of the state. Of the thirteen members 8 appointed by the Governor to the governing board of Marshall 9 University, at least eight shall be residents of the state. Of the 10 twelve members appointed by the Governor to the governing board of 11 West Virginia University, at least seven shall be residents of the 12 state.

13 (7) In making lay appointments, the Governor shall consider 14 the institutional mission and membership characteristics including 15 the following:

16 (A) The need for individual skills, knowledge and experience17 relevant to governing the institution;

(B) The need for awareness and understanding of institutional
problems and priorities, including those related to research,
teaching and outreach;

(C) The value of gender, racial and ethnic diversity; and
(D) The value of achieving balance in gender and diversity in
the racial and ethnic characteristics of the lay membership of each

1 board.

2 (d) Board member terms. --

3 (1) The student member serves for a term of one year. Each4 term begins on July 1.

5 (2) The faculty member serves for a term of two years. Each 6 term begins on July 1. Faculty members are eligible to succeed 7 themselves for three additional terms, not to exceed a total of 8 eight consecutive years.

9 (3) The member representing classified employees serves for a 10 term of two years. Each term begins on July 1. Members 11 representing classified employees are eligible to succeed 12 themselves for three additional terms, not to exceed a total of 13 eight consecutive years.

(4) The appointed lay citizen members serve terms of four 15 years each and are eligible to succeed themselves for no more than 16 one additional term, except that citizen members who are appointed 17 to fill unexpired terms are eligible to succeed themselves for two 18 full terms after completing an unexpired term. <u>If the Governor</u> 19 <u>intends to reappoint a lay citizen member for a second term, the</u> 20 <u>Governor shall do so within thirty days of the expiration of that</u> 21 <u>member's term. If reappointment does not occur within thirty days,</u> 22 <u>the lay citizen member's term shall be deemed expired, effective</u> 23 <u>upon the date of the expiration of the member's term.</u>

1 (5) A vacancy in an unexpired term of a member shall be filled 2 for the unexpired term within thirty days of the occurrence of the 3 vacancy in the same manner as the original appointment or election. 4 Except in the case of a vacancy, all elections are held and all 5 appointments are made no later than June 30 preceding the 6 commencement of the term. <u>A member whose term has expired shall</u> 7 <u>not serve more than sixty days after the expiration of his or her</u> 8 <u>term.</u> Each board of governors shall elect one of its appointed lay 9 members to be chairperson in June of each year. A member may not 10 serve as chairperson for more than four consecutive years.

11 (6) The appointed members of the boards of governors serve 12 staggered terms of up to four years except that four of the initial 13 appointments to the governing boards of community and technical 14 colleges that became independent July 1, 2008, are for terms of two 15 years and five of the initial appointments are for terms of four 16 years.

17 (e) Board member eligibility, expenses. --

(1) A person is ineligible for appointment to membership on a 19 board of governors of a state institution of higher education under 20 the following conditions:

(A) For a baccalaureate institution or university, a person is ineligible for appointment who is an officer, employee or member of any other board of governors; an employee of any institution of

1 higher education; an officer or member of any political party 2 executive committee; the holder of any other public office or 3 public employment under the government of this state or any of its 4 political subdivisions; an employee of any affiliated research 5 corporation created pursuant to article twelve of this chapter; an 6 employee of any affiliated foundation organized and operated in 7 support of one or more state institutions of higher education; or 8 a member of the council or commission. This subsection does not 9 prevent the representative from the faculty, classified employees, 10 students or the superintendent of a county board of education from 11 being members of the governing boards.

(B) For a community and technical college, a person is ineligible for appointment who is an officer, employee or member of any other board of governors; a member of a board of visitors of sany public institution of higher education; an employee of any institution of higher education; an officer or member of any political party executive committee; the holder of any other public soffice, other than an elected county office, or public employment, other than employment by the county board of education, under the government of this state or any of its political subdivisions; an employee of any affiliated research corporation created pursuant to article twelve of this chapter; an employee of any affiliated foundation organized and operated in support of one or more state

1 institutions of higher education; or a member of the council or 2 commission. This subsection does not prevent the representative 3 from the faculty, classified employees or students from being 4 members of the governing boards.

5 (2) Before exercising any authority or performing any duties 6 as a member of a governing board, each member shall qualify as such 7 by taking and subscribing to the oath of office prescribed by 8 section five, article IV of the Constitution of West Virginia and 9 the certificate thereof shall be filed with the Secretary of State. 10 (3) A member of a governing board appointed by the Governor 11 may not be removed from office by the Governor except for official 12 misconduct, incompetence, neglect of duty or gross immorality and 13 then only in the manner prescribed by law for the removal of the 14 state elective officers by the Governor.

15 (4) The members of the board of governors serve without 16 compensation, but are reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary 17 expenses actually incurred in the performance of official duties 18 under this article upon presentation of an itemized sworn statement 19 of expenses.

(5) The president of the institution shall make available 21 resources of the institution for conducting the business of its 22 board of governors. All expenses incurred by the board of 23 governors and the institution under this section are paid from

1 funds allocated to the institution for that purpose.

## 2 ARTICLE 2B. WEST VIRGINIA COUNCIL FOR COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL 3 COLLEGE EDUCATION.

4 §18B-2B-4. Appointment, composition and terms of council.

5 (a) The council is comprised of thirteen members selected as 6 follows:

7 (1) Eight members appointed by the Governor, with the advice8 and consent of the Senate:

9 (A) One member shall be appointed from each community and 10 technical college consortia district as established in this 11 section.

(B) Prior to appointment, the Governor shall interview each candidate to assure that the person selected understands and is committed to achieving the goals and objectives as set forth in the institutional compacts and in section one-a, article one of this chapter. The Governor shall invite the President of the Senate, The Speaker of the House of Delegates, the chairs of the Senate and House of Delegates committees on finance and education and such other legislative leaders as the Governor may determine to participate in interviewing potential candidates. Each member appointed to the council by the Governor shall represent the public interest and shall be committed to the legislative intent and goals set forth in section one-a, article one of this chapter.

(2) The Chairperson of the West Virginia Workforce Investment
 2 Council;

3 (3) The Executive Director of the West Virginia Development4 Office, or designee;

5 (4) The President of the West Virginia AFL-CIO, or a designee;
6 (5) The Chair of the Higher Education Policy Commission who
7 serves as an ex officio, nonvoting member of the council; and

8 (6) The Assistant Superintendent for Technical and Adult 9 Education of the State Department of Education who serves as an ex 10 officio, nonvoting member of the council;

(b) Any appointed member shall be a citizen of the state, shall represent the public interest and shall understand and be committed to achieving the goals and objectives set forth in section one-a, article one of this chapter, the essential conditions set forth in article three-c of this chapter, and the goals for secondary and post-secondary vocational-technicalroccupational and adult basic education in the state. Any appointed member shall represent the interests of the business, labor and employer communities and demonstrate knowledge of the education needs of the various regions, attainment levels and age groups within the state.

22 (c) The Governor may not appoint any person to be a member of 23 the council who is an officer, employee or member of an advisory

1 board of any state college or university, the holder of any other 2 public office or public employment under the government of this 3 state or any of its political subdivisions, an appointee or 4 employee of any governing board or an immediate family member of 5 any employee under the jurisdiction of the commission or any 6 governing board. An individual may not serve on the council who is 7 engaged in providing, or employed by a person or company whose 8 primary function is to provide, workforce development services and 9 activities.

10 (d) Members of the council serve for staggered terms of four 11 years. Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision (1), 12 subsection (a) of this section, on the effective date of this 13 section any current member of the council maintains his or her 14 appointment to the council and continues to serve for the remainder 15 of the term for which originally appointed. Any additional 16 appointment required by the provisions of said subdivision shall 17 represent a consortia district not otherwise represented on the 18 council.

19 <u>(e) A member appointed by the Governor may not serve more than</u> 20 <u>two consecutive terms. If the Governor intends to reappoint a</u> 21 <u>member for a second term, the Governor shall do so within thirty</u> 22 <u>days of the expiration of that member's term. If reappointment</u> 23 <u>does not occur within thirty days, that member's term shall be</u>

1 deemed expired, effective upon the date of the expiration of the
2 member's term.

3 (f) Upon the expiration of an appointed member's term, the 4 Governor shall appoint a successor within thirty days of the end of 5 the member's term. The appointed member whose term has expired 6 shall not serve more than sixty days after the expiration of his or 7 her term. 8 (g) The Governor shall appoint a member to fill any vacancy 9 among the eight appointed members, by and with the advice and 10 consent of the Senate. Any member appointed to fill a vacancy 11 serves for the unexpired term of the vacating member. The Governor 12 shall fill the vacancy within thirty days of the occurrence of the

13 vacancy.
