A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §49-2-8, relating to establishing the Task Force on Prevention of Sexual Abuse of Children; authorizing section to be called "Erin Merryn's Law"; specifying membership; specifying responsibilities, including report of recommendations to Legislature and Governor; precluding member compensation or expense reimbursement.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §49-2-8, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 2. STATE RESPONSIBILITIES FOR THE PROTECTION AND CARE OF CHILDREN.

§49-2-8. Task Force on Prevention of Sexual Abuse of Children.

- 1 (a) This section may be referred to as "Erin Merryn's Law".
- 2 (b) The Task Force on Prevention of Sexual Abuse of
- 3 Children is established. The task force consists of the following
- 4 members:
- 5 (1) The Chair of the West Virginia Senate Committee on
- 6 Health and Human Resources, or his or her designee;
- 7 (2) The Chair of the House of Delegates Committee on
- 8 Health and Human Resources, or his or her designee;
- 9 (3) The Chair of the West Virginia Senate Committee on
- 10 Education, or his or her designee;
- 11 (4) The Chair of the House of Delegates Committee on
- 12 Education, or his or her designee;
- 13 (5) One citizen member appointed by the President of the
- 14 Senate;

- 15 (6) One citizen member appointed by the Speaker of the
- 16 House of Delegates;
- 17 (7) One citizen member, who is a survivor of child sexual
- 18 abuse, appointed by the Governor;
- 19 (8) The President of the State Board of Education, or his or
- 20 her designee;
- 21 (9) The State Superintendent of Schools, or his or her
- 22 <u>designee</u>;
- 23 (10) The Secretary of the Department of Health and Human
- 24 Resources, or his or her designee;
- 25 (11) The Director of the Prosecuting Attorney's Institute, or
- 26 his or her designee;
- 27 (12) One representative of each statewide professional
- 28 teachers' organization, each selected by the leader of his or her
- 29 respective organization;
- 30 (13) One representative of the statewide school service
- 31 personnel organization, selected by the leader of the
- 32 organization;
- 33 (14) One representative of the statewide school principals'
- 34 organization, appointed by the leader of the organization;

- 35 (15) One representative of the statewide professional social
- 36 workers' organization, appointed by the leader of the
- 37 organization;
- 38 (16) One representative of a teacher preparation program of
- 39 a regionally accredited institution of higher education in the
- 40 state, appointed by the Chancellor of the Higher Education
- 41 Policy Commission;
- 42 (17) The Chief Executive Officer of the Center for
- 43 Professional Development, or his or her designee;
- 44 (18) The Director of Prevent Child Abuse West Virginia, or
- 45 <u>his or her designee;</u>
- 46 (19) The Director of the West Virginia Child Advocacy
- 47 Network, or his or her designee;
- 48 (20) The Director of the West Virginia Coalition Against
- 49 Domestic Violence, or his or her designee;
- 50 (21) The Director of the West Virginia Foundation for Rape
- 51 Information and Services, or his or her designee;
- 52 (22) The Administrative Director of the West Virginia
- 53 Supreme Court of Appeals, or his or her designee;

54 (23) The Executive Director of the West Virginia Sheriffs' 55 Association, or his or her designee; 56 (24) One representative of an organization representing law enforcement, appointed by the Superintendent of the West 57 58 Virginia State Police; and 59 (25) One practicing school counselor. 60 (c) To the extent practicable, members of the task force shall 61 be individuals actively involved in the fields of child abuse and 62 neglect prevention and child welfare. 63 (d) At the joint call of the House of Delegates and Senate Education Committee Chairs, the task force shall convene its 64 65 first meeting and by majority vote of members present elect 66 presiding officers. Subsequent meetings shall be at the call of the 67 presiding officer. 68 (e) The task force shall make recommendations for 69 decreasing incidence of sexual abuse of children in West 70 Virginia. In making those recommendations, the task force shall: 71 (1) Gather information regarding sexual abuse of children 72 throughout the state;

73 (2) Receive related reports and testimony from individuals, 74 state and local agencies, community-based organizations, and 75 other public and private organizations; 76 (3) Create goals for state education policy that would prevent 77 sexual abuse of children; 78 (4) Create goals for other areas of state policy that would 79 prevent sexual abuse of children; and 80 (5) Submit a report with its recommendations to the 81 Governor and the Legislature. 82 (f) The recommendations may include proposals for specific 83 statutory changes and methods to foster cooperation among state 84 agencies and between the state and local governments. The task 85 force shall consult with employees of the Bureau for Children 86 and Family Services, the Division of Justice and Community 87 Services, the West Virginia State Police, the State Board of Education, and any other state agency or department as 88 89 necessary to accomplish its responsibilities under this section. 90 (g) Task force members serve without compensation and do

not receive expense reimbursement."
