There is established in the State Treasury a special revenue account, designated as the "Fund 16 17 for Civil Legal Services for Low Income Persons," which is an appropriated fund for receipt of grants, gifts, fees, or federal or state funds designated for civil legal services for low income persons. 19 Expenditures from the fund shall be limited to grants to nonprofit agencies which provide civil legal 20 services to low income persons. The director is given the duty and powers necessary to make the 21 grants.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Director of the Division of Justice and

Community Services to make grants from state and other funds to provide civil legal services to low income persons.
