A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §18-2-25b, relating to addressing sudden cardiac arrest in interscholastic athletes; requiring promulgation and minimum contents of rules by West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission; defining interscholastic athletes; providing guidelines and information about the nature and warning signs of sudden cardiac arrest and the risks; requiring signature and return of information by athlete and parent or guardian prior to practice or competition; requiring head

coach complete a commission-approved sudden cardiac arrest recognition and return-to-play protocol course annually; requiring head coach receive instruction on proper administration of cardiopulmonary resuscitation including use of hands-on practicing to support cognitive learning; and listing available sources for potential use in program development.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §18-2-25b, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 2. STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

§18-2-25b. Sudden Cardiac Arrest Protection Act (Leland's Law).

- 1 (a) This section may be cited as the Leland's Law.
- 2 (b) The West Virginia Secondary School Activities
- 3 Commission shall promulgate rules pursuant to section
- 4 twenty-five of this article that address in accordance with this
- 5 section sudden cardiac arrest in interscholastic athletes.
- 6 (c) For the purposes of this section, "interscholastic athlete"
- 7 means any athlete who is participating in interscholastic athletics
- 8 at a high school or middle school that is a member of the West
- 9 Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission.

10 (d) The rules required by this section shall include, but are 11 not limited to, the following: 12 (1) Guidelines and other pertinent information to inform and 13 educate appropriate school administrators, coaches, 14 interscholastic athletes and their parents or guardians about the 15 nature and warning signs of sudden cardiac arrest and the risks 16 associated with continuing to play or practice after experiencing 17 one or more symptoms of sudden cardiac arrest, including but not limited to, fainting, difficulty breathing, chest pains, 18 19 dizziness and abnormal racing heart rate; 20 (2) A sudden cardiac arrest symptoms and warning signs 21 information sheet that shall be signed and returned by the 22 interscholastic athlete and the athlete's parent or guardian on an 23 annual basis before the interscholastic athlete begins practice or 24 competition; 25 (3) A requirement that each head coach of an interscholastic 26 sport at a high school or middle school who is a member of the 27 West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission 28 complete a commission-approved sudden cardiac arrest

recognition and return-to-play protocol course annually; and

30 (4) A requirement that each head coach receive instruction 31 on the proper administration of cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) that includes hands-on practicing. The CPR instruction 32 33 must be based on an instructional program established by the 34 American Heart Association or the American Red Cross or 35 another program which is nationally recognized and uses the 36 most current national evidence-based Emergency 37 Cardiovascular Care guidelines and incorporates psychomotor 38 skills development into the instruction. 39 (e) In developing the guidelines and materials, the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission may use 40 41 existing materials developed by organizations such as the 42 American College of Cardiology, The American Heart 43 Association, Parent Heart Watch and Sudden Arrhythmia Death 44 Syndromes or other program which is nationally recognized and 45 uses the most current national evidence-based Emergency 46 Cardiovascular Care guidelines.
