1	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
2	designated §5-16-8a, relating to air-ambulance fees paid by the West Virginia Public
3	Employees Insurance Agency; and establishing maximum amount permitted to be
4	collected.
	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
1	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
2	section, designated §5-16-8a, to read as follows:
	ARTICLE 16. WEST VIRGINIA PUBLIC EMPLOYEES INSURANCE ACT.
	§5-16-8a. Air-ambulance fees.
1	(a) Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the contrary, any air-ambulance provider
2	which does not have a contract with the plan and which provides air-transportation or related
3	emergency or treatment services, or both, to an employee or dependent of an employee covered
4	by the plan, may not collect from the plan and the covered employee or dependent of the
5	employee, a combined amount for those services which exceeds the reimbursement amount then
6	in effect for the federal Medicare program, including any applicable Geographic Practice Cost
7	Index.
8	(b) If an air-ambulance provider has collected a subscription fee from an employee or
9	dependent of an employee covered by the plan, the air-ambulance provider shall accept that
10	subscription fee as payment in full for any air-ambulance transport and related emergency or
11	treatment services which the air-ambulance provider may provide to that employee or dependent
12	of the employee. For purposes of this section, a subscription fee is a fee collected by an air-
13	ambulance provider from a person in advance of any immediate need for air-ambulance services.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to set the maximum amount for air-ambulance services which may be collected pursuant to the plans of the West Virginia Public Employees Insurance Agency.
