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10	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto two new sections,
11	designated §11-21-45 and §11-24-11c; and to amend said code by adding thereto a new
12	section, designated §23-2-18, all relating to workers' compensation insurance; allowing an
13	employer to extend workers' compensation coverage to an employee engaged in volunteer
14	fire fighting and allowing employers a tax credit for the cost of providing workers'
15	compensation insurance coverage to employees engaged in volunteer fire fighting.
16	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
17	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto two new
18	sections, designated §11-21-45 and §11-24-11c; and that said code be amended by adding thereto
19	a new section, designated §23-2-18, all to read as follows:
20	CHAPTER 11. TAXATION.
21	ARTICLE 21. PERSONAL INCOME TAX
22	§11-21-45. Credit for extending workers' compensation coverage to volunteer firefighters.
23	For any employer not subject to the tax imposed by article twenty-four of this chapter, a

- 1 credit shall be allowed against the primary tax liability imposed by this article equal to one hundred
- 2 percent of the increase in cost to the employer from providing workers' compensation coverage to
- 3 an employee for volunteer fire fighting services, pursuant to section eighteen, article two, chapter
- 4 <u>twenty-three of this code</u>.
- 5 ARTICLE 24. CORPORATION NET INCOME TAX.
- 6 §11-24-11c. Credit for extending workers' compensation coverage to volunteer firefighters.
- A credit shall be allowed against the primary tax liability imposed by this article equal to one
- 8 hundred percent of the increase in cost to an employer from providing workers' compensation
- 9 coverage to an employee for volunteer fire fighting services, pursuant to section eighteen, article two,
- 10 chapter twenty-three of this code.
- 11 CHAPTER 23. WORKERS' COMPENSATION.
- 12 ARTICLE 2. EMPLOYERS AND EMPLOYEES SUBJECT TO THIS CHAPTER;
- 13 EXTRATERRITORIAL COVERAGE.
- 14 §23-2-18. Employer coverage of volunteer firefighters.
- 15 (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Volunteer Fire Department Workers'
- 16 Compensation Cost Reduction Act."
- 17 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, an employer subject to the requirements
- 18 of this article may extend workers' compensation insurance coverage to an employee for any
- 19 volunteer fire fighting services that the employee performs. A volunteer fire department is not
- 20 required to extend workers' insurance compensation coverage to a volunteer firefighter while the
- 21 volunteer firefighter is covered by an employer pursuant to this section.
- 22 (c) Upon extending workers' compensation insurance coverage to an employee for volunteer

- 1 fire fighting services and every six months thereafter, an employer shall provide a notarized affidavit
- 2 to the volunteer fire company verifying that the employee is covered for the next six months. The
- 3 volunteer fire fighting department shall keep the affidavit on file and shall forward a copy of the
- 4 affidavit to the State Fire Marshal.
- 5 (d) A volunteer firefighter insured pursuant to this section shall immediately notify the
- 6 volunteer fire department in writing if any of the following events occur:
- 7 (1) An employer rescinds coverage provided pursuant to this section.
- 8 (2) The volunteer firefighter's employment is terminated by the employer providing coverage
- 9 pursuant to this section.
- 10 (3) The volunteer firefighter resigns from employment with an employer providing coverage
- 11 pursuant to this section.
- (e) Any individual who fails to report a rescission of coverage or a change in employment
- 13 status, as required by subsection (d), shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$1,000, to be assessed
- 14 by the Workers' Compensation Commission.
- 15 (f) In the event that a volunteer fire fighting department receives written notice from a
- 16 volunteer firefighter of a rescission of coverage or a change in employment status, as required by
- 17 subsection (d), the volunteer fire fighting department shall immediately provide workers'
- 18 compensation coverage to the volunteer firefighter in compliance with this article. Any volunteer
- 19 fire department that fails to comply with the requirements of this subsection shall be subject to a fine
- 20 of not more than \$1,000, to be assessed by the Workers' Compensation Commission.
- 21 (g) An employer providing coverage to a volunteer firefighter pursuant to this section is not
- 22 subject to civil or criminal liability for the actions of an employee while performing volunteer fire

- 1 <u>fighting services.</u>
- 2 (h) The Fire Marshal shall keep detailed records of all coverage provided pursuant to this
- 3 section and shall present an annual financial data report to the Joint Committee on Labor and Worker
- 4 Safety Issues.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to allow an employer to extend workers' compensation insurance coverage to an employee engaged in volunteer fire fighting and allowing employers a tax credit for the cost of providing workers' compensation insurance to employees engaged in volunteer fire fighting.

These sections are new; therefore, they have been completely underscored.
