2 Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the contrary, 3 anyone, regardless of state residency status, meeting the 4 requirements for coverage set forth in 38 U.S.C. §3311 is entitled 5 to the same tuition rate at state institutions of higher education 6 as resident students of those institutions. Regardless of state 7 residency status, students meeting the requirements of 8 38 U.S.C. §3311 are only entitled to resident tuition rates for 9 four consecutive years from the date of enrollment. Any nonresident 10 students covered under this section are eligible to continue paying 11 resident tuition rates after the initial four-year period 12 immediately upon becoming West Virginia residents. This section 13 applies to both undergraduate and graduate education programs.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to offer in-state tuition at state colleges and universities to resident and nonresident members of the military eligible for educational benefits under the Post-9/11 G.I. Bill.

This section is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
