## Senate Bill 594

- 1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
- designated §12-3-10g, relating to requiring the State Auditor to consider for payment a
- 3 claim submitted by an electronically generated invoice.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

- 1 That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
- 2 section, designated §12-3-10g, to read as follows:

#### ARTICLE 3. APPROPRIATIONS, EXPENDITURES AND DEDUCTIONS.

# §12-3-10g. Acceptance by Auditor for payment of a claim submitted by electronically generated invoices.

- 1 The State Auditor shall consider an electronic invoice for payment, that is computer
- 2 generated by an agency with an established financial system, as an original invoice that is
- 3 permissible for payment of a claim pursuant to section ten of this article and any applicable rules
- 4 approved thereto, if the invoice contains the vendor name, vendor address, invoice number,
- 5 invoice date, invoice amount, descriptions of items purchased or services provided, applicable
- 6 purchase order number (if any), applicable contract number (if any) and date of service (if any).

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require the State Auditor to consider for payment a claim submitted by an electronically generated invoice.
