18	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
19	That §17A-4A-15 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as
20	amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
21	ARTICLE 4A. LIENS AND ENCUMBRANCES ON VEHICLES TO BE SHOWN ON
22	CERTIFICATE OF TITLE; NOTICE TO CREDITORS AND
23	PURCHASERS.

1 §17A-4A-15. Expiration of lien or encumbrance; refiling.

2 The filing of any lien or encumbrance and its recordation upon 3 the face of a certificate of title to any vehicle as provided in 4 this article shall be is valid for a period of ten fifteen years 5 only from the date of filing, unless the lienholder refiles the 6 lien or encumbrance is refiled in the manner provided in this 7 article for filing and recordation in the first instance, in which 8 event the lien or encumbrance shall be is valid for successive 9 additional periods of two five years from the date of each 10 refiling: Provided, That this article does not require the 11 lienholder to obtain the consent of the owner to refile the lien or 12 encumbrance: Provided, however, That in the case of a mobile home 13 or manufactured home, the filing of any lien or encumbrance and its 14 recordation upon the face of a certificate of title to the mobile 15 home or manufactured home shall be is valid for a period of 16 thirty-three years from the date of filing.

When the last lien or encumbrance shown on a certificate of title becomes invalid by the passage of time as provided in this section, the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall not be is not 20 required to maintain a lien index as to the certificate of title.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to expand from ten years, to fifteen years the period during which a lien noted on the face of the certificate of title to a motor vehicle is valid, and to likewise expand from two years, to five years the period during which a refiled lien on a motor vehicle is valid.
