AN ACT to amend and reenact §16-5-29 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to amend and reenact §59-1-10 of said code, all relating to death certificates of military veterans; providing for the issuance, without charge in certain instances, of up to two certified copies of a veteran's death certificate by the clerk of the county commission if requested within thirty days of the death of the veteran; providing no fee may be charged if the death certificate is needed to obtain state or federal benefits; specifying effective date; and defining "veteran".

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §16-5-29 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; and that §59-1-10 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

CHAPTER 16, PUBLIC HEALTH.

ARTICLE 5. VITAL STATISTICS.

§16-5-29. Fees for copies and searches.

- 1 (a) The commissioner shall prescribe the fees to be charged
- 2 and collected by the State Registrar for certified copies of
- 3 certificates or records, not to exceed \$10 per copy, or for a
- 4 search of the files or records when no copy is made: Provided,
- 5 That the fee may be increased to a maximum of \$12 per copy, at
- 6 the discretion of the commissioner, after July 1, 2008.
- 7 (b) The commissioner may prescribe additional fees for the 8 priority production or express delivery of certified copies.
- 9 (c) The State Registrar may furnish certified copies of birth 10 and death records to state agencies and to organized charities 11 free of charge when the certificates are needed in presenting 12 claims to the federal government or to a state for public 13 assistance. The State Registrar will keep a record of all
- 14 certificates furnished pursuant to this subsection.
- 15 (d) Beginning July 1, 2014, upon request made within thirty 16 days of the date of death of a veteran, the State Registrar shall 17 issue without fee no more than a total of two certified copies of 18 a veteran's death certificate to: (i) A family member or 19 dependent of the veteran; (ii) the personal representative of the 20 veteran's estate; or (iii) the funeral director providing funeral 21 services for the veteran with written permission from the person 22 responsible for payment of the funeral services or a family 23 member or dependent of the veteran: Provided, That proof of the 24 veteran's military service is furnished at the time of the request. 25 However, as provided by section twelve-a, article four, chapter fifty-one of this code, no fee may be charged for a death 26 27 certificate that is necessary to obtain benefits from the federal or

state government. As used in this subsection, "veteran" means

any person who has served in the armed forces of the United

- States, the military reserve or National Guard and who was notdishonorably discharged.
- 32 (e) Subject to the provisions set forth in section two, article 33 two, chapter twelve of this code, there is hereby continued in the 34 State Treasury a separate account which shall be designated the 35 vital statistics account.

- (f) After July 1, 2006, and subject to the provisions set forth in section two, article two, chapter twelve of this code, there is established in the State Treasury a separate account which shall be designated the vital statistics improvement fund. Funds deposited in this account will be used to modernize and automate the system of vital statistics in this state and may not be used to supplant existing funding necessary for the daily operation of the system of vital statistics. Funds in this account will be retained in a nonlapsing fund for the improvement of the system of vital statistics.
- 46 (g) The commissioner shall deposit \$1 received under the 47 provisions of this section for each certified copy to the vital 48 statistics improvement fund and shall deposit \$4 received under 49 the provisions of this section for each certified copy to the 50 General Revenue Fund account. The commissioner shall deposit 51 the remainder of all fees received under the provisions of this 52 section for certified copies and for priority production and 53 express delivery to the vital statistics account.
- 54 (h) The commissioner is authorized to expend the moneys 55 deposited in the vital statistics account in accordance with the 56 laws of this state as necessary to implement this article. The 57 Legislature shall appropriate all moneys in the vital statistics 58 account as part of the annual state budget.
- (i) The commissioner shall make an annual report to the Legislature on the vital statistics account, including the previous fiscal year's expenditures and projected expenditures for the next fiscal year.

CHAPTER 59. FEES, ALLOWANCES AND COSTS; NEWSPAPERS: LEGAL ADVERTISEMENTS.

ARTICLE 1, FEES AND ALLOWANCES.

§59-1-10. Fees to be charged by clerk of county commission.

- For the purpose of this section, the word "page" is defined
- 2 as being a paper or electronic writing of not more than legal size,
- 3 8 1/2" x 14".
- 4 (a) When a writing is admitted to record, for receiving proof
- 5 of acknowledgment thereof, entering an order in connection
- 6 therewith, endorsing clerk's certificate of recordation thereon
- 7 and indexing in a proper index, the clerk of the county
- 8 commission shall charge and collect the following fees:
- 9 (1) Fifteen dollars for a deed of conveyance (with or without
- 10 a plat), trust deed, fixture filing or security agreement
- 11 concerning real estate lease.
- 12 (2) Forty dollars for a trustee's report of sale for any
- 13 property for which additional information and filing
- 14 requirements are required by section eight-a, article one, chapter
- 15 thirty-eight of this code. Twenty dollars of each recording fee
- 16 received pursuant to this subdivision shall be deposited into the
- 17 county's General Revenue Fund and \$20 paid quarterly by the
- 18 clerk of the county commission to the West Virginia Housing
- 19 Development Fund established in article eighteen, chapter
- 20 thirty-one of this code.
- 21 (3) Ten dollars for a financing, continuation, termination or
- 22 other statement or writing permitted to be filed under chapter
- 23 forty-six of this code.
- 24 (4) Ten dollars for a plat or map (with no deed of
- 25 conveyance).
- 26 (5) No charge for a service discharge record.

- 27 (6) Ten dollars for any document or writing other than those 28 referenced in subdivisions (1), (2), (3), (4) and (5) of this 29 subsection.
- (7) One dollar for each additional page for documents orwritings containing more than five pages.
- For any of the documents admitted to record pursuant to this subsection, if the clerk of the county commission has the technology available to receive these documents in electronic form or other media, the clerk shall set a reasonable fee to record these writings not to exceed the cost for filing paper documents.
- 37 (8) Of the fees collected pursuant to subdivision (1), subsection (a) of this section, \$10 shall be deposited in the 38 39 county general fund in accordance with section twenty-eight of 40 this article and \$1 shall be deposited in the county general fund 41 and dedicated to the operation of the county clerk's office. Four 42 dollars of the fees collected pursuant to subdivision (1), 43 subsection (a) of this section and \$5 of the fees collected 44 pursuant to subdivision (6), subsection (a) of this section shall be 45 paid by the county clerk into the State Treasury and deposited in equal amounts for deposit into the Farmland Protection Fund 46 47 created in article twelve, chapter eight-a of this code for the 48 benefit of the West Virginia Agricultural Land Protection 49 Authority and into the Outdoor Heritage Conservation Fund 50 created in article two-g, chapter five-b of this code. The funds 51 deposited in the State Treasury pursuant to this subdivision may 52 only be used for costs, excluding personnel costs, associated with purpose of land conservation, as defined in subsection (f), 53 54 section seven, article two-g, chapter five-b of this code.
- 55 (b) Five dollars for administering any oath other than oaths 56 by officers and employees of the state, political subdivisions of 57 the state or a public or quasi-public entity of the state or a 58 political subdivision of the state, taken in his or her official 59 capacity.

- 60 (c) Fifty-five dollars for issuance of marriage license and 61 other duties pertaining to the marriage license (including 62 preparation of the application, administrating the oath, 63 registering and recording the license, mailing acknowledgment 64 of minister's return to one of the licensees and notification to a 65 licensee after sixty days of the nonreceipt of the minister's 66 return). This fee is reduced to \$35 if the applicants present a 67 premarital education course completion certificate issued 68 pursuant to section seven hundred one, article two, chapter 69 forty-eight of this code, and dated within one year of the 70 application for a marriage license.
- (1) One dollar of the marriage license fee received pursuant to this subsection shall be paid by the county clerk into the State Treasury as a state registration fee in the same manner that license taxes are paid into the Treasury under article twelve, chapter eleven of this code;
- 76 (2) Fifteen dollars of the marriage license fee received 77 pursuant to this subsection shall be paid by the county clerk into 78 the State Treasury for the Family Protection Shelter Support Act 79 in the same manner that license taxes are paid into the Treasury 80 under article twelve, chapter eleven of this code;
- (3) Ten dollars of the marriage license fee received pursuant
 to this subsection shall be deposited in the Courthouse Facilities
 Improvement Fund created by section six, article twenty-six,
 chapter twenty-nine of this code; and
- (4) If a premarital education course completion certificate is not presented, the county clerk shall, on or before the tenth day of each month, transmit \$20 of the marriage license fee received pursuant to this subsection to the State Treasurer for deposit in the State Treasury as follows:
- 90 (A) Five dollars to the credit of the Family Protection Shelter 91 Support Act in the same manner that license taxes are paid into 92 the treasury under article twelve, chapter eleven of this code;

- 93 (B) Five dollars to the credit of the special revenue account, 94 hereby created, designated the Fund for Civil Legal Services for Low Income Persons, which shall consist of all gifts, grants, 95 96 bequests, transfers, appropriations or other donations or payments which may be received and administered by the 97 98 Division of Justice and Community Services from any 99 governmental entity or unit or any person, firm, foundation, or 100 corporation for the purposes of this section, and all interest or other return earned from investment of the fund. Expenditures 101 102 from the fund shall be made by the Director of the Division of 103 Justice and Community Services and shall be limited to grants to 104 nonprofit agencies which provide civil legal services to low income persons made at his or her discretion. Any balance in the 105 106 fund at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the General 107 Revenue Fund but shall remain in the fund and be expended as 108 provided by this section.
- 109 (C) Ten dollars to the credit of the Marriage Education Fund 110 created pursuant to section seven hundred two, article two, 111 chapter forty-eight of this code.
- 112 (d) (1) One dollar and fifty cents for a copy of any writing or 113 document, if it is not otherwise provided for.
- 114 (2) One dollar for each additional page if the writing or 115 documents contains more than two pages.
- 116 (3) One dollar for annexing the seal of the commission or 117 clerk to any paper.
- 118 (4) (A) Five dollars for a certified copy of a birth certificate, 119 death certificate or marriage license, except as provided by 120 paragraph (B) of this subdivision.
- 121 (B) Beginning July 1, 2014, upon request made within thirty 122 days of the date of death of a veteran, the clerk of the county 123 commission shall issue without fee no more than a total of two 124 certified copies of a veteran's death certificate to: (i) A family

125 member or dependent of the veteran; (ii) the personal 126 representative of the veteran's estate; or (iii) the funeral director 127 providing funeral services for the veteran with written 128 permission from the person responsible for payment of the 129 funeral services or a family member or dependent of the veteran: 130 Provided, That proof of the veteran's military service is 131 furnished at the time of the request. However, as provided by section twelve-a, article four of this chapter, no fee may be 132 133 charged for a death certificate that is necessary to obtain benefits from the federal or state government. As used in this paragraph, 134 135 "veteran" means any person who has served in the armed forces 136 of the United States, the military reserve or National Guard and 137 who was not dishonorably discharged.

138 (e) For copies of any record in electronic form or a medium 139 other than paper, a reasonable fee set by the clerk of the county 140 commission not to exceed the costs associated with document 141 search and duplication.
