15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §21-3A-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 3A. OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH ACT.
19	§21-3A-2. Definitions.
20	As used in this chapter, unless the context clearly indicates
21	otherwise:
22	(a) "Commission" means the occupational safety and health
	review commission established under this article;

- 1 (b) "Commissioner" means the labor commissioner or his or her
- 2 designated agent;
- 3 (c) "Employee" means any public employee of the state, or any
- 4 state agency;
- 5 (d) "Employer" means public employer and shall include the
- 6 state or any department, division, bureau, board, council, agency
- 7 or authority of the state, but shall does not include the
- 8 department of corrections, the department of health and the
- 9 Legislature;
- 10 (e) "Occupational safety and health standard" means a standard
- 11 for health or safety which requires the adoption or use of one or
- 12 more practices, means, methods, operations or processes reasonably
- 13 necessary or appropriate to provide safe and healthful employment
- 14 in places of employment;
- 15 (f) "Person" means one or more individuals; and
- 16 (g) "Workplace" means a place where public employees are
- 17 assigned to work but shall does not include any place where public
- 18 employees are assigned to work that is inspected and regulated in
- 19 accordance with federal occupational safety and health standards or
- 20 mine safety and health administration standards, or facilities
- 21 under the authority of the department of corrections, the
- 22 department of health, or the Legislature.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to make the Department of Corrections and the Department of Health, and their respective workplaces, subject to the Occupational Safety and Health Act.
