A BILL to amend and reenact §18C-7-6 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to making home schooled students eligible for a PROMISE scholarship without taking the GED test.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §18C-7-6 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 7. WEST VIRGINIA PROVIDING REAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR MAXIMIZING IN-STATE STUDENT EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.

§18C-7-6. Promise scholarship program requirements; legislative rule.

- 1 (a) A PROMISE scholarship annual award shall meet the
- 2 following conditions:
- 3 (1) For a student enrolled in a state institution of higher
- 4 education, the annual award is equal to the lesser of the cost of
- 5 tuition or \$4,750, except that a student who was awarded and
- 6 used a PROMISE scholarship annual award prior to January 1,
- 7 2010, shall continue to receive the annual award calculated under
- 8 the same terms and conditions that applied on the day before the
- 9 effective date of this article;
- 10 (2) For a student enrolled in an eligible institution other than
- 11 a state institution of higher education, the annual award is equal
- 12 to, but may not exceed, the lesser of the cost of tuition or \$4,750,
- 13 except that a student who was awarded and used a PROMISE
- 14 scholarship annual award prior to January 1, 2010, shall continue
- 15 to receive the annual award calculated under the same terms and
- 16 conditions that applied on the day before the effective date of
- 17 this article;

- 18 (3) The annual award may exceed \$4,750, if the commission
- 19 determines that adequate funds are available, but in any case,
- 20 may not be greater than the actual cost of tuition;
- 21 (4) The annual award shall be used by an eligible institution
- 22 to supplement, but may not supplant, a tuition and fee waiver for
- 23 which the individual is eligible pursuant to section five, six-a,
- seven or seven-b, article ten, chapter eighteen-b of this code.
- 25 (b) The total cost of all scholarships awarded by the
- 26 commission in any year may not exceed the amount of funds
- 27 available to the commission during that fiscal year.
- (c) In order to be eligible to receive a PROMISE scholarship
- 29 award an individual shall:
- 30 (1) Submit a scholarship award application to the
- 31 commission:
- 32 (A) Within two years of graduating completing a secondary
- 33 education program in from a public, private or home high school
- 34 or within two years of acquiring a general equivalency degree if
- 35 provided instruction in the home or other approved place
- 36 pursuant in compliance with to subsection (c), section one,
- 37 article eight, chapter eighteen of this code; or

38 (B) Within seven years of initially entering military service, 39 and within one year of discharge from military service, if the 40 individual has entered the United States armed services within 41 two years after graduating from high school; 42 (2) Apply for and submit a Free Application for Federal 43 Student Aid: 44 (3) Maintain a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 45 grading scale in the required core and elective course work 46 necessary to prepare students for success in post-secondary 47 education at the associate and baccalaureate degree levels as 48 determined by the commission, if the individual has completed 49 not more than one semester or term at an institution of higher 50 education, excluding credits earned in advanced placement, 51 international baccalaureate, dual credit and comparable courses 52 while the student is enrolled in high school; 53 (4) Maintain appropriate academic progress toward the 54 completion of a degree at the undergraduate education level as 55 determined by the commission if the individual has completed 56 more than one semester or term at an institution of higher

education, excluding credits earned in advanced placement,

- 58 international baccalaureate, dual credit and comparable courses
- 59 while the student is enrolled in high school;
- 60 (5) Be a United States citizen or legal immigrant to the
- 61 United States;
- 62 (6) Meet additional objective standards the commission
- 63 considers necessary to promote academic excellence and to
- 64 maintain the financial stability of the fund; and
- 65 (7) Enroll in an eligible institution. A student enrolled at an
- 66 eligible institution who receives a PROMISE scholarship award
- 67 may retain and renew the scholarship to complete his or her
- 68 undergraduate education at that institution or any other eligible
- 69 institution under the following circumstances:
- 70 (A) The institution at which the student is enrolled loses its
- 71 status as an eligible institution pursuant to the provisions of
- 72 subdivision (1), subsection (b), section three of this article; and
- 73 (B) The student meets all other renewal requirements of this
- 74 code and of commission rules.
- 75 (d) It is the intent of the Legislature that the commission
- 76 shall strongly encourage, prospective candidates for the
- 77 PROMISE scholarship to perform at least twenty hours of

- 78 unpaid community service while in high school to help prepare
- 79 them for success in post-secondary education. The community
- 80 service may include, but is not limited to, participation with
- 81 nonprofit, governmental or community-based organizations
- 82 designed with any or all of the following purposes:
- 83 (1) Improving the quality of life for community residents;
- 84 (2) Meeting the needs of community residents; or
- 85 (3) Fostering civic responsibility.
- 86 (e) The commission shall promulgate a legislative rule in
- 87 accordance with the provisions of article three-a, chapter
- 88 twenty-nine-a of this code.
- 89 (1) The rule shall include at least the following provisions:
- 90 (A) The amount of a PROMISE scholarship award in
- 91 combination with aid from all other sources may not exceed the
- 92 cost of education at the institution the recipient is attending. This
- 93 provision does not apply to members of the West Virginia
- 94 National Guard, recipients of an Underwood-Smith teacher
- 95 scholarship and recipients of a West Virginia engineering,
- 96 science and technology scholarship;

97 (B) Additional objective standards the commission considers 98 necessary: 99 (i) To promote academic excellence; 100 (ii) To maintain the financial stability of the fund; and 101 (iii) To operate the program within the limits of available 102 funds. 103 (C) Provisions for making the highest and best use of the 104 PROMISE Scholarship Program in conjunction with the West 105 Virginia College Prepaid Tuition and Savings Program Act set 106 forth in article thirty, chapter eighteen of this code; 107 (D) A provision defining the relationship of PROMISE 108 scholarship awards to all other sources of student financial aid to 109 ensure maximum coordination. The provision shall include the 110 following: 111 (i) Methods to maximize student eligibility for federal 112 student financial aid: 113 (ii) A requirement that PROMISE scholarship awards not 114 supplant tuition and fee waivers; and 115 (iii) Clarification of the relationship between the PROMISE 116 Scholarship Program, tuition savings plans

state-funded student financial aid programs;

- (i) Providing for an annual PROMISE scholarship award thatis less than the amounts provided for in this section; or
- (ii) Eliminating any current recipient from eligibility; and
 (F) A method for applicants to appeal determinations of
- 127 eligibility and renewal.
- 128 (2) The rule may provide for or require the following at the commission's discretion:
- 130 (A) Requiring repayment of the amount of the scholarship, 131 in whole or in part, if a scholarship recipient chooses to work
- 132 outside the state after graduation. The rule may not require a
- 133 recipient to repay a scholarship, in whole or in part, unless the
- 134 prospective recipient has been informed of this requirement in
- writing before initial acceptance of the PROMISE scholarship
- 136 award;

- 137 (B) Targeting a portion of the scholarship funds to be used 138 for applicants enrolled in an engineering, science, technology or 139 other designated program;
- 140 (C) Determining what other sources of funding for higher 141 education are to be deducted from the PROMISE scholarship 142 award; and
- 143 (D) Providing additional criteria as determined by the 144 commission.
- 145 (3) The Legislature finds that an emergency exists and, 146 therefore, the commission shall file a rule to implement the 147 provisions of this section as an emergency rule pursuant to the 148 provisions of article three-a, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code. 149 The rule is subject to the prior approval of the Legislative 150 Oversight Commission on Education Accountability.
- 151 (4) Any rule promulgated by the commission pursuant to 152 previous enactments of this article in effect on the effective date 153 of the amendment and reenactment of this article in the year 154 2009 remains in effect until amended, modified, repealed or 155 replaced by the commission.
